Medical: All yellow and red IWIs will be called into ICP using the Medical Incident Report (MIR/8-Line) via radio on the Command channel. Transport off-incident will be coordinated by ICP and Upper Yukon Dispatch. Fixed wing air transport will use the Central airstrip. Ground transport of yellows and reds will rendezvous with the Steese VFD ALS Ambulance at mile marker 88. Non-emergency greens must be reported to the incident using the chain of command. Greens will be assessed and transported as needed.

Safety:

- New Command repeaters have been installed but are not working perfectly. It is
 important to do a radio check on Command 8 or Command 2 at the beginning of shift.
- Fire-weaken root systems, combined with wet soil, create dangerous conditions. Be heads up for trees tipping over, especially during breezy conditions.
- Safety took a tour of crew camps yesterday and they looked great. Continue the good work keeping camps clean and safe!
