

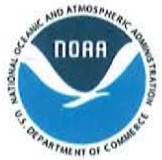



WEATHER DISCUSSION: A hot and relatively dry airmass will spread across the fire area today, pushing afternoon temperatures to near 100 degrees this afternoon. As the overnight inversion lifts this morning, humidity will fall below 30% by 1000 while general winds across the fire area become southeasterly. By early afternoon strong solar heating will lift the inversion layer above 8000 feet, allowing humidity to fall near or just below 20% through the afternoon. Hot and relatively dry conditions will continue into Saturday, along with an increase in southerly winds Saturday afternoon.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A marine layer will likely maintain low clouds early this morning along with excellent RH recovery. As this marine layer burns off by mid-morning, a warming trend will accelerate today as temperatures approach the 90-degree mark across the fire area this afternoon. This warming trend will also allow RH values to trend slightly lower today. Winds will continue to be driven by slope flows across the area today through tonight and into Saturday. The marine layer is expected to return tonight resulting in another night of excellent RH recovery.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fine fuels are fully cured and serve as the primary carrier of fire. Brush and shrub fuels are partially receptive to fire where old growth and dead components are present, while new growth remains resistant to fire spread. BI & ERC values are in the 80th to 90th percentile, respectively. However, the 100 & 1,000-hour dead fuels are well below average, nearing historic lows.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I / III: No fire behavior anticipated.

Branch V: PIG remains at 100%, watch for spotting in light, flashy fuels, especially around Devil's Elbow and Tower Check.

Branch VII: Although minimal fire behavior is expected, there is potential for the fire to align with Indian Valley and the escarpment west of East Park Reservoir.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate reduced visibility under smoke coverage due to high pressure with the inversion lifting by 1300.

Mixing height: 10,500 ft. AGL, Transport winds: S 7 mph, Sunrise 0543, Sunset 2038.

SAFETY

Re-burn potential exists within green islands where fire intensity was not adequate to consume the live brush. Winds may align with slopes and ignite these areas within the interior.
