Rainy, cold, and windy conditions in the morning will slowly subside through the afternoon and early evening. Monday will begin a warming and trend that will persist into at least much of Wednesday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fuels within the fire area are very damp as a result of periods of rain over the past couple days.

Today, with continued rainy, cool, and cloudy weather, fire behavior will again be minimal. The extent of fire behavior today will be smoldering and very isolated areas of creeping.

SPECIFIC:

All Divisions:

Fire behavior will be very minimal throughout the fire today; it will be confined to smoldering and isolated areas of creeping that are becoming more scattered as surface fuels become damper.

Heat still remains deeper in the duff in many areas where smoke is currently not visible due to wet surface fuel. Some of these will likely resurface when the fuels dry.

Watch your footing and watch for fire weakened trees and snags.

Hayes Creek Fire: No activity or spread anticipated.

Initial Attack: No new starts are expected with today's fuel and weather conditions.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Clouds and rain could limit visibility at times.

SAFETY:

Today the hazards you encounter will not be related to fire behavior. Weather, slippery footing, snags, muddy roads, and highway traffic are among the hazards you will encounter. Through **situational awareness** you can identify and mitigate hazards.
