


Lake Oroville Storage and Elevation Projection

Comments:

Dry and mild conditions are forecasted to continue for the Feather Basin into the middle of the work-week. Beginning Wednesday, widespread, light to heavy precipitation is expected to return to the region. A new series of storms, bringing periods of rain and snow, are expected to last through the weekend, along with a gradual cooling trend. Significant snowfall accumulation is expected in the Sierra. Strong, gusty winds are likely at times. A great deal of uncertainty is present for next week's forecast. The next update of this forecast will be about Tuesday, February 14, 2017, unless there are significant hydrologic changes.




