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## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Warm and dry conditions continue today before an upper low pressure system moves east across the North bay area Tonight and early Friday. Rain and Thunderstorm chances look best late in The evening Thursday and continuing into Friday as the Pacific low pressure system moves across the area.

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## WEATHER FORECAST TODAY (THURSDAY DAYTIME):

WEATHER: Sunny with light smoke and haze possible...increasing cloud cover from the south in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 88-93.

MIN HUMIDITY 2000 ft: 18-23%...near 15% North and East Perimeter.

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

2500 FT: East or Variable 5 to 10 mph until 1400 PDT... Then becoming West and Northwest 8 to 14 mph with Gusts to 20 mph until 2100 PDT.

LAL: 1 CWR: 0%

STABILITY / INVERSION: Moderately Unstable.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South 10 mph.

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## WEATHER FORECAST THURSDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Cloudy with a 40% chance of light rain showers and isolated thunderstorms. Showers should begin to develop midnight and may last through Wed morning. Rain amounts of less than a tenth of an inch expected. CWR: 15%.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 60 - 64.

MAX HUMIDITY: 50 to 60%....may rise if showers develop early in the morning.

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

West or upslope 5 to 10 mph until 2400 PDT... Then becoming variable or downslope 3 to 5 mph until sunrise.

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OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY: Mostly cloudy through mid-day with residual showers. Sky clearing in the afternoon. CWR: 10% until midday. LAL: 2

Max Temps: 88 to 94. Min RH: 30 - 40% ( much higher if rain is observed).

Wind: East and Southeast 5 mph until 1500...then west or southwest increasing to 8 to 12 mph...gusts to 22 mph after 1500 PDT.

Smoke Transport Wind: Northwest 10 mph. CWR: 10%.

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## EXTENDED FORECAST FOR SATURDAY THROUGH SUNDAY:

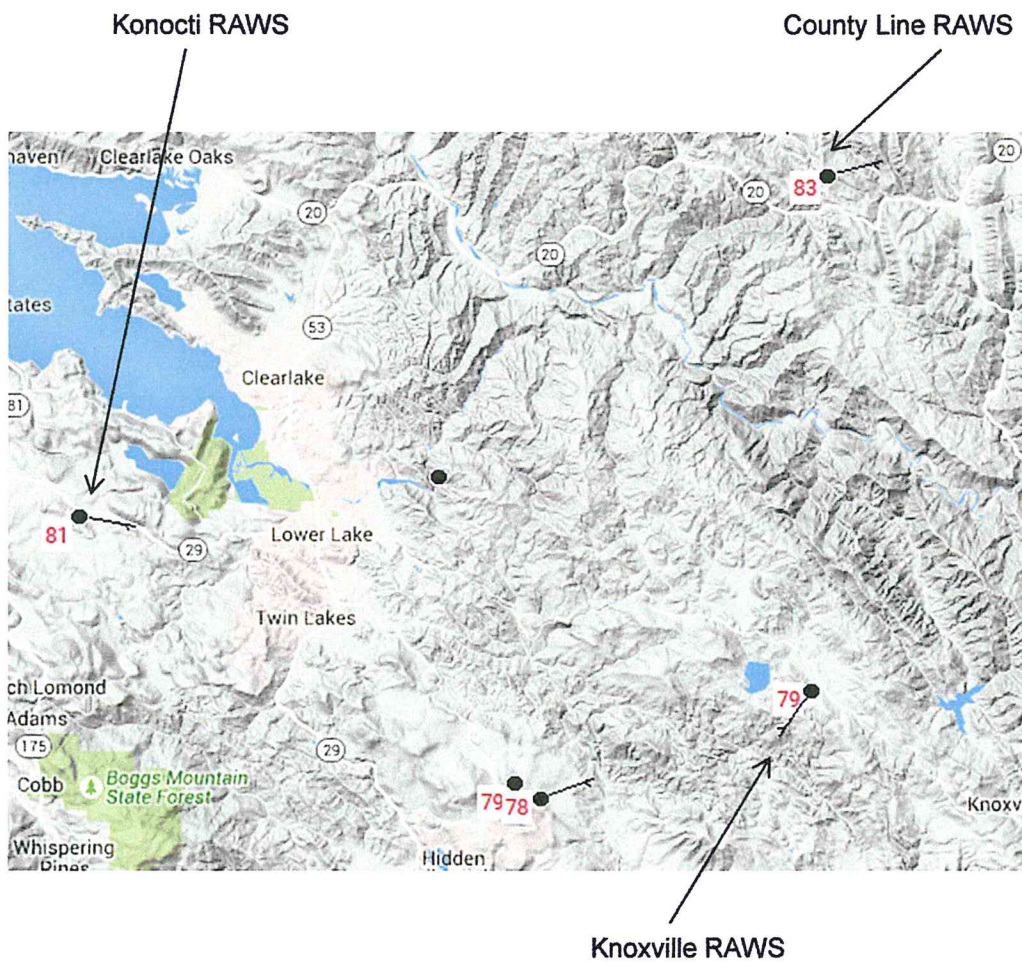
Mostly sunny. LAL: 1 / CWR: 0%.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY: \*\*\* Upper level low moving in \*\*\*

Hotter conditions over the past day have returned fuels to the initial attack levels. Watch for wind shifts in the afternoon. With the shift in winds and solar drying of fuels, expect an increase in fire behavior between 1400 and 2000, when thresholds are reached. THUNDERSTORMS area possible after 2400. Chance for Wetting Rain 15%, chance for SHOWERS 40%.

**Max. Temperatures:** 88-93 degrees    **Min. Humidity:** 18--23 % (15% near North and East perimeter)

**Winds(Eye Level)- Morning:** East 5-10 mph

**Afternoon:** West/Upslope 8-14 mph, Gusts to 20 mph.

**Evening:** West/Upslope 5-10 mph till 2400, then shifting downslope 3-5 mph till sunrise

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Large areas of unburned islands and rolling material continue to pose a threat to control lines.
- Watch weather trends throughout the day. Fire behavior has responded predictably with: **RH** ( below 30%), **Temperature** (above 85 Degrees), and **Wind Speed** (above 5 mph at Eye Level)
- Smoldering fires will have a high potential for growth in the afternoon on South facing slopes and drainage bottoms.
- Understory burning of the brush fuels has dried out the canopy above, promoting easier transition to the unburned over-story.

#### SPECIFIC:

**All Divisions: Spot fires outside established containment lines or new starts...**

**Flame Lengths-** Up to 10 ft. in Grass, Up to 20 ft. in Brush, Up to 50 ft. from the tops of torching trees.

**Rate of Spread-** Up to 100 feet/minute in Grass, Up to 150 feet/minute in Brush.

**Spotting Distances-** Up to .4 miles in Grass/Brush, Up to .3 miles from Torching Trees.

**Probability of Ignition-** Unshaded Fuels **90%** during the peak afternoon heating.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Moderately unstable conditions will aid in good smoke dispersal by 0900. Mixing heights will again rise to 5,000 AGL during peak daytime heating. Expect turbulence to increase, and winds to shift in the afternoon. Transport winds will be from the South at 10mph

**Sunset-** 8:19

**Weather will be changing late in the evening.**  
**Post LOOKOUTS in areas that can monitor changing weather conditions.**  
**Rolling material will easily ignite unburned fuels below.**

## **Slow down and drive safe!**

**Complacency:** ALL PPE must be worn, including shrouds, when working on the fire line. Mop up requires your situational awareness even without active fire. Unburnt fuels can reignite suddenly and turn against you.

**Fatigue:** Manage yourself and those around you for excessive fatigue; many have driven long distances or been redeployed from other incidents. Use the buddy system and take breaks as needed. As fatigue increase, injuries tend to increase also.

**Eat and drink fluids** on a regular basis to maintain an appropriate energy level for any expected work assignment. Remember, you are the only one that knows your limitations.

**Ensure the Communication Plan is understood and followed** (ICS 205 in your IAP).

**Hazard trees:** Survey your work areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Review and follow **Hazard Tree Safety**, pg. 22-23 in your IRPG.

**Ash Pots:** the droughts stricken fuels consumed entirely by fire are creating flat ash pots with hot coals underneath. Watch your footing.

**Aircraft:** Monitor Channel 15 Air to Ground – CDF Tac 14 at all times. Helco and Air Attack your eyes in the sky!!

**Review your ICS 206 and follow the Line Emergency procedures.**

**L**ookouts, **C**ommunication, **E**scape routes, **S**afety zones

### Safe Driving

- **SLOW down when driving on and off the line.**
- **Defensive driving always**
- **Even if the road or highway is shut down for emergency personnel only, you must drive only as safe as the conditions allow.**

### Heat Illness Prevention:

- **Drink plenty of fluids:**
  - **Water and Gatorade**
- **Avoid drinking energy drinks**
- **Rest when you can**
- **Find shade when you can**





ALL	<b>DRIVING HAZARDS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Slow Down!</b> Just because roads/highways are closed, does not give permission to drive faster than is safe.</li> <li>• Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve.</li> <li>• Drive with headlights and seatbelts on.</li> <li>• Narrow dirt roads with limited passing room. Coordinate your movements on one lane roads.</li> <li>• Use warning devices when operating near traffic.</li> </ul>
ALL	<b>HAZARD TREES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify and Isolate the area to provide for the safety of others.</li> <li>• Flag and make proper notifications.</li> <li>• Do Not Fall trees out of your certification level.</li> </ul>
ALL	<b>FATIGUE/HEAT/DEHYDRATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.</li> <li>• Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift.</li> <li>• Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system.</li> <li>• Eat small meals often and when possible.</li> <li>• Drink electrolyte drinks at a 2 water to one sport drink ratio.</li> </ul>

N	<b>WATCH OUT FOR IMPROVISED ANTI-PERSONNEL DEVICES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trip wires.</li> <li>• Pungi sticks.</li> <li>• Other dangerous devices or traps set up around marijuana growing operations.</li> </ul>
ALL	<b>WATCH FOR EXTREMEM FIRE BEHAVIOR</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know your LCES and maintain Situational Awareness.</li> <li>• Use experienced look outs.</li> <li>• Adhere to the downhill line construction guidelines.</li> <li>• Monitor weather for changes in the wind, temp, and RH. **MEDIA** - The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence.

- Nor is the Media permitted on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

**CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY, Social Media 0691** – Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore when on a CAL FIRE incident you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the Information Section.

There will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials
- No opinions
- No endorsements
- Do not post inappropriate pictures or videos
- If you are uncertain, question.

**PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT** – We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

**LOST AND FOUND** – The Information Section will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well.

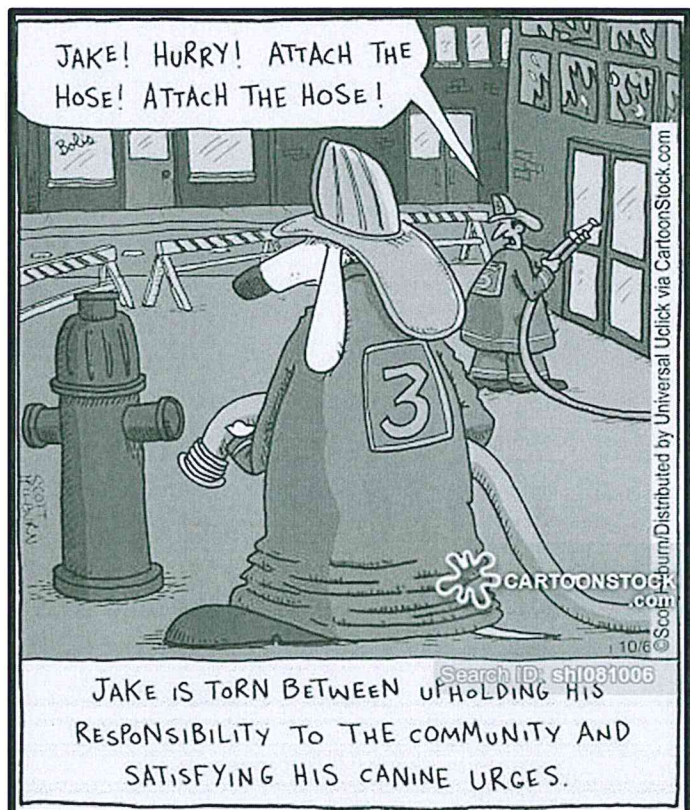

**Archaeological and Historic Properties:  
General Fire-line Guidance for the BLM Ukiah Field Office.**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties.  
When possible and prudent:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
2. Note, that much of the area has never been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

Your help preserving California's non-renewable cultural resources is appreciated.

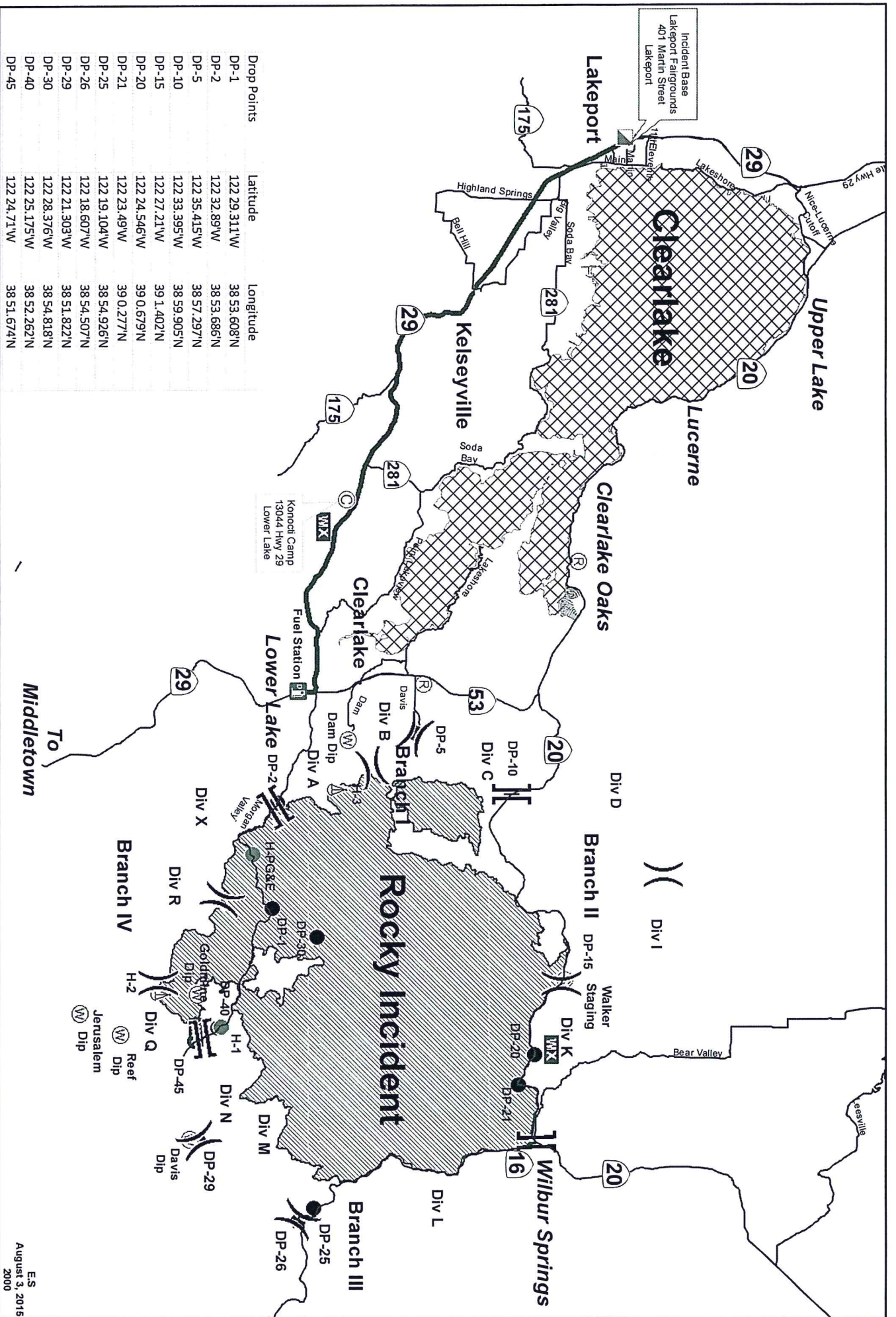

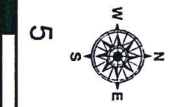

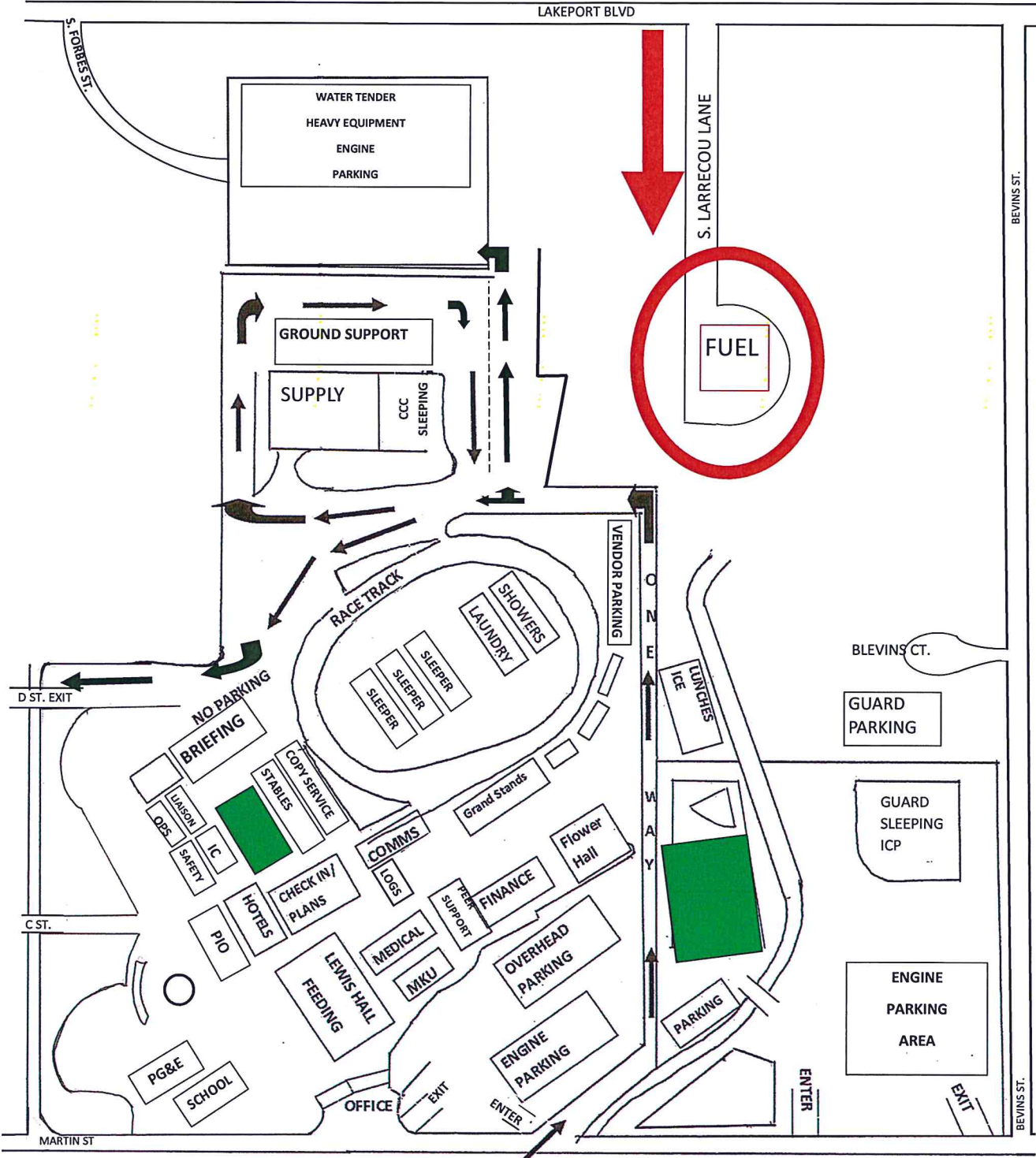
