Medical: All yellow and red IWIs will be called into ICP using the Medical Incident Report (MIR/8-Line) via radio on the Command channel. Transport off-incident will be coordinated by ICP and Upper Yukon Dispatch. Fixed wing air transport will use the Central airstrip. Ground transport of yellows and reds will rendezvous with the Steese VFD ALS Ambulance at mile marker 88. Non-emergency greens must be reported to the incident using the chain of command. Greens will be assessed and transported as needed.

Safety:

- Keep in mind even though the Steese is a highway, it is a gravel road. Please drive
 defensibly at the speed limit or a speed appropriate for conditions.
- Rivers and streams can be incredibly fast moving and dangerous. Ensure you're
 wearing a PFD and listen to captain's directions when working on and around
 watercraft.
- Being wet can destroy your feet and crush morale. Ensure your camp has a place where gear can dry out and people can warm-up.
