WEATHER DISCUSSION: Slow moving low pressure will continue to bring periods of rain & isolated thunderstorms through Thursday. High levels of moisture, especially in the overnight to morning hours, will result in fog at times, especially at higher elevations early this week, and then in valley bottoms around sunrise as skies begin to clear more later this week. Cold morning lows are likely, especially at ICP Thu & Fri mornings. A warming & drying trend is expected Thu-Sat as high pressure moves across the area.

Tuesday (0700-1900 PDT):

- **WEATHER:** Cloudy w/areas of fog & rain in the morning. Mostly cloudy with scattered showers & a slight chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon.
- WIND (20 FT): SE 5 mph becoming SE 5-10 mph afternoon. (24hr Trend: Down 5-12mph)
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 55-61°F Root Fire, 70°F at ICP. (24hr Max Trend: Down 7°F)
- MIN RH: 50-70%. (24hr Trend: Up 10-20%)
- CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> or = to 0.10"): 95%. Additional rainfall 0.20-0.50".
- CHC of LIGHTNING: 20%.
- MIXING HEIGHT: Inversion breaking late morning. Increasing to 3000ft AGL mid-afternoon.
- TRANSPORT WIND: SE 5-10 mph.

Tuesday Night (1900-0700 PDT):

- WEATHER: Cloudy w/periods of light rain, drizzle & patchy fog.
- WIND (20 FT): Variable 5mph, generally from the NW.
- MIN TEMPERATURES: 45-55°F, except around 40°F at ICP.
- MAX RH: 90-100%.
- CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> or = to 0.10"): 25%, additional rainfall <0.10".
- CHC of LIGHTNING: 20%
- MIXING HEIGHT: 1500ft or less.






