.DISCUSSION...

Resent to include extended outlook.

Friday July 4th observations near the complex of fires reported max temperatures in the upper 80s to low 90s, with minimum RH values near 20 percent. Winds increased out of the northeast in the evening, peak gusts reaching 15 mph. Early this Saturday morning we are seeing excellent RH recovery in the valleys, with sites reporting values in the 90 to 100 percent range. With that said, the Buckley Bar Fire is likely seeing more active fire behavior in the upper terrain due to the thermal belt above the inversion.

Moving through Saturday we will see temperatures climb back up into the upper 80s, low 90s, with RH diminishing to 20 percent. Expect east-northeast winds to continue, with gusts largely remaining below 20 mph. Sunday, light winds become more south-southwesterly in the late afternoon, as a ridge breaks down across the state. This feature will bring back cooler temps, higher RH, increased chances for wetting rain from thunderstorms, and gusty/erratic wind from outflow.

Discussion for DAYS 4-7...An arctic trough swings south over the North slope late on Tuesday bringing much colder temperatures and even the possibility of mixed rain and snow across the Brooks Range. A short period of southerly flow brings showers to the Interior Tuesday through Thursday along with continued cool temperatures and higher RH. Precipitation amounts are trending upward with this system, but still look to be spotty with consecutive days of wetting rain unlikely for any given location.
