

Management Objectives <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles. - Minimize the threat and impacts to private property, communities, natural and cultural resources, commercial timber assets, and critical infrastructure by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure. - Invest firefighting resources into actions that have a high probability of success; look for opportunities, especially when weather windows offer relief, to broaden suppression options to reduce potential fire size and/or effects. - Establish and maintain relationships with partner agencies, elected officials, organizations, tribes, neighboring landowners, and community groups and members through frequent, transparent, and open communication. - Provide timely and accurate information regarding fire activity and potential smoke impacts to communities, cooperators, and stakeholders through personal contacts, meetings, social media, and working closely with local media outlets.

Discussion: Precipitation chances increase considerably today. Cloud cover will remain fairly persistent throughout the day...with breaks in clouds only allowing for temporary heating and stronger storms to form. To account for the potential of strong storms over recent burn scars (favoring the eastern side of the complex), a Flash Flood Watch is in effect through this evening within and east of Branch 30 from Hamburg to near Yreka. On Saturday, both residual moisture at the surface and aloft will contribute to continuing chances for precipitation.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

****Flash Flood Watch for Day and Night Shift with Possibility for Thunderstorms****

DAY: 59-66 degrees RH: 63-85% 20ft WINDS: Terrain driven early then transitioning to NE 3-6 mph, gusts to 10 mph after the inversion breaks around 1030 hrs,

NIGHT: 53-55 degrees RH: 85% -95% 20ft WINDS: Down slope, down valley at 2-5mph, gusts to 8mph eye level with some southeast component at upper elevations after sunset.

High overnight RH recovery and smokey conditions will produce a limited burn period if at all around 1400hrs at upper elevations. Higher RH and incoming cloud cover will impact the fire for both operational periods.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

When available to burn dead fuel continues to be the main carrier of the fire. Temperatures continue to lower from prior shifts with moist conditions as rain continues in the forecast. If thunderstorms and lightning develop over the operational area the associated instability and outflow winds could cause an increase in fire activity. ERCs will be on the low end today and start to raise and remain well below the 90th percentile in the upcoming days. Most applicable fuel models will see rates of spread of less than 8 ch/hr for most of the operational period and start to react when RH dips below 65% for more than an hour. At peak temperature and low RH expect to have a Fine Dead Fuel Moisture of 9% and a PIG 30% unshaded. Shaded fuels would be 12% FDFM and a PIG 20%. Smoldering fires in drainages are set up for slope reversal but fire intensity is not expected to initiate crown fire or significantly challenge suppression efforts. Downhill fuels are again receptive to any rollout if they are in the sunlight. Free burning uphill runs are possible from firing operations where rollout occurs.

SPECIFIC:

Branch XXX: Fire spread is anticipated to be reduced after the influence of yesterday's moisture and favorable winds. Larger fuels that are sheltered are going to still retain heat and present a possibility for rollout. Suppression repair resources may be hampered by wet roads and snags falling from weather associated with thunderstorms should they develop.

Branch V: Fire spread is expected to those areas that were subject to recent firing operations. The fire is going to struggle to work down into Coon Creek because of cloud cover and elevated fuel moistures. The forecasted levels of precipitation along with cloud cover will greatly reduce the availability of a burn window this operational period should one present itself if 10hr FM becomes less than 10%

Branch X: Fire spread is going to be challenged to back down into Titus Creek, Buzzard Creek along with the Klamath River when under the influence of perception and cloud cover limiting sunlight. Interior islands will continue to smolder and present rollout hazards on steep slopes. There is a possibility of a very limited burn window in those areas that are sheltered from weather elements and RH above 50%

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 06:39 Sunset 1949

Air operations may be limited due to increasing cloud cover and gusty winds associated with thunderstorms.

SAFETY

With the potential for thunderstorms in the forecast DO NOT resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed. IRPG 01/22 page 17

OPERATIONAL TEMPO

- Maintaining operational tempo is not solely about speeding up to match or exceed the pace of the environment. It is also about knowing when operations should slow down and why. Incoming weather may impact operational tempo.
- We are most vulnerable to accidents and errors when operational tempo changes, especially when it changes quickly.
- Lack of direction may lead to independent actions. “Watch this... or Hold my drink....” should raise concerns.
- Maintaining good situation awareness despite change in operational tempo represents a considerable challenge. Be prepared with an alternate plan during the operational period.
- The key to managing operational tempo successfully is monitoring the changing environment and capabilities of the team, and then applying good judgment to determine whether to push forward or pull back while making necessary adjustments.

COMMUNITY EVENT

- Community based event held in the park directly south of Fire Camp in Happy Camp.
- Schedule 9/1/23 (1800-2400), 9/2/23 (1200-2400), 9/3/23 (1200-2200).
- Event will increase pedestrian and vehicular traffic coming in and out of camp.
- Please be patient and vigilant as there will be traffic from vendors, families, seniors, and children coming and going utilizing the road into fire camp.

Rapid Extraction Module Support (REMS)

- Its purpose is to provide the incident with a safety measure to extract personnel on the fireline with illnesses or injuries unable to walk out on their own.
- 4-member team trained in advanced technical rope rescue for over-the-side rescues.
- Equipped with wheeled stokes to transport personnel to a ground or air transport.
- Some teams are equipped with Advance Life Support (ALS) equipment. Inquire with Division.
- Its origins come from having a form of rescue entity in the event air resources would not be able to access or fly because of weather, smoke, inversion layer, or the risk was too high.


Weather

- Precipitation will erode soil and increase rolling debris and rocks in the burn areas and roll onto to the road systems.
- Watch for run-offs and mudslides.
- Do not park where potential rocks, trees, and logs can damage vehicles.
- Situation awareness of surroundings if posted up or staging. “Should I be here?”
- Do not attempt to drive through flooded areas.
- Wear hard hats whenever outside of the vehicle.

Adequate firing and holding resources are in place for coordinated efforts. Request spot weather forecast and compare to weather forecast. Define anchor, termination, and identify areas to perform firing ops. All PPE properly worn with sleeves rolled down.
ALL	FIRE BEHAVIOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conduct thorough assessments before starting work. Ensure LCES is in place. Increase Situational Awareness (SA). Brief on drought related areas of high concentration of hazard trees. Provide added briefing for new resources and maintain communications.
ALL	TRAFFIC HAZARDS AND DRIVING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practice "Defensive Driving" techniques and always use headlights. Use spotters when backing. Use chock blocks, turn wheels into hill. Use warning lights when working on roads or traveling in smoke. Observe posted speed limits and/or a safe speed based on conditions. Many roads are narrow and mid slope, use caution. Personnel working on roadways are not easily seen in smoke and darkness.
ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Share your Situational Awareness (hazards, changes, etc.) to those who also have a need. Be responsible with information. Communications may be poor; use human repeaters as needed. Ensure all personnel are familiar with the incident communications plan. Make sure all resources have radios cloned appropriately. Ensure that non-agency resources understand radio use and procedures.
ALL	LINE CONSTRUCTION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow the safety protocols for direct and indirect line construction. (IRPG p.7) Watch footing and spacing, between and below firefighters. Make sure LCES is in place.
ALL	WILDLAND URBAN INTERFACE OPERATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maintain continuous Situational Awareness based upon the fire environment, observed fire behavior, hazards and incident objectives. Refer to IRPG Page 11-15 for WUI preparation, preplanning, and hazards. Be active and engage in defense preparations. Do not wait for fire to arrive. Beware of unknown chemicals when working near structures or gardens. Beware of downed powerlines or leaking gas lines. Be decisive in tactical engagement. Know when to engage or not. Establish Decision points, Safety Zones, TRA's, and Escape Routes.
ALL	ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep alert for wildlife, deer, rattlesnakes, bees, and plants. Watch footing and hand placement around rocks. Personal hygiene is #1 when it comes to Poison Oak Prevention.
ALL	FATIGUE / SMOKE IMPACT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be alert for signs of fatigue and take action as necessary steps. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Monitor ALL resources for level of fatigue. Repeated assignments in the same area can lead to complacency. Be mindful of working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible.
ALL	WEATHER / LIGHTNING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be aware of changing weather and fire behavior conditions. Watch out for increasing winds and instability. Communicate any observed changes in weather and fire behavior. "Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire." Mudflows. Avoid low areas/dry streams, etc. during periods of rain.
ALL	AIR OPERATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow "Aviation Watch-Out Situations". (IRPG p.62) Do not plan on air resources for tactical support or medical transportation.
