WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RED FLAG WARNING IN EFFECT THROUGH MONDAY MORNING...

Critical north wind event continues across Northern California and over the Camp Fire. Gusty northeast winds will be strongest over the higher elevations in the morning, then dropping off slightly during the afternoon. For the lower elevations near the valley, we will see an increase of winds by the afternoon from the North-Northwest with gusts up to 25 mph. Very dry conditions continue today and for the next few days, along with poor overnight recoveries. No precipitation expected through the week.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR SUNDAY: ...GUSTY WINDS THROUGH THE DAY...

WEATHER: Sunny with heavy smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 58-70°F. **LITTLE CHANGE**

MIN HUMIDITY: 5-10%. **DOWN 10%**

20-FOOT WIND: ...INCREASING VALLEY WINDS, DECREASING FOOTHILLS THIS AFTERNOON...

SLOPE/VALLEY - Northeast 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the morning, then becoming North 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 30 mph in the afternoon.

RIDGETOP- Northeast 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 45 mph in the morning, then becoming 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the afternoon.

MIXING HEIGHT: 2000 ft AGL in the afternoon.

TRANSPORT WINDS: Northeast 20 mph.

SUNDAY NIGHT: ...NORTHEAST WINDS INCREASING AFTER 2000...

WEATHER: Clear with smoke inversion.

Expect varying windows for direct attack versus indirect, as related to flame lengths and rates of spread, based upon forecast wind and smoke coverage.

The North wind event will continue throughout the operational period, continuing to align downslope with the Feather River and Butte Creek drainages.

ERC values have been at new record highs for the entire month of November. Dead fuel moistures remain critical. Fuel conditions are more similar to late summer.

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

SPECIFIC:

Branch I, VI: Fire will have single tree torching and passive crown fire activity in timber stands when making upslope runs. Expect mostly surface fire backing and flanking into the wind. Strong winds will push more fire back into the black.

Branch II, III, X: Wind should increase from a more N/NW component, starting at 1000. Expect rapid rates of spread in grass fuels wherever torching and ember cast is seen. Flame lengths will be lower in the shorter grass near Highway 99.

Areas of tactical advantage (water features, highways), normally utilized as barriers to fire spread, may be compromised with winds via spotting, the entire shift.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate turbulence, gusty winds, and limited visibility with consumption of heavy fuels. Little to no visibility in lower elevations.

Mixing height: 2,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: NE 20 mph, Sunrise 0647, Sunset 1654.

SAFETY

Don't be fooled by a lull in the winds. Sustained, strong winds are anticipated, along with spotting.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California Geographic Area

November 9, 2018

Subject: Unseasonably dry, mild weather the past few weeks has amplified fuel dryness in all size classes across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid to dangerous rates of spread continue to occur with high potential for that to persist through the week of November 11th.

Discussion: Unseasonably mild, very dry weather in recent weeks across Northern California this fall has kept fuels very dry and been expanding drought conditions. Although reasonably plentiful rain fell across much of the Geographic Area right around the beginning of October, recent dry weather has essentially erased any fuel moisture gains from that event. Much of the time since then, a ridge of high pressure persisting out over the Pacific Ocean has mostly been keeping a very dry airmass over the Geographic Area. The weather pattern during the past 3 weeks been particularly dry with a steady series of N to E foehn wind events that have contributed significantly to fuel dryness and challenging fire control conditions. Fires have recently shown or exhibited rapid or dangerous spread rates or generate extreme fire behavior. Even some internal islands in earlier large fire perimeters (e.g. Carr Fire) have reportedly rekindled, apparently from long-held residual heat. It is not just windy areas that have experienced rapid spread, but some fuel-and-slope-driven fires have also seen unseasonable, very active fire behavior.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California normally sees enough precipitation by late October to bring about fire season-ending conditions. Early October's precipitation did mitigate fire danger for a bit, but unseasonably dry weather since then and several significant foehn wind events the past few weeks have created very dry fuel conditions much later into the fall season than usual. Very low daily afternoon minimum relative humidity (RH) values of 5-12% have been common, and recent wind events have limited overnight RH recovery to less than 25% in many locations and to less than 15% in some. This has had a dramatic effect on fuel dryness and fire danger indices which are now either near seasonal record values or at core fire season severity levels. Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- One hour fine fuel loading across the Geographic Area remains well above normal.
- Firefighters should be prepared for potential extreme fire behavior and dangerous or otherwise rapid rates of spread at any time of day, especially during foehn wind events.
- The potential for extreme fire activity will be likely to continue until enough precipitation occurs to significantly increase fuel moisture.
- Rapid rates of spread could have a significant impact on public safety and make evacuations difficult.

Mitigation Measures:

- All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions.
- Employ LCES principles (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety zones).
- Review current fire potential products from Predictive Services at <https://gacc.nifc.gov/oncc/predictive/weather/index.htm> or potential Red Flag conditions from the National Weather Service at Weather at <https://www.wrh.noaa.gov/fire2/cafw/>.

Area of Concern: Most areas across Northern California could see active fire behavior, but the most severe conditions are in the Sacramento Valley and surrounding foothills, the western slopes of Cascade and Northern Sierra Nevada mountains, and Mendocino County southward, including all of the Bay Area. The PSA numbers associated with those areas are NC03A, NC03B, NC05 and NC07.

Watch out

- Power lines may be hidden
- Underground services may be exposed and/or damaged

- Visually check power poles to identify service lines leading to underground service
- Treat all electrical panels and power lines as if they are charged
- Make contact and communicate with utility workers working in your area.

GENERAL ILLNESS

FATIGUE and ARDUOUS WORK PUTS US AT RISK

Watch Out

- **Dehydration** and heat exhaustion and serious medical emergencies
- **Arduous work** increases core temperature, weakens the body's ability to function healthy and causes fatigue
- **Fatigue** Causes poor judgement and decreased work performance affecting safety

Mitigation

- Proper nutrition, rest and hydration reduces fatigue and exhaustion emergencies
- Drink plenty of water and eat right– START EARLY – reduce caffeine input
- Take breaks throughout the work-period and take measures to cool down

TOPOGRAPHY

TOUGH COUNTRY TO WORK IN

Watch Out

- Steep slopes may cause rolling material hazards
- This terrain will cause quick, unexpected upslope fire behavior
- Significant slip hazard exists throughout the incident

Mitigation

- Post lookouts and monitor changes in fire behavior
- Watch out in areas with steep slopes, watch your footing and drive appropriately
- Look and Listen for rolling rocks and boulders and 'call out' to others around you

Archaeological and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Camp Incident, Butte County CA

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible and prudent:

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric archaeological sites. These sites may include seasonal camps marked by the presence of obsidian and/or basalt flakes, bedrock mortar food processing sites, and village sites that contain the above and dark midden soils. The Native American group living in the area at time of historic contact was the Maidu.
2. Be on the lookout for historic archaeological sites. These sites may include old homesteads now marked by the presence of foundations, wells, and can dumps, early sawmill sites, abandoned ditches, mining tailings, and other mining features including adits (horizontal) and shafts (vertical).
3. Look for these prehistoric and historic sites in flat areas, especially adjacent to streams and springs.
4. Known sites will be marked with red/white striped plastic flagging tape.
5. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites attempt to avoid if possible. If you can't avoid, minimize ground disturbance as much as possible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth as necessary. Try to go around sites with dozers rather than through them. Flag new sites in red/white if possible.
6. If you find artifacts leave them in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
7. Note locations of discovered artifacts, features, and/or sites on a map. Better yet take a GPS reading if possible. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Situation Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair.
8. If you encounter a burial site cease work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

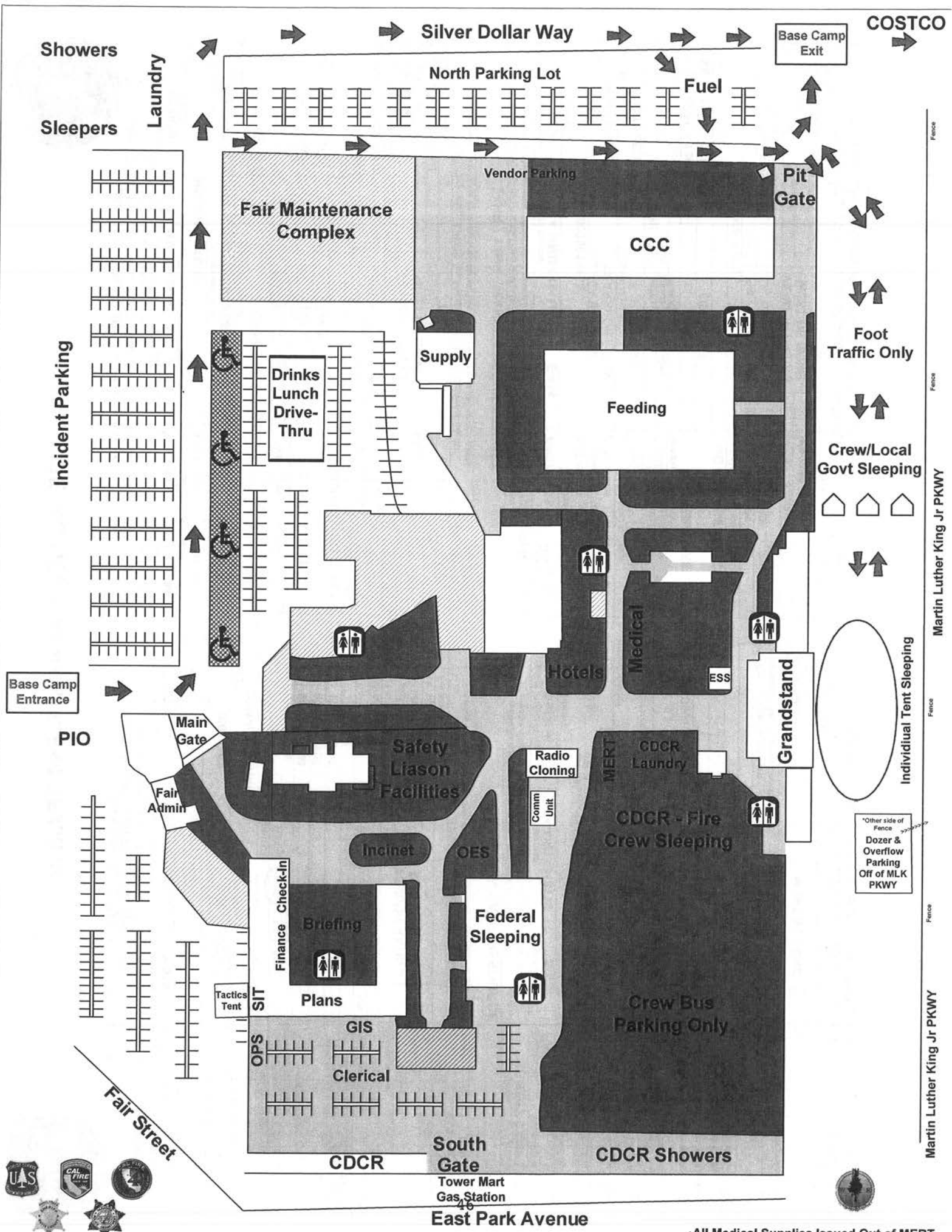
