*** High Risk for Strong SE to SW Winds Across Northern and Eastern Areas Monday through Thursday ***

A low pressure trough is deepening offshore. There is a remote chance (less than 10%) of a thunderstorm forming late today in far northern and eastern areas. This pattern will continue each day through Wednesday, with far NW CA having slightly better chances for convection than anywhere else. The main fire weather issue from this incoming trough will be increasing SW winds today, which may gusts to 22-27 mph this afternoon over exposed areas. Wind gusts will further increase Monday through Thursday to 27-35 mph out of the SE to SW, with the Weed, CA area being a particular concern, as the trough deepens and forms a cutoff low just offshore. Late on Thursday the low will move NE into western OR, clipping the far NW corner of CA. There is a chance of showers or thunderstorms north of a line from Cape Mendocino to McCloud to Goose Lake late Thursday and Thursday night. Friday will be warmer and drier with lighter westerly winds. High pressure pushing up from the south will produce dry conditions with light winds and above normal temperatures Saturday through Monday.
