Transport off-incident will be coordinated by ICP and Upper Yukon Dispatch. Fixed wing air transport will use the Central airstrip. Ground transport of yellows and reds will rendezvous with the Steese VFD ALS Ambulance at mile marker 88. Non-emergency greens must be reported to the incident using the chain of command. Greens will be assessed and transported as needed.

Safety: Fatigue builds fast on the fireline. Rest when you can, speak up if you're running on empty, and look out for your crew. A tired firefighter is a risky firefighter.

Logistics, Finance, and Plans Notes: Call in orders to logistics by 1300 for any chance of next-day delivery. Please get comp claims started sooner rather than later. Please connect with finance to process claims. If you need a flight, let plans know within 72 hours of your planned travel day.
