OBJECTIVES:

1. Ensure firefighter and public safety through risk-informed tactical decisions and continuous situational awareness.
2. Protect human life and safety, the community of Huslia and associated infrastructure including the Hogatza Mine, numerous Native allotments, subsistence values, and natural/cultural resources.
3. Contain fires at the smallest acreage reasonably possible in order to limit short and long-term threats to values.
4. Maintain and enhance relationships with residents, cooperators, and the public and ensure timely, accurate, consistent communication with cooperators, stakeholders, and the public.
5. Minimize fire impact on the Koyukuk River which is the major travel corridor and vital to local residents and their economy.
6. Minimize smoke impacts to local residents and Tribal activities involving treaty rights.
7. Backhaul unnecessary supplies and tactical gear/equipment as conditions and fire activity warrant.

Spot Forecast for 279 Moldy...Bureau of Land Management National Weather Service Fairbanks AK 420 PM AKDT Sun Jul 20 2025 Forecast is based on forecast start time of 1800 AKDT on July 20.

DISCUSSION... Cool and wet weather is expected to persist over the next several days with low pressure built up over the West Coast. Wetting rain is likely this evening with the main frontal passage, potentially dropping 0.15" to 0.3" of rain overnight. Showers will begin to lighten up Monday morning and become more isolated by the afternoon. Another round of decent showers will occur late Monday night, however not as much rain is expected with totals ranging between 0.05" and 0.15". Winds will predominately be out of the southwest around 10 mph, with an occasional gust up to 20 mph. Ridgetop winds will be much breezier with sustained speeds between 20 and 25 mph. No strong inversions are expected to form during the overnight hours with the persistent clouds, rain showers, and gusty winds throughout the period. This will also aid in keeping minimum RH values above 65 percent and max temperatures around 60 during the day.

MONDAY... Sky/weather.....Cloudy (85-95 percent). Numerous rain showers becoming scattered in the afternoon. CWR.....30 percent. Tstm Coverage.....None.

Max temperature.....Around 63. Min humidity.....67 percent.

Wind (20 ft).....Southwest winds 7 to 10 mph. Ridgetop wind.....Southwest winds 20 to 25 mph. Mixing height.....2300 ft AGL increasing to 3300 ft AGL late in the afternoon. Transport winds.....Southwest around 18 mph. Inversion burnoff...No Inversion .

MONDAY NIGHT... Sky/weather.....Mostly cloudy (80-90 percent). Scattered rain showers in the evening, then numerous rain showers overnight. CWR.....19 percent. Tstm Coverage.....None.

Safety Officer Pease-Madore and/or ICP personnel will notify Galena dispatch of the IWI, and coordinate air/boat resources for evacuation to Huslia or Galena airfield. Galena dispatch will coordinate additional transport to definitive care.
