containing those spot fires. Interior islands of unburned fuel continue to be consumed. The firing operation in Div. M was completed early this morning. The fire is now down to the Eel River in that division. Division P, W and Y are being secured with aggressive mop up.

Due to the success of the firing operation in Div. M, the Evacuation Order previously issued has been downgraded to an Evacuation Warning. All areas that were previously in an Evacuation Warning will remain in an Evacuation Warning until further notice. Effective 8/14/14 at 1400 hours.

High potential for extreme fire behavior remains as the interior of the fire continues to burn. Divisions K, L, N and P have transitioned to Mop-up and Patrol. Division W continues to construct line around spot fires. Suppression repair is being performed on the majority of the divisions.

Containment only grew by 5 percent due to a significant amount of spotting outside of containment lines but within contingency lines in Division L. Mop up and suppression repair will continue on the rest of the fire.

Areas of the fire continue to burn in duff and litter, which creates potential for a reburn into the canopy. These areas of concern are being closely monitored.

Energy Release Components (ERC) are at historically high levels. The average slope is 70%.

Drift smoke from the fire has been settling in the Ukiah Valley and could create potential health and economic impacts, including Vineyards and Pear Orchards. Reports of smoke have been received from the Santa Rosa area of Sonoma County.
