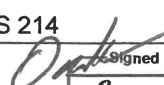

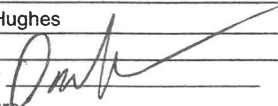

.DISCUSSION...Warm and dry conditions persist tomorrow with high temps close to what they are today. Temperatures return to seasonal normals through this week with upper 70s expected by midweek. Thermal belts remain well-defined above 1500 feet, where RH will continue to be about 15% lower than the valleys through the next few nights. Overnight conditions are anticipated to improve as the marine layer deepens and more ample low-level moisture works its way inland. Good RH recovery into the 60-70% range expected by Monday night/Tuesday morning. Otherwise, relatively benign weather with breezy diurnal W/SW winds during the afternoons.

FIRE BEHAVIOR NARRATIVE

GENERAL:

- **Fuel Moistures:** Dead fuels are dry, with live fuel moisture near critical levels, and will continue drying under forecasted weather conditions.
- **Dead and Down Fuels:** Glass Fire Burn scar resulted in a significant abundance of dead and down fuels, contributing to higher fire intensity and spread.
- **Challenging Terrain:** The rugged and inaccessible terrain, with multiple drainages, will make it hard to establish control line.
- **Longer Active Burn Period:** Poor nighttime moisture recovery will have longer burn periods and allow the fire to be active at night, especially within thermal belts in the upper elevations of the fire.
- **Herbaceous Fuels:** The annual grasses have cured across all elevations. This knee to waist high grass is prominent in the Glass Fire burn scar and is the primary driver of fire and creates a continuous fuel bed.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V: Fuels are primarily grass and brush with mixed timber. Potential exists for the fire to burn towards the north with rollout and intense uphill runs.

Branch XV: Fuels are primarily grass and brush with mixed timber. Steep, inaccessible, and complex terrain in DIV M will make it difficult to establish control lines. Rollout poses risk for significant uphill runs to occur should fire become established.

Branch XXV: Fuels are primarily grass and brush in this branch. Multiple drainages within the branch, with a south-to-north alignment, pose potential to support uphill runs should fire slope over or become established beyond control lines.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke inversion will limit visibility in the morning.

Sunrise: 6:33 am

Sunset: 7:48 pm

SAFETY:

Watch for spot fires from rolling materials that could ignite below your work location.
Make sure to identify escape routes and safety zones early in the shift.

DRIVING: Slow down and be cognizant of public in the area!

Safe speeds are a must! Caution with blind corners; watch for civilian and agricultural workers traffic. Evaluate your driving routes, monitor speed, gear selection, & brakes.

FATIGUE, HEAT, & HYDRATION

- Monitor yourself and your personnel for fatigue.
- Ensure you and your crew are properly hydrated.
- Avoid complacency; maintain appropriate Work/Rest cycles.
 - Seek shade when possible.
- Time to Think = Time to Drink. Stay Hydrated.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times.
3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.
4. Identify escape routes and safety zones, and make them known.
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and be sure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.

WATCH OUT SITUATIONS

1. Fire not scouted and sized up.
2. In country not seen in daylight.
3. Safety zones and escape routes not identified.
4. Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior.
5. Uninformed on strategy, tactics, and hazards.
6. Instructions and assignments not clear.
7. No communication link with crewmembers or supervisor.
8. Constructing line without safe anchor point.
9. Building fireline downhill with fire below.
10. Attempting frontal assault on fire.
11. Unburned fuel between you and fire.
12. Cannot see main fire; not in contact with someone who can.
13. On a hillside where rolling material can ignite fuel below.
14. Weather becoming hotter and drier.
15. Wind increases and/or changes direction.
16. Getting frequent spot fires across line.
17. Terrain and fuels make escape to safety zones difficult.
18. Taking a nap near fireline.

AERIAL FIREFIGHTING OPERATIONS

- Monitor A/G Traffic.
- Ensure the line is clear before receiving a drop.
- Familiarize yourself and crews with nighttime aerial operations.
- Receive a safety briefing prior to any crew shuttling operations

TAILGATE SAFETY BRIEFING

- Accountability: Everyone checks in and everyone checks out. Supervisors know where their crews are at all times.
- Communication: Everyone knows the communication plan and how to use their radio.
- Briefing: Everyone knows the plan for the day and their role in the plan.
- Safety Gear: Everyone has the appropriate safety gear.
- LCES: Have been identified and addressed.
