




Friday ***

North Ops is under a southwesterly flow aloft, a larger-scale pattern that can be fairly stable and thunderstorm-free. **However**, weak to moderate upper air disturbances riding the SW flow across northern CA can moisten and destabilize the atmosphere sufficiently to trigger isolated or greater convective activity, especially over the mid to higher terrain. One such weak disturbance will approach the Area late today, crossing NOPS tonight. After a more stable and drier day Wednesday, probably with no thunderstorms in NOPS, a stronger system will bring about a more significant event late Thursday into early Saturday. **Both of these events will have enough mixed to drier strike activity to present concerns for NOPS**, though the cells

North Ops 7-day Significant Fire Potential Outlook

Friday should turn wetter overnight. Max temperatures inland moderated to range from near to a bit below early-August normals, but will now trend back to just above normal on Thursday. Humidity has been running above normal, and is expected to show only minor drops over the next several days. The strongest *general* winds late today will be in the upper Sacramento drainage (southerly) and from the Cascade/ Sierra eastward (S to WSW), with local gusts 25-35 mph. Winds look lighter for most of these areas Wednesday.

At this time, the weekend looks to have very little thunderstorm activity, other than some slight chances in the counties bordering OR. Most other areas will be in a fairly dry and more stable SW to West flow pattern. A cool trough of low pressure may set up semi-stationary along the OR and NorCal coasts for next Monday- Tuesday, before stronger high pressure aloft builds in midweek.



DIV	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS / CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS/WARNINGS/REMEDIES
CAMP	FATIGUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be alert for signs of fatigue in yourself and your crew, get adequate rest at Camp. • Monitor incoming/outgoing resources for level of fatigue. • Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
CAMP	HYDRATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay hydrated while in camp, replenish bottled water supply. • Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
CAMP	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Slow Down on Highway 273! • Reduce distractions (phones, radios, eating) while driving. • Increase following distances. Maintain Situational Awareness. • Drive with headlights on.
CAMP	HEAT ILLNESS PREVENTION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Follow CAL FIRE Heat Illness Prevention Plan-Available at ICP • All line personnel should be acclimated to work environment • Monitor employee hydration/nutrition and insure adequate supplies are available • Utilize cooling measures to assist with lowering core temperature • IRPG Page 103




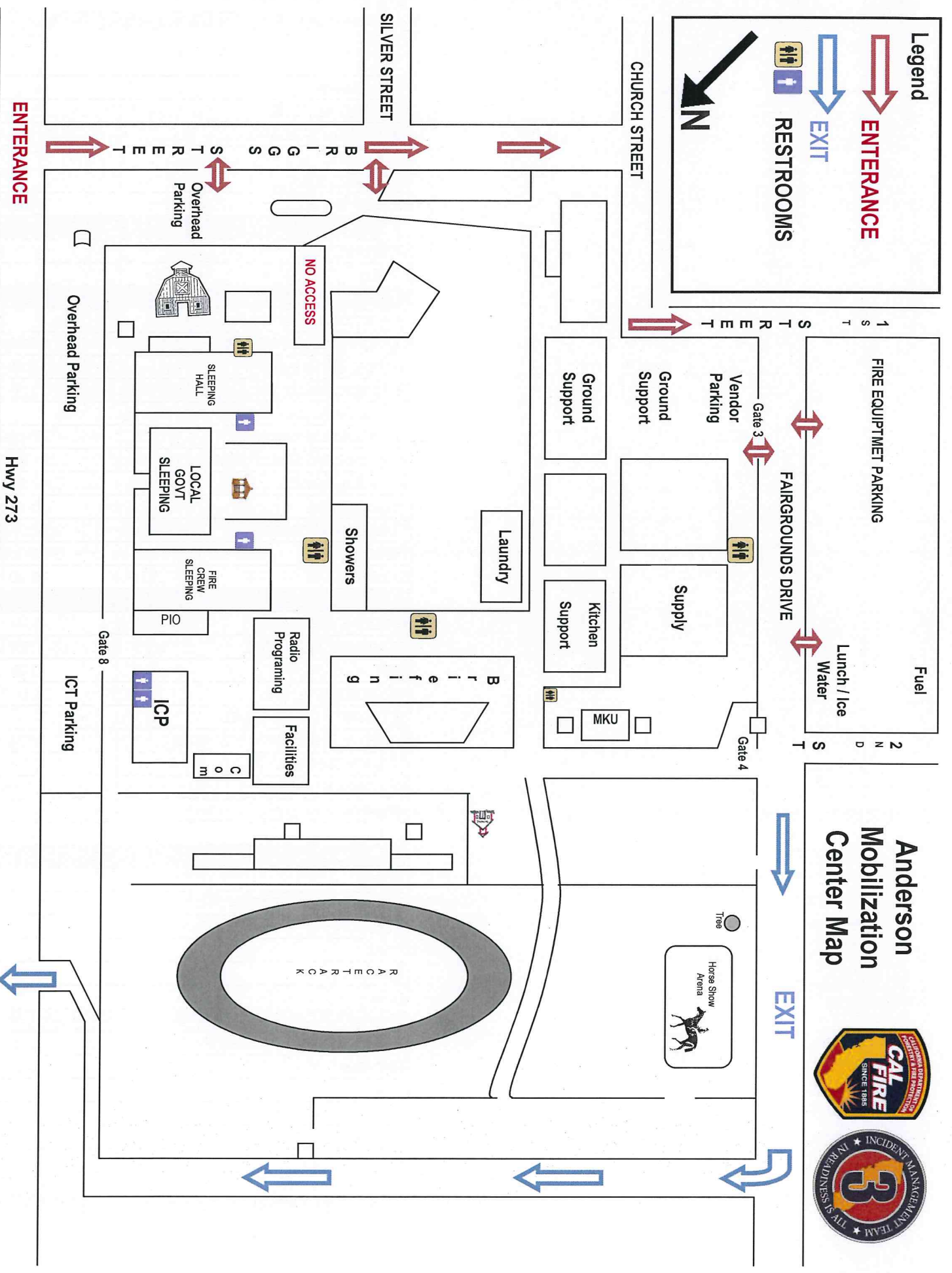


Anderson Mobilization Center Map
