



***** RED FLAG WARNING FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITY FROM FRIDAY EVENING THROUGH SATURDAY EVENING *****

DISCUSSION: Expect continued dry weather today with warmer afternoon temperatures than we've seen in a few days. Winds are expected to be mostly slope driven mid-slope and below except for the typical diurnal south wind through the Napa Valley. Ridges will see increasing north winds. North winds are expected to increase significantly tonight, and when combined with poor humidity recoveries, will result in critical fire weather conditions. The focus of wind/dry air will be over the higher elevations, but these conditions may also occur in valleys where topography aligns with wind.

FRIDAY:

- WEATHER: Mostly sunny.
- WIND (20 FT):
 - Valley and mid-slope: Variable 1-3 mph through 1000 hrs, then upslope 2-4 mph. South 5-10 mph in the broader Napa Valley.
 - Ridges: North 5-10 mph through 1600 hrs, then north 10-15 mph.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 72-77.
- MIN RH: 15-20%
- CHANCE RAIN: 0%

FRIDAY NIGHT: RED FLAG WARNING

- WEATHER: Mostly clear. Breezy to windy over the hills.
- WIND (20 FT):
 - Valley bottom: Becoming downslope 2-5 mph. Local gusts to 25 mph mixing down into north-south oriented valleys.
 - Mid-slope: North-northeast 10-15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph – highest on north-facing slopes.
 - Ridges: Northeast 15-30 mph with gusts to 40 mph possible.
- MIN TEMPERATURES: 45-50 Valleys to 55-60 Ridges
- HUMIDITY RECOVERIES: 45-50% Valleys, 30-35% Ridges.
- CHANCE RAIN: 0%

SATURDAY: RED FLAG WARNING

- WEATHER: Mostly sunny. Warmer and very dry.
- WIND (20 FT):
 - Valley bottom: downslope 2-5 mph through 1000 hrs, then becoming upslope 3-6 mph.
 - Mid-slope: North 10-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph through 1000 hrs, then north 5-10 mph.
 - Ridges: North-northeast 15-30 mph with gusts to 40 mph possible through 1000 hrs, then diminishing to 5-15 mph.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 78-83.
- MIN RH: 10-16%
- CHANCE RAIN: 0%

3-5 Day OUTLOOK (SUN-TUE):

Sunny, warmer, and continued very dry. Light slope driven/diurnal winds.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

RED FLAG Warning for today's operational period. Expect a northeast wind to develop over the fire area by midnight. Expected wind speed is 10-15 mph, but gust could reach up to 25 mph. High winds combined with low relative humidity will sustainably influence fire growth. This wind shift will likely start pushing the ongoing fires in new directions, especially any open line on the west or south side of the incidents.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Probability of Ignition = 75-85%

Spotting Distance= 3/4 to 1.5 mile (strong winds)

Dead Fuel Moisture 3%

Live Fuel Moisture 57%

The fire is moving into heavy stands of brush with large amounts of dead fuel. Rain fall totals last winter were double the yearly average resulting in a grass crop that contains twice the amount of grass than a normal year. Energy Release Component is above the 90th percentile and at a historic high. Live fuel moisture are at critical levels and the 100 hour fuels are at historic lows. Fire history in the area various but location but a wet winter has provided an ample grass crop that will carry fire and be receptive to spotting.

SPECIFIC

Atlas

Fire growth has slowed considerably on the south and stopped completely to the west. Most of the fire expected fire activity will be concentrated in Divisions A, B, C and D. Expected fire behavior will be complete consumption of understory and brush that take advantage of slope and fuel. The fire does continue to progress down slope at a slow rate of spread but increases with slope reversal. If predicted winds surface, spotting and extreme fire behavior will be present especially in areas where wind and slope align. Situational awareness is imperative for all operations and safety zones MUST be a part of every plan. Spot fires may become established quickly and may compromise escape routes, always have a secondary escape route. Look for the fire to continue to burn toward Lake Berryessa to the east and if northeast winds surface look for the fire to burn to the west toward Sage Mt Rd. The south may be wind tested and any incomplete line will have opportunity for grown. Expected rates of spread in the grass to be 225 ch/h with flame lengths to be at 28 ft. Rates of spread in the brush will be 150 ch/h and flame lengths at 22 ft. In wind, prone areas rates of spread and flame lengths could double predicted values.

Partrick

This fire has merged with the Norrbom fire and is burning in heavier fuel with complete understory consumption. Fire activity will continue to be heavy this operational period with the fire making slope and fuel driven runs. The fire will continue to move to the east towards Dry Creek Rd and Redwood Rd. If predicted winds surface look for critical rates of spread when wind and slope align. Use lookouts and monitor the weather to be prepared for increasing winds after midnight. Under a northeast wind the fire could have a direct impact on Sonoma and situational awareness is imperative. Long range spotting under high winds may compromise escape routes, always have a secondary escape route. Expected rates of spread in the grass to be 215 ch/h with flame lengths to be at 25 ft. Rates of spread in the brush will be 140 ch/h and flame lengths at 22 ft. In wind, prone areas rates of spread and flame lengths could double predicted values.

AIR OPERATIONS

- Identify where crews are in the area before drops.
- Smoke may impair vision of crews working in the area.
- Ensure that proper communications with air resources prior to drops.

SAFETY

- Monitor the weather for increasing wind from the northeast and plan all actions in anticipation of this event.
- Firefighter and public life safety will be the top priority for all emergency responders.





ALL	FIRE AND DROUGHT WEAKENED TREES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 22). Many of the trees within the fire area and along roadways are stressed due to prolonged drought conditions and extended burn times. Be aware that trees may fall even if not impacted by the fire.
ALL	HAZARDOUS STRUCTURE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Structure Size Up (IRPG p.13) Be aware of propane tank and natural gas hazards.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch your speeds. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Follow driving plans when in base camp.







STRUCTURE DEFENSE TACTICAL ACTIONS

CHECK AND GO

"Check and Go" is a rapid evaluation to check for occupants requiring removal or rescue.
Structure Triage Category – Threatened Non-Defensible

PREP AND GO

"Prep and Go" implies that some preparation of the structure may be safely completed prior to resources leaving the area. Structure Triage Category – Threatened Non-Defensible

PREP AND DEFEND

"Prep and Defend" is a tactic used when a Safety Zone and TRA are present and adequate time exists to safely prepare a structure for defense prior to the arrival of the fire front.
Structure Triage Category – Threatened Defensible

FIRE FRONT FOLLOWING

"Fire Front Following" is a follow up tactic employed when Check and Go, Prep and Go, or Bump and Run tactics are initially used. A tactic used to come in behind the fire front.

BUMP AND RUN

"Bump and Run" is a tactic where resources typically move ahead of the fire front in the spotting zone to extinguish spot fires and hot spots, and to defend as many structures as possible.

ANCHOR AND HOLD

"Anchor and Hold" is a tactic utilizing control lines and large water streams from fixed water supplies in an attempt to stop fire spread. The goal is to extinguish structure fires, protect exposures, and reduce ember production.

TACTICAL PATROL

"Tactical Patrol" is a tactic where the key element is mobility and continuous monitoring of an assigned area.

LEVELS OF ENGAGEMENT

PACE

Implement PACE. prior to engaging in any structure protection action.

P - Primary Plan [Offense]

Is focused on fire fighter safety and mission objectives

A - Alternate Plan [Offense]

A fall back plan that closely supports the Primary Plan

C - Contingency Plan [Defense]

Focused on the firefighter's safety, move to a safety zone or temporary refuge area

E - Emergency Plan [Defense]

Firefighter survival, deployment zones, fire shelters

ALWAYS HAVE A DEPLOYMENT SITE IDENTIFIED!

DRAW-D

D - Defend – Holding actions, protecting priority areas, protect the structures, hold and improve the line

R - Reinforce – Bring more resources to bear, add resources necessary to *advance* or *defend*

A - Advance – Anchor and Flank, Direct or Indirect Attack, Active burnout operations

W - Withdraw – Cease current activities until conditions modify, Abandon an established position or constructed line in response to an increase in fire intensity, Not a stigma, but a decision to move away from a threat

D - Delay – Wait until the situation has modified sufficiently to allow a different level of engagement, Waiting for conditions to meet pre-identified triggers necessary to *advance* or *defend*, not a lack of effort, but a conscious decision to maximize long term effectiveness

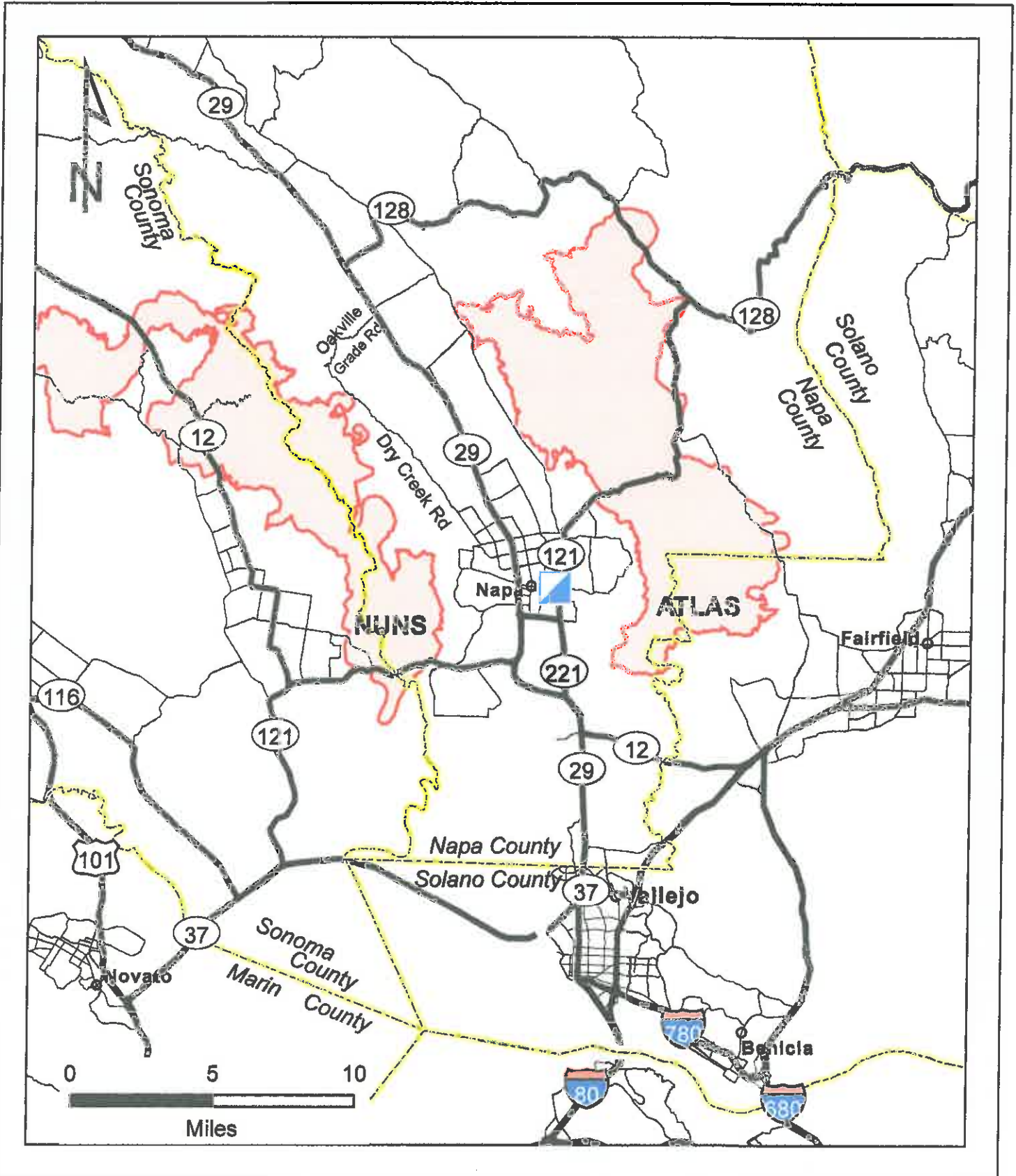

MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS:

Hydration/Nutrition/Fatigue: Drink plenty of fluids throughout the day and eat accordingly. Address dehydration and fatigue concerns immediately upon symptom onset.

Driving: Steep, narrow, dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Watch for pedestrians in and around fire perimeter, slow speeds while going through residential areas..

Hazardous Trees: Be alert of snags due to tree mortality, drought and fire exposed trees. Crews are working in a very hazardous area with numerous dead trees, stay diligent and flag hazardous areas. Avoid taking breaks under trees. Fall trees with qualified personnel only.

Maintain Situational Awareness: Be aware of what's going on around you, stay engaged, and have a contingency plan if changes occur on the fireline. Numerous fires under one command, stay diligent and communicate changes as they occur to all affected personnel.

Escape Routes/Safety Zones: Limited access/egress points make it difficult to leave hazardous areas, preplan safety zones and escape routes, be sure to pass along to personnel on the fire. Identify areas of underslung line and implement safety mitigations.

Equipment: When working around heavy equipment stay visible and above machinery. Watch for rollout and falling debris.

Aircraft: Use caution when working around or under aircraft. Have all necessary PPE on and stay away from powerlines and when aircraft are working in area. Watch for falling debris from trees when employing water dropping operations.

Rolling Rock/Debris: Utilize good spacing and post lookouts in hazardous areas.

Incident Within Incident (IWI): Review procedures on 206 at Divisional Breakouts and tailgate safety briefings. Identify what line resources are ALS and where line medics are working.


