WEATHER DISCUSSION: Low pressure offshore & high pressure centered over the Interior West will continue a general southerly flow over the Root Fire Friday. While drainage flows will generally dominate in the overnight to morning hours, southerly winds will occur each afternoon-evening and are likely to be a bit stronger each day Friday through Sunday. The upper level trough offshore will bring a possibility of rainfall early next week, most likely Monday-Tuesday that is likely to be wetting for the fire area.

Friday (0600-1800 PDT):

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny becoming partly cloudy during the afternoon.
- **WIND (20 FT):**
 - **Upper Slopes/Ridges:** Light & variable early, becoming southerly 5-10mph late morning, the becoming S 10-15 mph with gusts 15-25 mph in the afternoon. *(24hr Trend: Up 5 mph)*
 - **Lower Slopes/Valleys:** Downslope/valley, generally northerly 5-10 mph until late morning, then S 7-15 mph with gusts 15-25 mph in the afternoon. *(24hr Trend: Little change to up 5 mph)*
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 70-80F. *(24hr Max Trend: Down 5°F)*
- **MIN RH:** 20-30%. *(24hr Trend: Down 5%)*
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> or = to 0.10"):** 0%
- **LAL:** 1
- **MIXING HEIGHT:** Inversion breaking late morning. Increasing to 4000ft AGL mid-afternoon.
- **MIXING WIND:** Light early, then 15-25 mph afternoon.

Friday Night (1800-0600 PDT):

- **WEATHER:** Partly cloudy becoming mostly clear.
- **WIND (20 FT):**
 - **Upper Slopes/Ridges:** 6-12 mph w/gusts 10-20 mph early evening, then decreasing to S 0-10mph overnight.
 - **Lower Slopes/Valleys:** Upslope/valley 5-10 mph with gusts 10-15 early evening, then downslope/down valley 5 mph overnight.
- **MIN TEMPERATURES:** 50-60°F.
- **MAX RH:** 55-75%.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> or = to 0.10"):** 0%
- **LAL:** 1
- **MIXING HEIGHT:** 500ft or less.

Day 2-5 Outlook, Saturday-Tuesday:

S-SW winds will become breezy to windy on the upper ridges & peaks each afternoon-evening thru Monday. Partly cloudy conditions are likely w/intervals of cloudier periods over the weekend, increasing Sun & Mon afternoon-evening with a slight chance of showers. Mostly cloudy conditions with rain showers likely Tue. Temperatures will trend lower during the day w/less diurnal variation & RHs will generally trend up.

Cumulative Fatigue in Firefighters

What is Cumulative Fatigue

- ✓ Fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery.
- ✓ Caused by extended periods of 'stress' with inadequate recovery periods.
- ✓ Wildland firefighters are exposed to many stresses, both positive and negative, psychological and physical (exertion and extreme environmental temperatures, environmental toxins, injuries, smoke inhalation, lack of sleep, and many others).
- ✓ Fatigued firefighters may perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive, resulting in increased chances of accidents and injuries to themselves and others.

What to do when you're on a fire

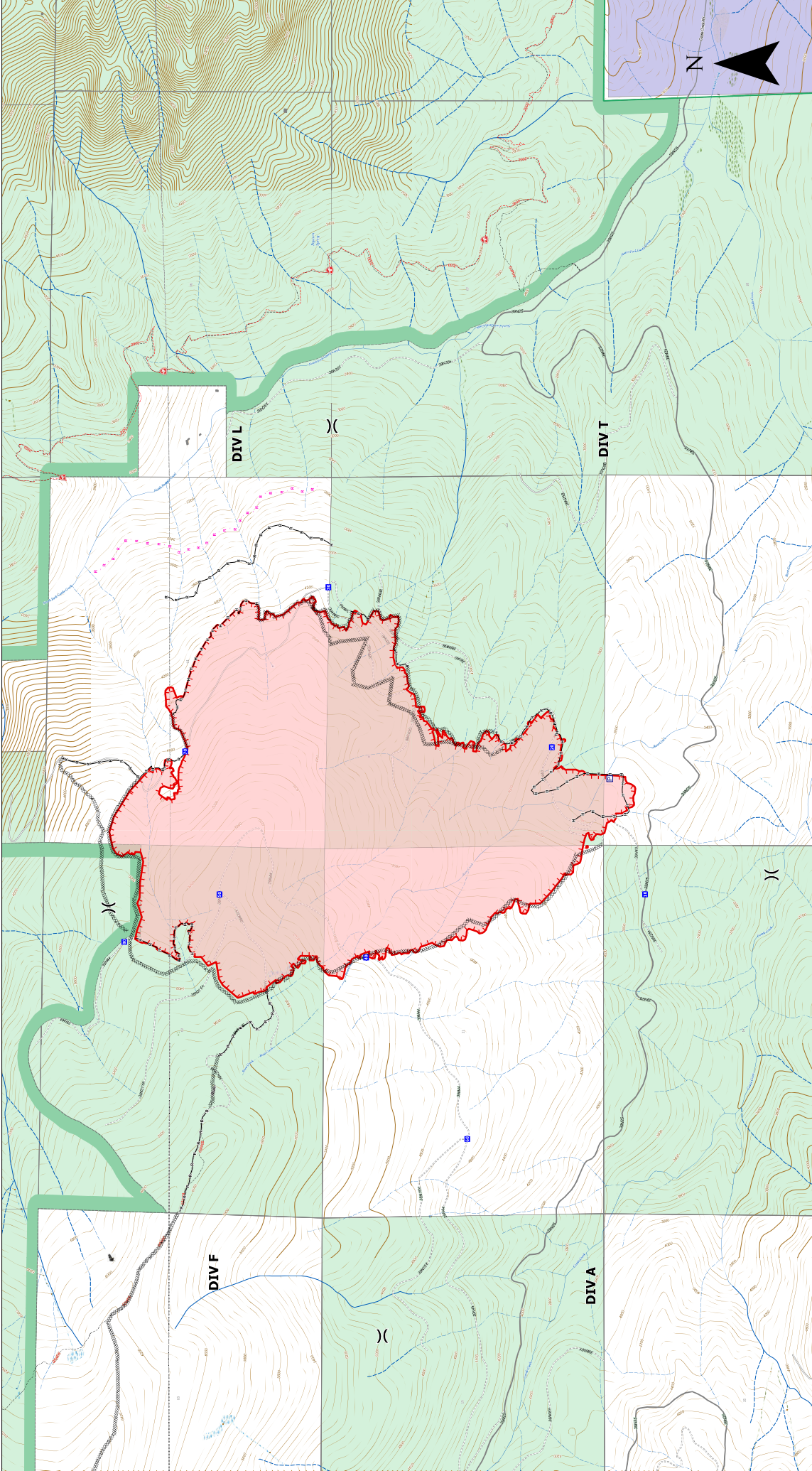
- ✓ Watch for signs of cumulative fatigue in yourself, & in your crewmembers & team members.
- ✓ Take turns with work & rest, if possible.
- ✓ Let your peers or supervisor know if you need a break.
- ✓ Make sure that you are rested before driving home....& take breaks along your travel if you are feeling tired in any way!

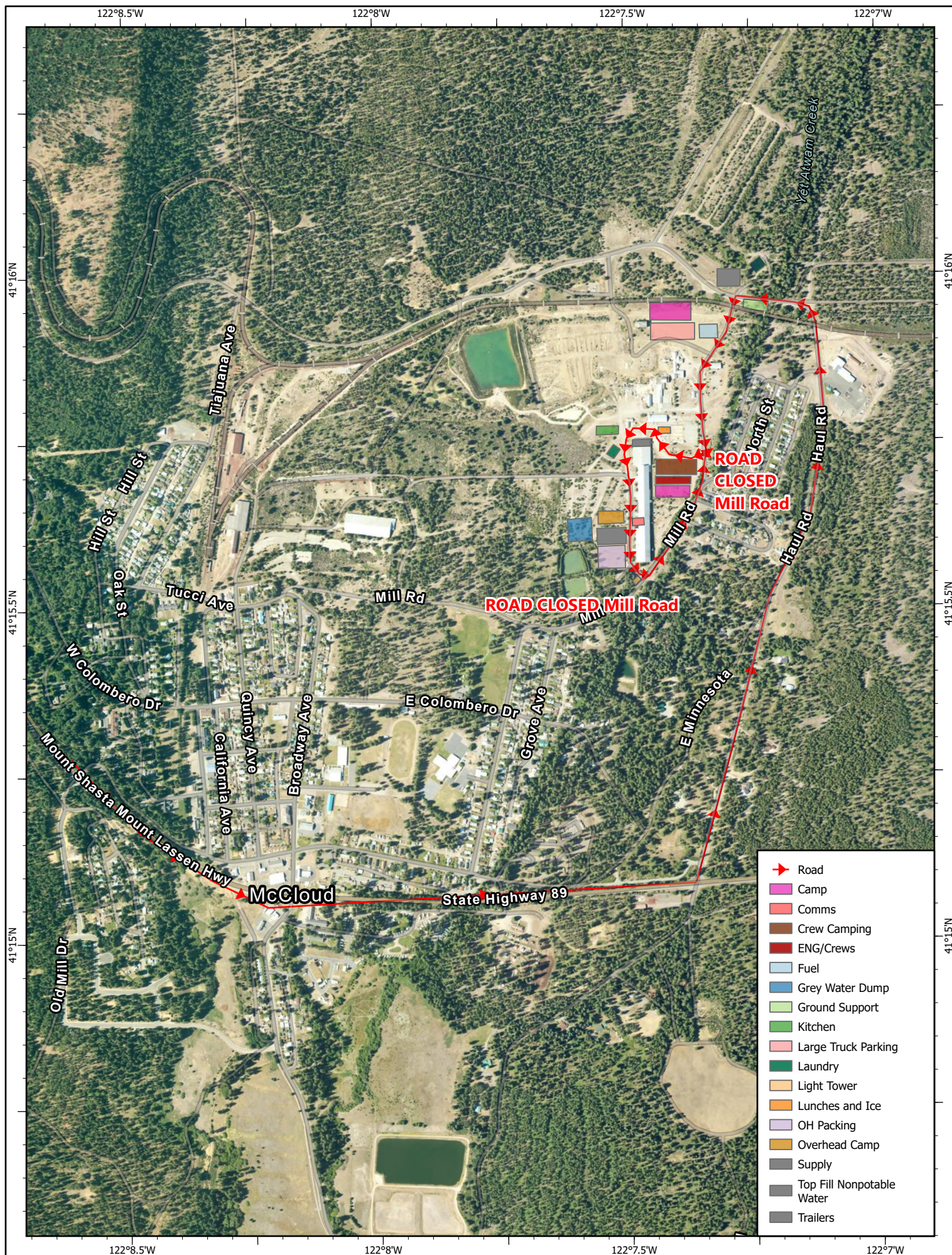
