FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Thresholds of 90 for FFMC and 10 for ISI have been mentioned in the past as indicators for increased fire activity, surface spread, torching trees, and spotting potential on the fire. Think of these in terms of fireline weather observations.

- With temperatures above 75 and RH below 35, FFMC can reach 90 or 91.
- With that, eye level winds of 6 mph can bring ISI's up to 10.

FWI for Wed (Stuart Ck-Manchu): FFMC 86-88, DMC 20-35, DC 307 (avg), ISI 5-7, BUI 34-54, FWI 14-18

Majority of the fuels within and around the fire

Spruce/Hardwood mix worst case scenario:

FL Head: Up to 3-4 ft

ROS Head: 8-10 ch/hr

Continuous Black Spruce worst case scenario:

FL Head: 7-8 ft

ROS Head: 15-20 ch/hr

Spotting distance: 1/4 mile

Probability of ignition: 40% for mostly shaded fuels

SPECIFIC:

Divisions S and A: Smoldering and creeping with occasional group torching possible. With ISI's up to 7, the possibility of small organized flame fronts and small uphill runs in continuous spruce stands in unsecured areas remains. A remote possibility of an undetected spot fire from earlier in the week remains.

Division R: Second day with some sun brought out a few more interior smokes. SW winds may channel up the Chena a little stronger, especially in the area of the R/S Break.

Divisions F, K, L, M, N, and P: Scattered smoldering will continue. Exposed to forecast winds, expect occasional torching to increase in interior spruce patches. Divisions M and N still have the highest potential for any previously undetected heat within the mop-up area to show itself whenever direct sunlight warms fuels.

Divisions B and C: Uncontained since early days of the fire, a few smokes remain – some near unburned fuels. Shading and higher RH should keep new activity to a minimum.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Ceilings should remain high enough. Any shower activity later in the day shouldn't impact operations.

SAFETY

"Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire." Help us validate the weather and fire behavior forecasts in the IAP each day. Report your weather observations, include the fire activity you see with it, and provide a good location. It does make a difference.



1. Line supervisor (i.e. FFT1,CRWB,STLD,TFLD) notifies DIVS on **Command frequency** and states nature of illness/injury. Is it life threatening?

LIFE THREATENING = MEDIVAC NON-LIFE THREATENING = MEDICAL TRANSPORT

- 2. If life threatening request that the designated radio frequency be cleared for emergency traffic.
- 3. Identify the on-scene point of contact (POC) by resource type and last name (i.e. POC is TFLD Smith).
- 4. Identify the nature of the incident, number injured, patient assessments and location (geographic and GPS coordinates).
- 5. Identify on-scene medical personnel by position and name (i.e. EMT Basic Smith)
- 6. Identify preferred method of patient transport.
- 7. Request any additional resources and/or equipment needed.
- 8. Document all information received and transmitted on the radio and phone.
- 9. Identify any changes in the on-scene POC or medical personnel as they occur.
