



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will continue to increase in temperature and lower humidity. Temperatures will be 85-90 during the day and 60-68 overnight. Relative humidity will be 10-18% during the day and 40-50% overnight. Winds will mainly be terrain driven with northwest to west 5-8 mph during the day and northwest 3-7 mph becoming east to northeast 3-7 mph overnight.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The fuels have completely returned to their cured state. The limited humidity recovery at night will make the fuels available for ignition earlier in the day. Islands within the fire will continue to smolder and burn. Many of the islands also contain houses, without fire line around them. There are many areas of standing brush where the understory has burned. In these areas the brush and the trees have started to drop their leaves, creating a new surface layer of fuels. These areas will have the potential to re-burn and climb into the canopy of the brush. This will create a spotting potential. The spotting distance will increase with higher winds and/or column development. The Probability of Ignition will return to 90-100% in the afternoon.

SPECIFIC:

The weather will increase the fire activity and areas previously smoldering can become active. The northeast side of the will have rollout as the heavier material continue to burn and become unstable. The east side of the fire has many islands that will become active and can have an effect on the houses in the area. Embers from a burning island can ignite new fires in the vegetation around a structure. Aggressively patrol the islands for smoldering materials and ensure complete extinguishment. The south portion of the fire along Fricot City Road has islands of green brush along the control line. If this fire becomes active there is the possibility of it crossing the line and progressing into the drainage to the south. The west side of the fire has had minimal problems the past several days. Much of the area is in the grass oak woodland and has very little heavy fuels.



CAL FIRE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM WATER USAGE PLAN

California Drought Emergency

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

Road Maintenance and Repair-

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

Aviation Operations-

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

Private Water Supplies-

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Management and Supervision-

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

All federal, state and local government agency trainees working on position task books will need to register with the Incident Training Specialist in order to receive proper credit for your assignment.

We are now experiencing an increase in DEMOB'S with the incident. Please come by early to close out your training package and check out with us PRIOR to starting the DEMOB process.

To check out: bring your evaluation record, performance evaluation, qualification card and position task book.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Demobilization Plan is developed to facilitate the orderly removal and checkout of resources on the incident. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have rested for a minimum of 8 hours.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- **NO RESOURCES WILL LEAVE THE INCIDENT UNTIL AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THE DEMOB UNIT.**
- DEMOB list will be posted around camp and also will be added to the CAL FIRE IMT 1 online folder. (Scan QR code to read DEMOB list or <http://calfire.box.com/calfireimt1>)
- Efforts will be made to ensure that all released personnel arrive at their destination prior to 2200 hours.
- All government and hired vehicles leaving the incident will have a safety inspection. If a vehicle is within 1,000 miles of a "B" service, it is the responsibility of the resource to contact Ground Support and have an oil change prior to their scheduled DEMOB time.
- All trainees are to keep their time up to date and report to the Training Specialist with their task books and evaluations prior to completion of the demobilization process.
- All strike team leaders are responsible to call North Ops at 1-800-237-3703 immediately upon being released from the incident.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Unit Leaders will declare resources excess to their **Section Chief**. **Section Chiefs** will declare excess resources to the Planning Section Chief through the **Resource Unit Leader**. This should be done 36 hours in advance of anticipated release. Use the **Declaration of Excess Resources sheet** or **General Message Form (ICS-213)** to list all excess resources. Include the resource name, request number, name of person, date and time of declared excess, and time in which the resource will be eligible to leave. Send to the **RESOURCE UNIT** where the resource will be determined to be surplus to the incident. Surplus resources will then be able to report to the **DEMOB UNIT**, receive a Demobilization Checkout Form (ICS 221), get the appropriate ICS 221 signatures, and then return the completed ICS 221 to the DEMOB UNIT prior to final release or reassignment.

RELEASE PRIORITIES

1. Organized fire departments
2. OES engines
3. Hired personnel and equipment
4. Other agencies (USFS, BLM, etc.)
5. Out of region Cal Fire forces
6. Within Region Cal Fire Forces
7. Unit CAL FIRE Forces

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All resources will meet agency specific requirements on hours of travel per day. For CAL FIRE hand crews, a full 24 hour reset period shall be adhered to before departing from the incident. After a crew's last operational period they shall begin the demobilization release procedure during their 24 hour off shift. In addition, they must use the following complete 24 hour period as reset time before they depart from the incident.

Roads

- Install waterbars where waterbars previously existed.
- Install waterbars where needed based on guidelines.
- Install or maintain rolling dips where a rolling dip previously existed.
- Install or maintain existing berms where applicable.
- Clean culverts plugged with soil and rock resulting from fire suppression actions.
- Remove all slash and debris from culvert inlets/outlets resulting from suppression actions.
- Clean and grade ditch lines and lead off ditches as necessary.
- Water roads for dust abatement.

Hand Lines, Dozer Lines, and Safety Zones

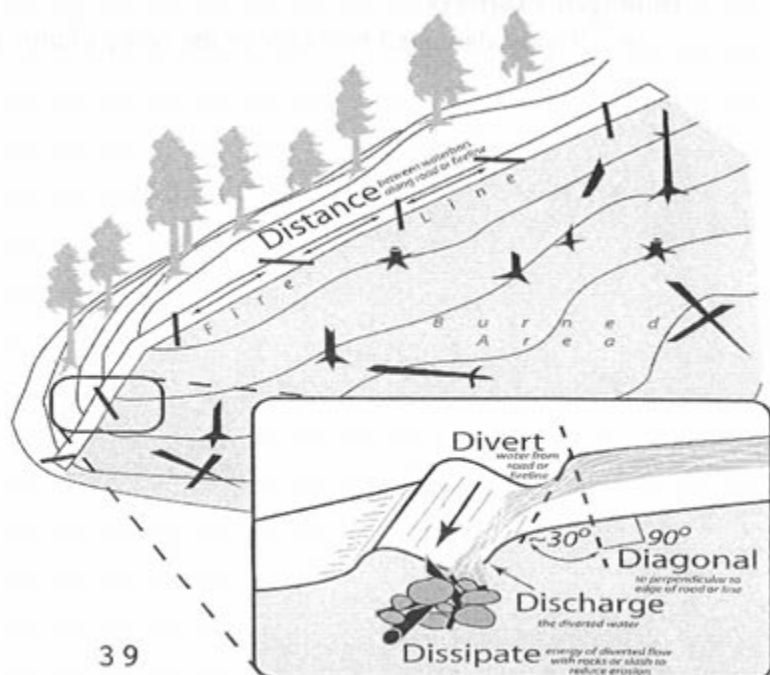
- Install waterbars as described in the guidelines below. Waterbars are designed to intercept, slow and spread the precipitation run-off in order to reduce sediment transport and soil erosion. The idea is to move water off the fireline before it can build up enough energy to erode and transport sediment. Direct waterbars into “green” vegetation whenever possible.
- Low-cut stumps to within 4 inches of ground level. (National Forest Lands Only)

Waterbar Guidelines:

These spacing distances should be used as a *guide*. Judgment should be used in locating waterbars to minimize erosion potential. It may not be possible or necessary to place waterbars in steep or rocky areas. Install waterbars at the following recommended *minimum* intervals:

Fireline Gradient (% slope)	Minimum Distance between Waterbars (feet)
0 to 10	200
11 to 25	100
25+	50

- Remove sediment from watercourse crossing locations and stabilize watercourse crossing approaches with straw or scattered brush where necessary.
- Contour rip wide dozer lines where gradients exceed 20%. (National Forest Lands Only)



Brush Piles/ Wind Rows

- Scatter, lop, crush, or masticate brush piles or wind rows within 100 feet of residences, public roads, or along identified strategic fuel breaks.
- Move whole trees to roadside edge of fire line. Delimb whole trees to provide ground cover. (National Forest Lands Only).
- In sensitive areas where vegetation ground cover is below 50%, add wood straw. (National Forest Lands Only)

Sensitive Areas (National Forest Lands Only)

- Minimize further damage Cultural/Historic resources by avoiding areas that have been flagged with sensitive resource flagging (yellow and black checker).
 - Contact Resource Advisor before proceeding with work in these areas.
- Minimize further spread of noxious weeds by avoiding areas that have been flagged with orange flagging with Noxious Weed writing with equipment and rehabilitation activities.
 - Contact Resource Advisor before proceeding with work in these areas.

Stream Channels (National Forest Lands Only)

- Remove all material used to construct diversions or impoundments.
- Block access to stream channels where not previously accessible from roads, or trails; use slash and make natural appearing.
- If dirt was pushed into stream channels, pull dirt back at least 50 feet from stream banks.
- Do not disturb stream bottom and stream bank.

Fences

- Repair fences damaged during fire suppression operations.

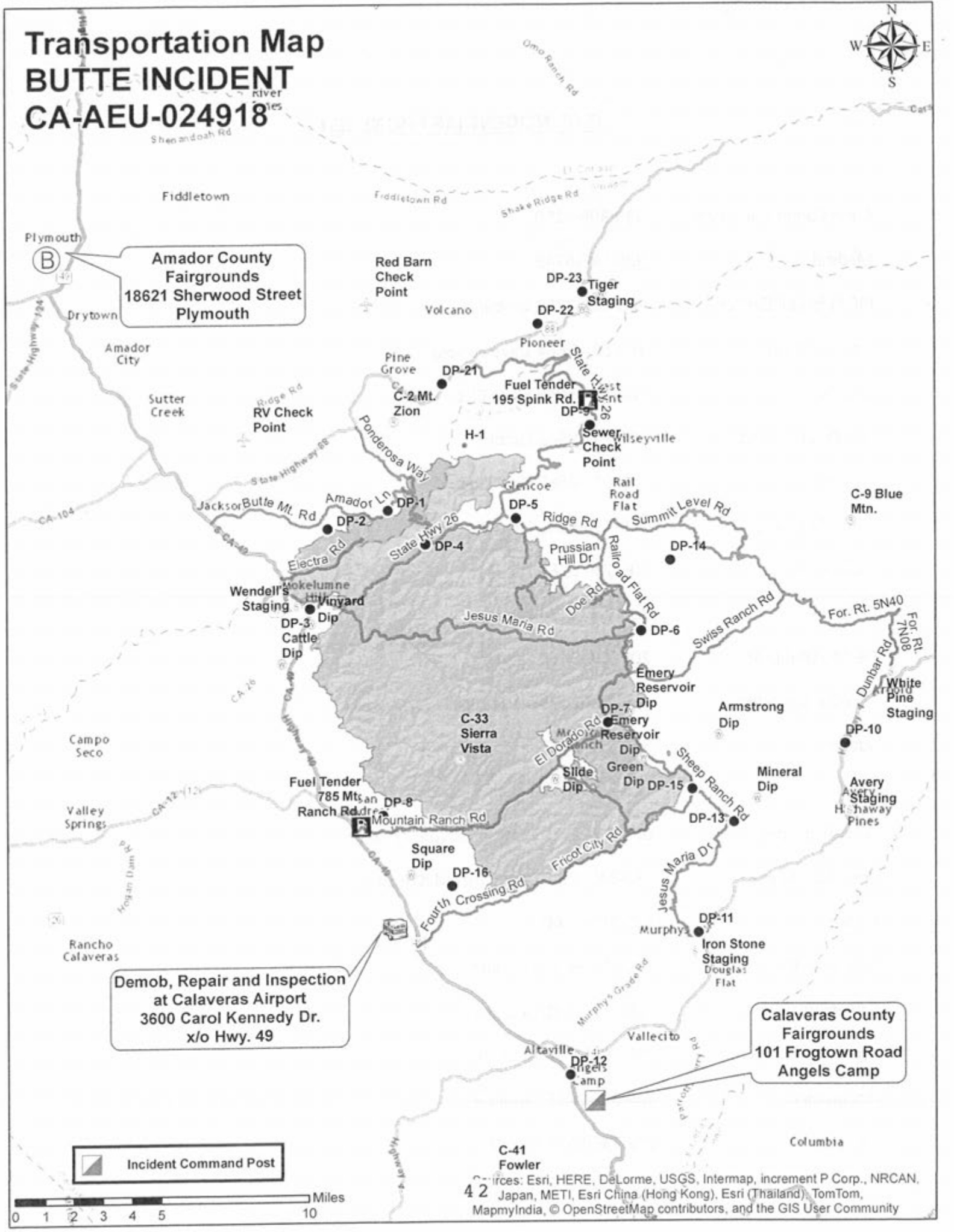

Transportation Map BUTTE INCIDENT CA-AEU-024918

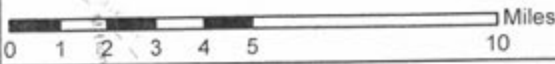
