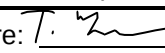
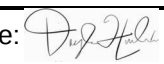
Safety: Boats are a key element of operations. Flotation devices, spacing, speed, loading procedures, and other aspects of boat safety will be addressed at morning briefing.

Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."					
Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority	☐ RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.				
	☐ YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be DELAYED if necessary Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2° – 3° burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.				
	☐ GREEN / PRIORITY 3 Minor Injury or illness. Non-Emergency transport Ex: Sprains, strains, minor heat-related illness.
