2 BIG MOUNTAIN HELL ROARING BASIN	No bicycles on or off roads or trails.
3 BIG MOUNTAIN NORTH SLOPE	No bicycles off roads. Bicycles allowed on Rd. 316.



THIS MAP SHOWS FLATHEAD NATIONAL FOREST TRAVEL MANAGEMENT DECISIONS AS OF AUGUST, 2010.

**DEFINITIONS**

**MOTORIZED:**  
**Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only:** These roads are open only to motor vehicles licensed under State law for general operation on all public roads, including national forest roads.  
**Highway Vehicles:** Licensed for public roads, over 50" in width, includes street legal vehicles, motorcycles, and OHVs/ATVs.  
**Trails Open to Motorcycles Only:** These trails are open only to wheeled, motorcycles, 2 wheeled, single track. Sidecars are not permitted.  
**Trails Open to Wheeled Vehicles 50" or Less in Width:** These trails are open only to wheeled, motor vehicles less than 50 inches in width at the widest point on the vehicle.  
**Trail Vehicles:** Typically not licensed or legal to operate on public roads, under 50" in width, includes:  
OHV/ATVs- 3 or 4 wheeled, double track  
Motorcycles- 2 wheeled, single track; no sidecars  
**NONMOTORIZED:**  
**Mechanized Vehicles:** Any wheeled non-motorized device, includes bicycles, carts, wagons, wheelbarrows, etc.

**THIS MAP SHOWS ROADS AND TRAILS THAT COULD BE REASONABLY DRIVEN WITH A HIGHWAY OR TRAIL VEHICLE.**  
It displays the effective results of past road management actions. Due to continuing road management decisions and actions, some changes in "OPEN" status of roads can be expected.  
For complete travel information, including snowmobile and OHV, contact the Tally Lake Ranger District Office.  
Due to ongoing road obliteration projects, some roads and trail vehicles due to numerous waterbars and culvert removals.



**Important Travel Notice**

Motorized, wheeled cross-country travel is prohibited. Stay on designated open roads and trails.  
Cross-country travel by motorized, wheeled vehicles is prohibited yearlong on all lands administered by the Forest Service. Please stay on roads and trails.  
Current local road, trail, and area restrictions still apply.  
The purpose of these restrictions is to protect riparian areas, wetlands, crucial wildlife habitat, threatened or endangered species, soils and vegetation, aquatic resources and/or to reduce user conflicts.  
Unless currently restricted, cross-country travel to a permitted by the most direct route causing the least nonmotorized means.  
Site selection must be completed by all motorized vehicle users should obtain the latest editions of Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) available for each ranger district of the Flathead National Forest and use in conjunction with this visitor use map.  
The MVUM identifies and displays roads, trails, and areas designated as OPEN to public motor vehicle use. It is reissued annually as a free map available at all ranger district offices.  
Motorized users must comply with the motorized use designations on the MVUM. Only those roads, trails, and areas designated as open on the MVUM are legally authorized for travel.
