Northern California Weather Synopsis



***** High Risk for Strong Winds NE and E Areas Monday- Wednesday *****

A low pressure trough will begin to drop into the North Ops region from the Eastern Gulf of Alaska today. Isolated thunderstorms are possible late today in far northern and eastern areas, but the chances are quite low. The main fire weather issue from this incoming trough will be increasing SW to W winds today, which may gusts to 17-22 mph late this afternoon over exposed areas.

By Sunday these winds will be out of the S to SW with gusts over higher terrain reaching 20-28 mph. These winds will further increase Monday and Tuesday to 25-32 mph out of the SE to SW, with the Weed, CA area being a particular concern, as the trough deepens and forms a cutoff low just offshore. There is a remote chance of isolated showers or thunderstorms each afternoon across the far northern and eastern ends of the North Ops region through Wednesday.

Late on Thursday the low will move NE into SW OR, clipping the far NW corner of CA. There is a chance of showers or thunderstorms north of a line from Cape Mendocino to McCloud to Goose Lake late Thursday. Friday will be warmer and drier with winds becoming light out of the west.

- ✓ Conduct walk around before driving
- ✓ Check for and secure all loose items (ie: tools, hose, and packs)
- ✓ Wear seat belts at all times
- ✓ Monitor all drivers for fatigue,
 - Switch drivers regularly if possible
 - If not find a safe place to stop, exit the vehicle and stretch a little
 - If all else fails, stop and take a short rest to revitalize.

- ✓ Ensure Personnel have adequate nutrition and hydration for the trip

DIV	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS / CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS/WARNINGS/REMEDIES
CAMP	FATIGUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be alert for signs of fatigue in yourself and your crew, get adequate rest at Camp. • Monitor incoming/outgoing resources for level of fatigue. • Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
CAMP	HYDRATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay hydrated while in camp, replenish bottled water supply. • Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
CAMP	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Slow Down on Highway 273! • Reduce distractions (phones, radios, eating) while driving. • Increase following distances. Maintain Situational Awareness. • Drive with headlights on.
CAMP	HEAT ILLNESS PREVENTION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Follow CAL FIRE Heat Illness Prevention Plan-Available at ICP • All line personnel should be acclimated to work environment • Monitor employee hydration/nutrition and insure adequate supplies are available • Utilize cooling measures to assist with lowering core temperature • IRPG Page 103
CAMP	COMMUNICATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Obtain incident information and IAP prior to departing Mob Center. • Everyone gets a briefing. • Ensure radios are correctly cloned for your next assignment • Refer to IRPG Page ix.
CAMP	COMPLACENCY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay alert. Be prepared to respond when dispatched. • Maintain situational awareness • Refer to IRPG Page x.
ALL	SECURITY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Secure your vehicles prior to leaving. Keep valuables out of sight. • Park in well-lit areas • Provide for accountability of your personnel • Regarding recent events, maintain situational awareness of your surroundings both in camp and with movement around the community.

- **MANDATORY HANDWASHING PRIOR TO EATING MEALS**

- **NO DRUGS OR ALCOHOL ON PREMISE AT ANY TIME**

- **USE DESIGNATED METERED FIRE HYDRANTS FOR FILLING EQUIPMENT**

- **NO SMOKING WITHIN 30 FEET OF ALL ENTRANCES AND EXITS**

- **FOOT TRAFFIC ONLY IN BASECAMP**
 - Park vehicles in designated areas

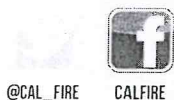

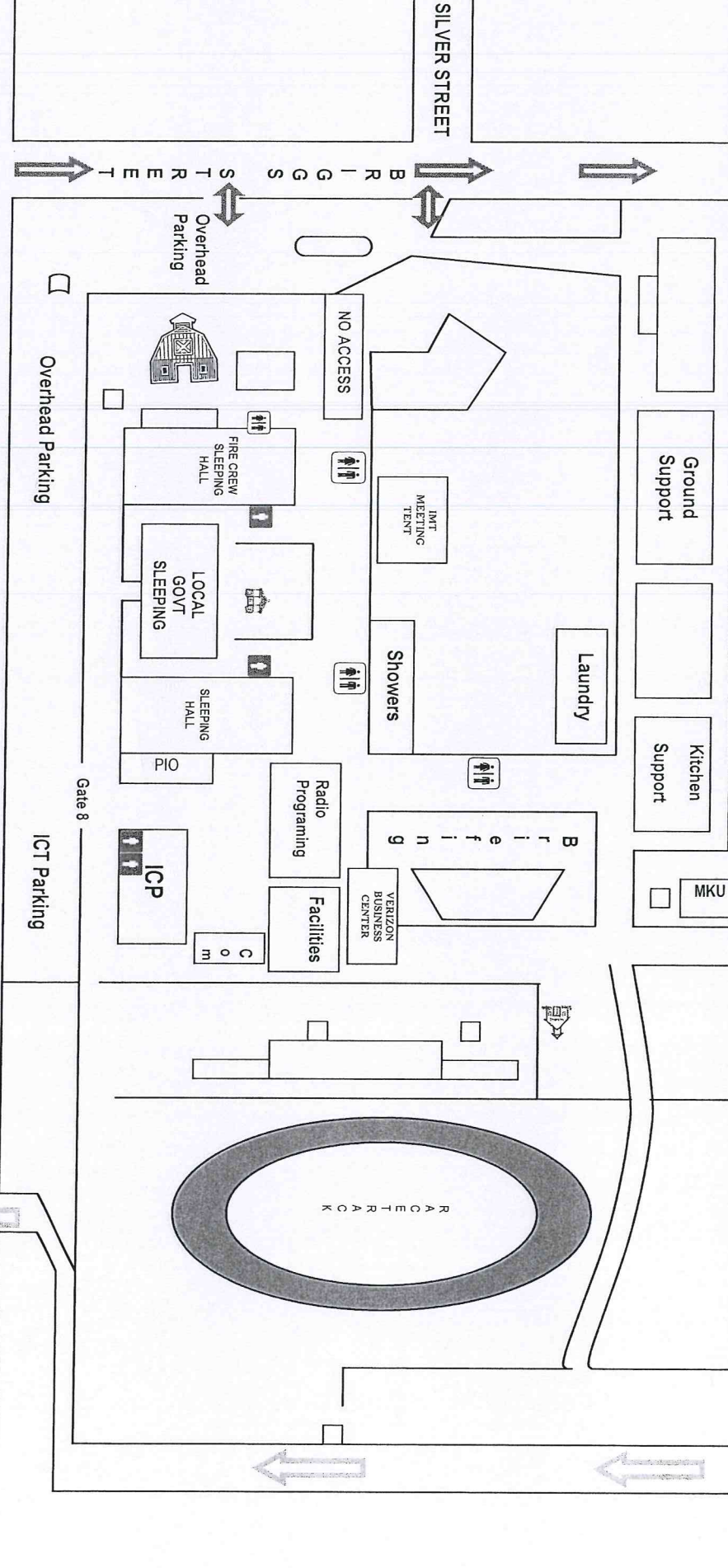
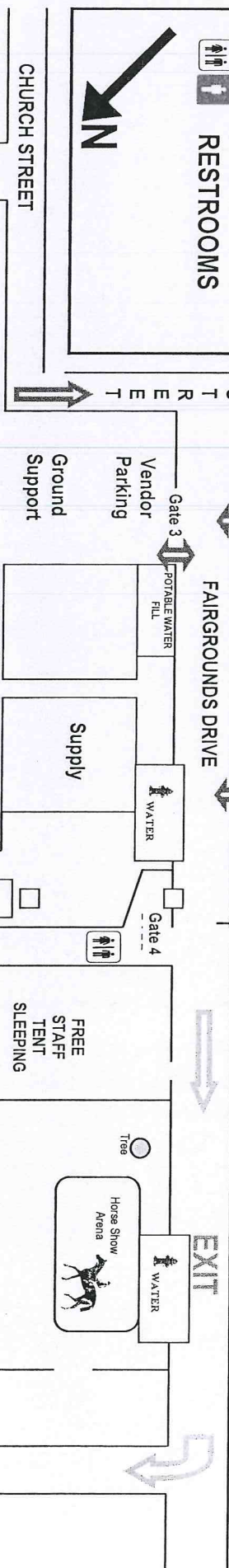
