DISCUSSION...

Widespread wetting rains will continue before decreasing in coverage Monday night. Low temperatures will range from the mid to upper 40s, and high temperatures (in the lower 50s) will warm into the lower 60s by midweek.

Tuesday will see warmer and drier weather than Monday, with high temperatures in the mid-50s. Rain and showers will still remain possible throughout the day, especially early. Valley winds will remain light from the south to southwest, with higher winds of 7 to 9 mph at higher elevations.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Lost Horse Creek Fire August 21st, 2023

Transition

Risks to Fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. **Be proactive in seeking out potential hazards that are unique to the new assignment, tasking, or piece of ground.**

● Factors for increased risks to Fireline personnel during transfer of command periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel
- Lack of fire weather and fire behavior information, both forecast and observed
- Communications: face-to-face briefings may not be possible
- All resources may not have checked-in, and the Incident Management Team may not be aware of the number, type, and location of all resources.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.

● Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Ensure an adequate briefing from incoming supervisors
- Receive an update on fire weather and fire behavior conditions and forecasts
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.

Use the Risk Management Process in the Incident Response Pocket Guide to analyze any new projects and review the Process intermittently when conducting operations.

- Drive Defensively at all times – don't assume the other driver will make the right decision.
- Know what the weather is doing and be prepared for changing conditions.

Guidelines for submitting Extension Requests to DEMOB

1. Extension Requests are to be initiated by the Incident Supervisor, not the Resource.

2. Remember that with VIPR contracted equipment the operator is authorized to sign on behalf of the owner, and so should sign both Lines 2 and 4.

3. Always make sure the resource signs on line 2.

4. Demob can and will secure the IC signature on Line 1 after other signatures have been secured.

5. Illegible forms, particularly the home unit email address, will be returned.

6. The Home Unit needs to have been forewarned by the Resource. Don't expect quick turn arounds from any Home Unit, particularly on weekends.

7. Requests without Home Unit signatures but with a legible email address will be forwarded to the Home Unit by Demob provided demob receives it at least 48 hours before the resources last shift. Others will be returned.

8. Time frame:

➤ For resources driving: If the request is not completed by 24 hours prior to departure time the resource will be demobed.

➤ For resources flying: If the request is not completed by 72 hours prior to departure time the resource will be demobed.

9. There are only two options: Work 21 days and go home, or take 2 days off and work 14 more for a total of 30 days and go home.

10. Extension Requests for Operational resources will be reviewed by Planning Ops before being implemented.

11. The Extension form is accessed via the QR code on the IAP cover. The January 2021 version is the official version that will be accepted.

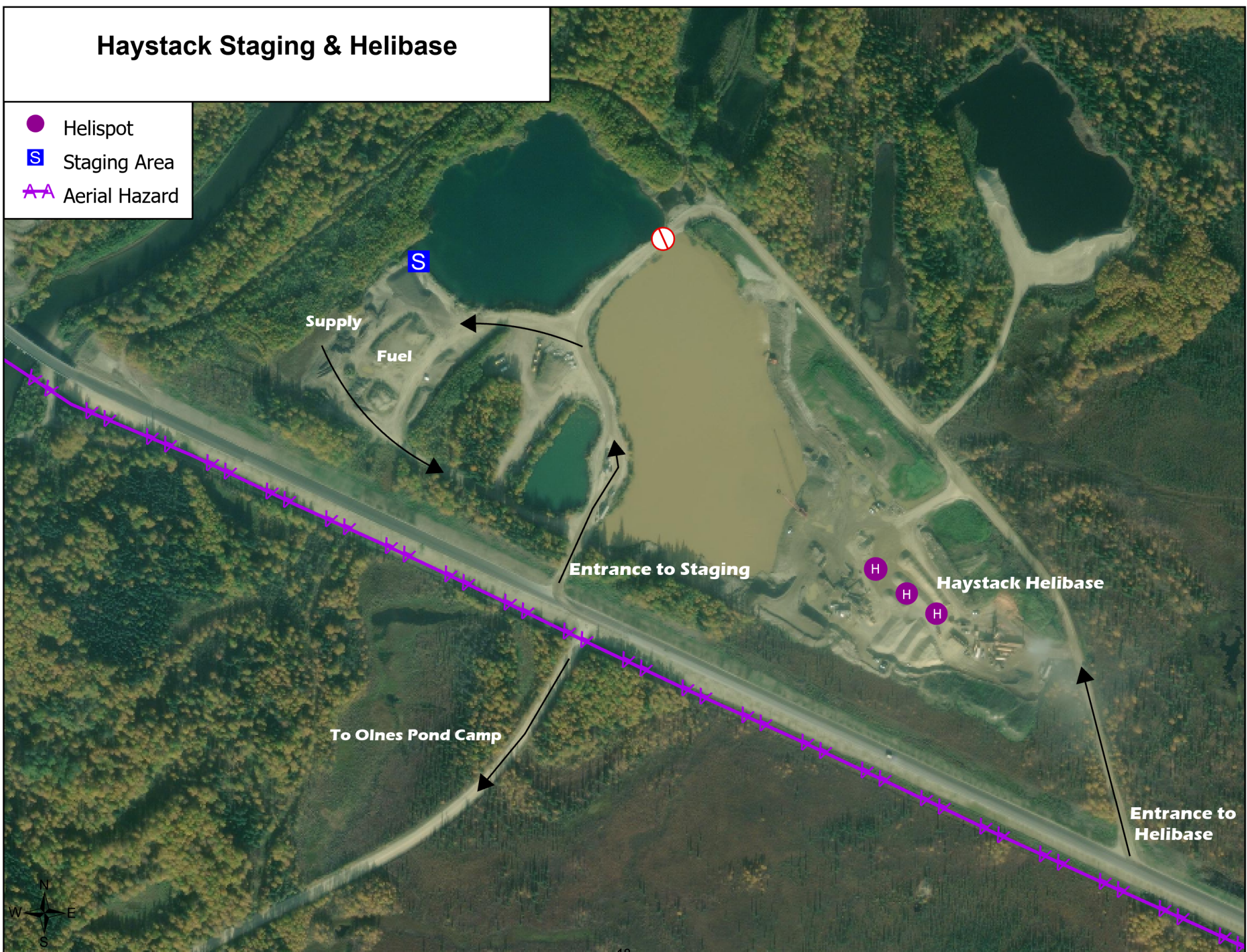



Special Medical Emergency Procedures:

Green- Contact local/incident Medics for assistance. Medics will follow up with ICP MEDL by the end of shift.

Yellow/Red- Immediately contact local/incident medics for assistance and contact Lost Horse Creek Communications on Command using the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP. Additional resources such as High Angle Rescue, if needed, will be facilitated by MEDL. A contingency plan for extraction should be in place in the event that above resources are unavailable.

ICP/ In town travel- Dial 911 to request medical assistance and notify MEDL as soon as possible for assistance.

Burn patients- Will be flown to Fairbanks Memorial for stabilization and/or flown to appropriate medical facility based on assessment.
