



.....HIGHER TEMPERATURES AND LOWER RELATIVE HUMIDITY TODAY....

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

A ridge of high pressure will briefly build over the fire area today bringing an increase in temperatures and lower rh's to the perimeter. Surface winds will vary from east to west but should remain around 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph during peak burning. Late Thursday and Friday the Pacific low pressure system will move across the coast...bringing a chance of light showers and a slight chance of thunderstorms to the fire area.

WEATHER FORECAST TODAY (WEDNESDAY DAYTIME):

WEATHER: Sunny...Warmer and Drier.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 86-91.
MIN HUMIDITY 2000 ft: 21-26%...near 17% North and East Perimeter.
WINDS (EYE LEVEL):
2500 FT: East or Variable 5 to 10 mph until 1400 PDT... Then becoming West or upslope 8 to 14 mph with Gusts to 20 mph until 2100 PDT.
LAL: 1 CWR: 0%
STABILITY / INVERSION: Moderately Unstable.
SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: West-Southwest 10 mph.

WEATHER FORECAST WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly Cloudy...warmer with less recovery.

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):
West or upslope 5 to 10 mph until 2400 PDT... Then becoming variable or downslope 3 to 5 mph until sunrise.

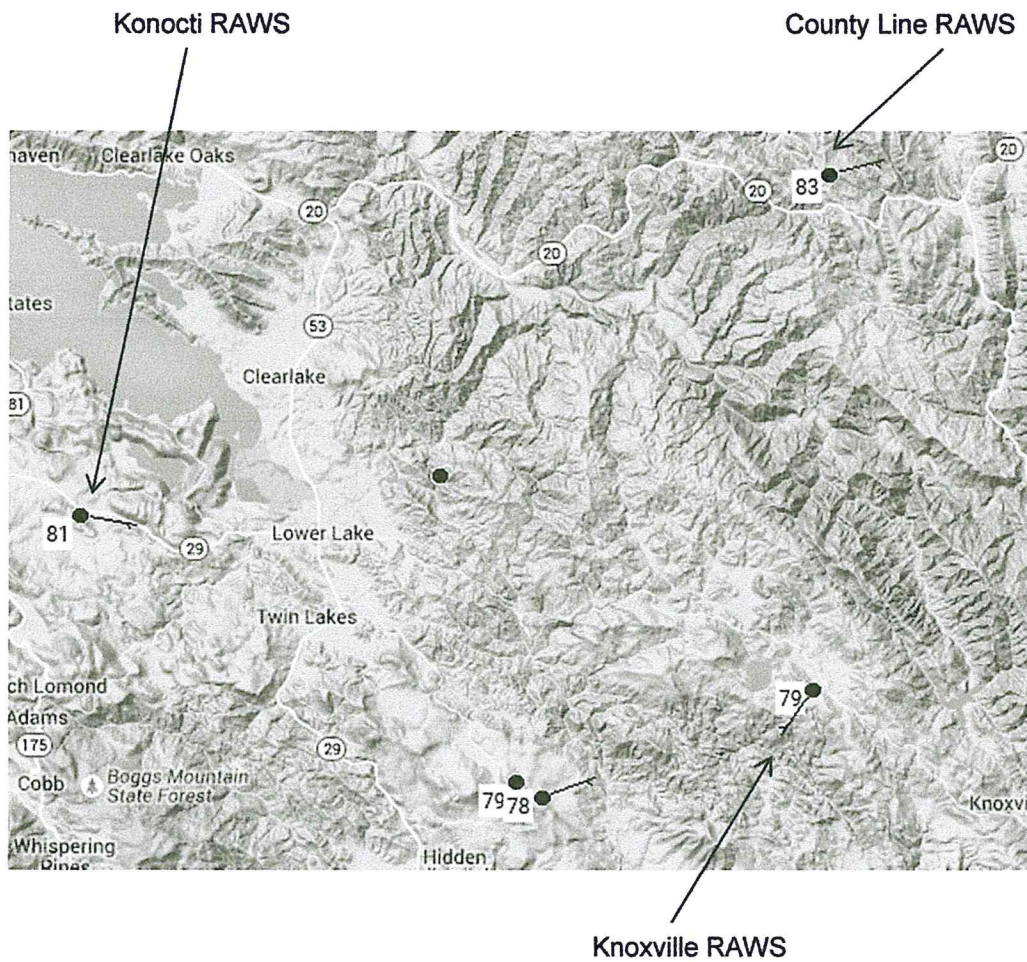

Max Temps: 88 to 94. Min RH: 18 to 23%. Wind: East and Southeast 5 mph until 1500...then west or upslope 6 to 10 mph...gusts to 15 mph after 1500 PDT. Smoke Transport Wind: South 10-15 mph. CWR: 10%.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR FRIDAY THROUGH SATURDAY:

FRIDAY: Mostly cloudy with a 30% chance of light showers or thunderstorms. LAL: 2 / CWR: 10%.
Max Temps...80 to 85. Min RH...25 to 35%...(much higher with rain)
Wind: East and southeast 5 mph until 1500 PDT...then mainly west winds 12 to 17 mph with gusts to 25 mph late afternoon. Smoke Transport Wind: Fri...North 5-10 mph.



SATURDAY: Sunny warmer and drier.
Max Temps...92 to 97. Min RH...20%.
Wind: Variable to 4 to 6 mph until 1500...then west 6 to 10 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: *** *Shifting Winds in the Afternoon* ***

High pressure will begin to dry out Fine Dead Fuels throughout the day. Anticipate winds shifting throughout the operational period. Winds will change from East to West in the afternoon with gusty drier conditions. Wide spread scattered light showers from yesterday did little to increase current fuel moisture. With the shift in winds and solar drying of fuels, watch for an increase in fire behavior between 1400 and 2000. Chance for Wetting Rain 0%

Max. Temperatures: 83-88 degrees **Min. Humidity:** 21-26 % (17% near North and East perimeter)

Winds(Eye Level)- Morning: East 5-10 mph, Gusts to 15mph

Afternoon: West/Upslope 8-14 mph, Gusts to 20 mph.

Evening: West/Upslope 5-10 mph till 2400, then shifting downslope 3-5 mph till sunrise

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Large amounts of unburned islands continue to pose a threat to control lines in all Divisions.
- Watch weather trends throughout the day. Fire behavior has responded predictably with: **RH** (below 30%), **Temperature** (above 85 Degrees), and **Wind Speed** (above 5 mph at Eye Level)
- New starts will carry well in old growth drought stressed fuels.
- Understory burning of the brush fuels has dried out the canopy above, promoting easier transition to the unburned over-story.

SPECIFIC:

All Divisions: Spot fires outside established containment lines or new starts...

Flame Lengths- Up to 10 ft. in Grass, Up to 20 ft. in Brush, Up to 50ft from the tops of torching trees.

Rate of Spread- Up to 100 feet/minute in Grass, Up to 150 feet/minute in Brush

Spotting Distances- Up to .4 miles in Grass/Brush, Up to .3 miles in Torching Trees

Probability of Ignition- Unshaded Fuels **90%** at the peak of the burn period. **WATCH FOR HOLD-OVERS.**

AIR OPERATIONS:

Moderately unstable conditions will aid in good smoke dispersal by 1100. Mixing heights will again rise to 5,000 AGL during peak daytime heating. Expect turbulence to increase, and winds to shift in the afternoon. Transport winds will be from the West/Southwest at 10 mph.

Sunrise- 6:15

Sunset- 8:20

Major Hazards and Risks: Complacency, Fatigue, Driving Hazards, Aircraft

Complacency: ALL PPE must be worn, including shrouds, when working on the fire line. Mop up requires your situational awareness even without active fire. Unburnt fuels can reignite suddenly and turn against you.

Fatigue: Manage yourself and those around you for excessive fatigue; many have driven long distances or been redeployed from other incidents. Use the buddy system and take breaks as needed. As fatigue increase, injuries tend to increase also.

Hazard trees: Survey your work areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Review and follow **Hazard Tree Safety**, pg. 22-23 in your IRPG.

Ash Pots: the droughts stricken fuels consumed entirely by fire are creating flat ash pots with hot coals underneath. Watch your footing.

Aircraft: Monitor Channel 15 Air to Ground – CDF Tac 14 at all times. Helco and Air Attack your eyes in the sky!!

Eat and drink fluids on a regular basis to maintain an appropriate energy level for any expected work assignment. Remember, you are the only one that knows your limitations.

Review your ICS 206 and follow the Line Emergency procedures.

Lookouts, Communication, Escape routes, Safety zones

MEDIA - The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence.

- Nor is the Media permitted on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY, Social Media 0691 – Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore when on a CAL FIRE incident you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the Information Section.

There will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials
- No opinions
- No endorsements
- Do not post inappropriate pictures or videos
- If you are uncertain, question.

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT – We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

LOST AND FOUND – The Information Section will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well.

MAIL SERVICE – The Information Section will assist you in getting items mailed from the incident as well as receiving items whether it is letters or packages.

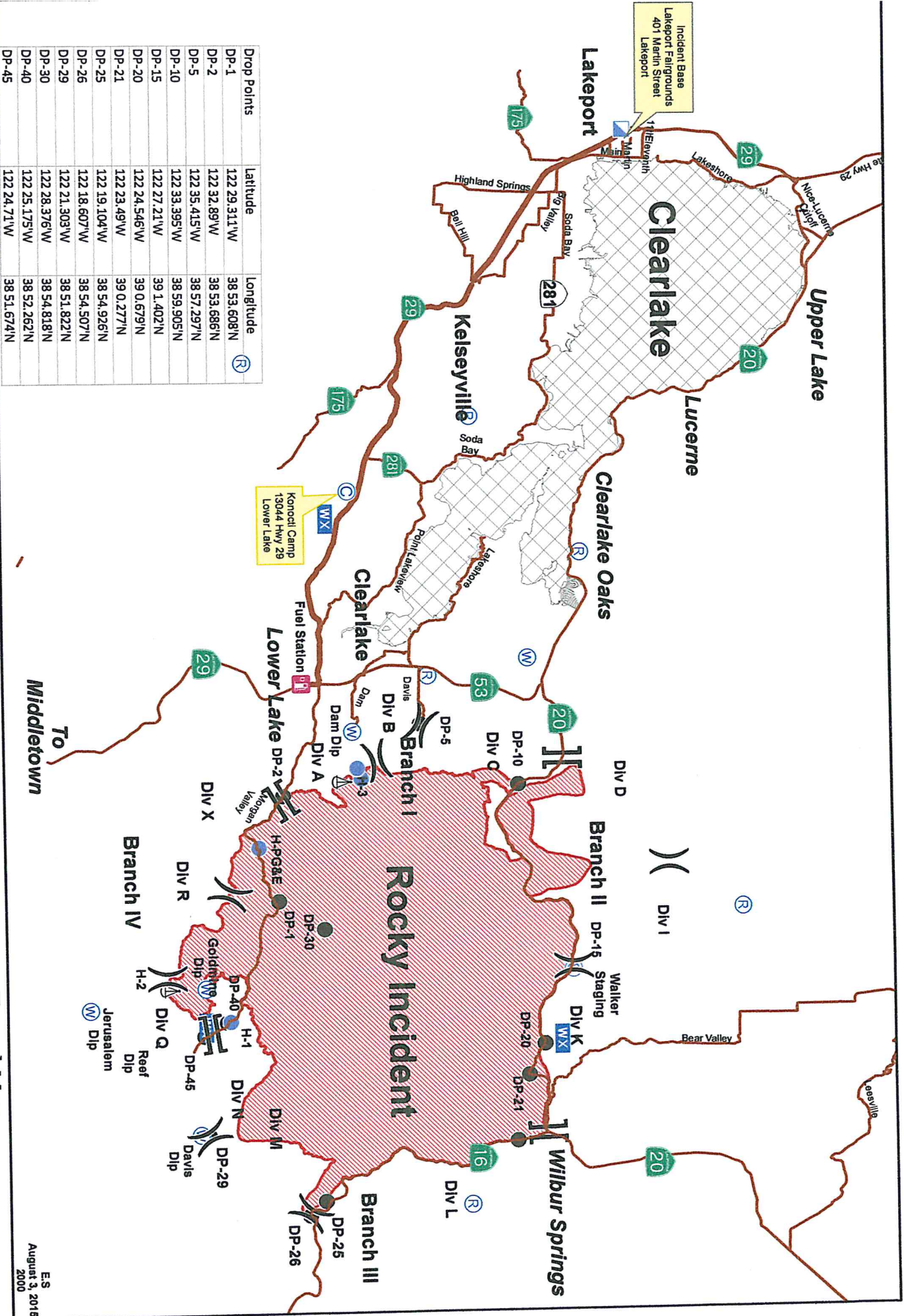

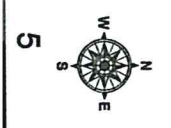
