OBJECTIVES:

1. Ensure firefighter and public safety through risk-informed tactical decisions and continuous situational awareness.
2. Protect human life and safety, the community of Huslia, and associated infrastructure including the Hogatza Mine, numerous Native allotments, subsistence values, and natural/cultural resources.
3. Contain fires at the smallest acreage reasonably possible in order to limit short and long-term threats to values.
4. Maintain and enhance relationships with residents, cooperators, and the public and ensure timely, accurate, consistent communication with cooperators, stakeholders, and the public.
5. Minimize fire impact on the Koyukuk River which is the major travel corridor and vital to local residents and their economy.
6. Minimize smoke impacts to local residents and Tribal activities involving treaty rights.
7. Backhaul unnecessary supplies and tactical gear/equipment as conditions and fire activity warrant.

Spot Forecast for 279 Moldy...Bureau of Land Management National Weather Service Fairbanks AK 517 PM AKDT Sat Jul 19 2025 Forecast is based on forecast start time of 1800 AKDT on July 19.

DISCUSSION... Saturdaysaw the first and lighter of two waves of showers. These scattered showers will persist through the evening and overnight before the second, stronger, wave reaches the area around noon Sunday. This next wave will be more widespread with a significantly higher chances of wetting rain Sunday afternoon through Tuesday. Winds will be primarily out of the south with the second wave of showers with speeds up to 15 mph expected along ridgetops. Winds will shift southwesterly and strengthen slightly Monday with speeds of 20 mph possible along ridgetops. Half an inch to an inch of total rain is possible by Tuesday. Temperatures will cool with these showers down into the 60s and minimum RHs will rise well above 50. Wednesday the pattern becomes more chaotic and uncertain with showers becoming less frequent and lighter.

SUNDAY... Sky/weather.....Cloudy (85-95 percent). Scattered rain showers in the morning, then widespread rain showers in the afternoon. CWR.....15 percent. Tstm Coverage.....None.

Max temperature.....Around 67. Min humidity.....68 percent.

Wind (20 ft).....South winds 5 to 7 mph. Ridgetop wind.....South winds 10 to 15 mph. Mixing height.....2400 ft AGL. Transport winds.....South around 10 mph. Inversion burnoff...11 am with increasing showers.

SUNDAY NIGHT... Sky/weather.....Cloudy (85-95 percent). Widespread rain showers in the evening, then numerous rain showers overnight. CWR.....76 percent. Tstm Coverage.....None.

Min temperature.....Around 53. Max humidity.....97 percent.

Wind (20 ft).....South winds 7 to 9 mph. Ridgetop wind.....Southwest winds 10 to 15 mph. Mixing height.....800 ft AGL. Transport winds.....Southwest around 12 mph. Inversion setup.....Heavy showers prevent inversion development. .

MONDAY... Sky/weather.....Mostly cloudy (80-90 percent). Numerous rain showers. CWR.....41 percent. Tstm Coverage.....None.

Max temperature.....Around 62. Min humidity.....64 percent.

Wind (20 ft).....Southwest winds 8 to 12 mph. Ridgetop wind.....Southwest winds around 20 mph. Mixing height.....800 ft AGL increasing to 3600 ft AGL in the late morning and afternoon. Transport winds.....Southwest around 15 mph. Inversion burnoff...Heavy showers prevented inversion development.
