

GENERAL

With high winds and low RH expected to continue through the morning hours the possibility of spotting, large perimeter growth and crown runs may be present. The main carrier of the fire is the 10 and 100 hour dead fuel in the timber understory but transitioning into more of brush fuel model below 2500ft. Energy Release Components are at historic highs for this time of year and are mirroring peak fire season conditions. The unstable air mass that will be present in the fire area after 11:00am give the opportunity for **erratic fire behavior**. This can make control lines that were once quiet active, downdrafts, fire whirls, possibility of down hill fire runs and unpredictable wind conditions.

SPECIFIC

NORTHERN and EASTERN DIVISIONS

These divisions will see a strong northeast wind in the morning that will weaken in the afternoon then increase again in the early evening. This combined with potential for isolated dry thunderstorms create a prime environment for extreme fire conditions. Rates of spread and flame lengths can exceed the predicted forecast under these conditions.

WESTERN and SOUTHERN DIVISIONS

The western and southern divisions will have been directly affected by the northeast wind from the night before and continue through the morning. In these divisions there is the chance of large fire growth and roll out that will create challenges for suppression personnel. If the fire continues toward the west the fuel transitions from a timber into brush with more light flashy fuel as a receptive fuel bed. This combined with the unstable air mass in the afternoon will make for very **erratic fire behavior**. Rates of spread and flame lengths can exceed the predicted forecast under these conditions.

AIR OPERATIONS:

High winds in the morning can affect the effectiveness of airdrops. Possible thunderstorm development over the fire area can create down drafts that can hamper air operations.

SAFETY

- **Watch your wind conditions**- Unstable air combined with heavy fire activity can create a pyro cumulus
- **Have a escape route**- Changing wind can put you and your crew in a compromised position
- **Risk vs Gain**- In an operational period with predicted extreme and erratic fire behavior, is it worth it?

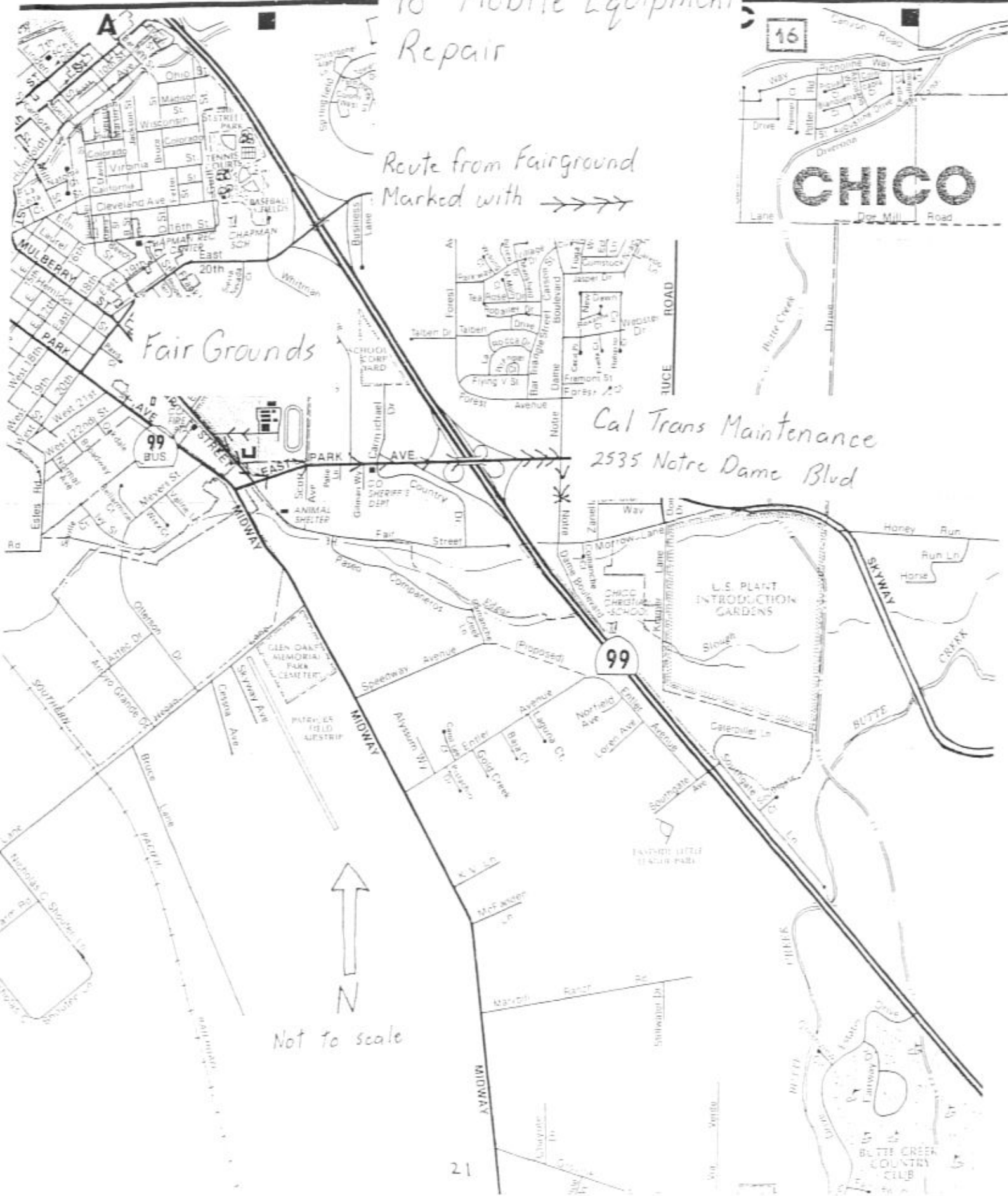
