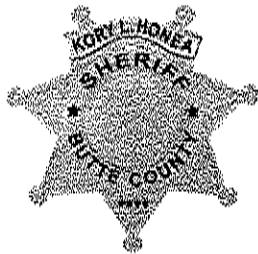





**WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...FIRE WEATHER WATCH SATURDAY EVENING - SUNDAY EVENING...**

The pattern will largely remain the same through the short-term with northeast winds each night and morning, switching to a light upslope/upvalley wind each afternoon. Local variations in weather conditions are expected based on elevation and aspect. Also in play is the thermal belt, which will largely stay around 1500-2500 feet in elevation. Beginning Saturday evening and continuing through Sunday evening, gusty northeast winds will return across the fire area foothills with winds 15-25 with gusts to 40 mph. Peak winds will occur Sunday morning. A Fire Weather Watch has been issued for this period.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY: ...GENERALLY LIGHT WINDS...**

**WEATHER:** A few high clouds with heavy smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 55-65°F **LITTLE CHANGE**

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 30-40% in the valleys, 15-25% along the thermal belt and higher.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Light, downvalley/downdrainage winds in the morning, becoming upslope/updrainage 3 to 5 mph in the afternoon.

**RIDGETOP-** Northeast 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the morning, then becoming upslope/upvalley 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph after noon.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** 1200 ft AGL in the afternoon

**TRANSPORT WINDS:** Light winds

**TONIGHT: ...GENERALLY LIGHT NORTHEAST WINDS AFTER 2000...**

**WEATHER:** A few clouds with smoke inversion.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 45-55°F....near 36 degrees in Chico. **LITTLE CHANGE**

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 45-55% in the valleys, 15-25% along the thermal belt and higher.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Downslope/downdrainage 2-6 mph. Except 10-15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph, along the Feather River drainage and other NE-SW aligned valleys.

**RIDGETOP** - Northeast 10-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph.

**EXTENDED FORECAST: ... POOR OVERNIGHT RECOVERIES, THERMAL BELT AND ABOVE...**

**FRIDAY - SATURDAY:** Partly cloudy. Max temps...55-65°F. Min RH 15-25%. Light updrainage winds during the afternoon. Northeast 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph overnight and into the morning hours along the ridgelines and through NE-SW aligned drainages.

**SATURDAY EVENING - SUNDAY EVENING:** A Fire Weather Watch has been issued for the Saturday evening through Sunday evening period. Winds out of the NE will pick up across the fire, peaking in the morning. Winds will become 15-25 with gusts to 40 mph.

## OUTPUTS

### GENERAL:

**\*\*Thermal Belt ~1,500-2,500' Overnight\*\***

Expect varying windows for line construction and firing, based on thermal belt and smoke cover. During daytime upslope/up canyon winds, expect mostly backing fire, with upslope runs with slope reversal. Winds will be Northeast overnight, continuing to align downslope with the Feather River and Butte Creek drainages. Spotting will continue to present a concern, especially after 2200 hours. Gusty North/Northeast winds return Saturday night-Sunday.

ERC values continue to set new record highs for the entire month of November. Dead fuel moistures remain critical. Fuel conditions are more similar to late summer. It has been 215 days since the lower elevations last received 0.5" of precipitation. Areas with most activity last four shifts have no recorded fire history: south of Goat Point (DIV E), east of Feather River (DIV CC / MM), and north of Paradise (DIV N/U).

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

### SPECIFIC:

Branch I, VI, X: Mostly understory burn backing downslope; greatest activity 1000-1700, and after 2000 with NE wind. Clearcuts and thinned areas will exhibit lower rates of spread, but are highly susceptible to spotting and long burnout duration. Thermal belt above ~1,500-2,500'; watch for spotting, especially with firing operations.

Branch II, III, XI: Minimal fire activity observed last two shifts. Lower POI due to shading from smoke. Greatest potential for activity from 1200-1700 below 1,500-2,500 feet. Areas above thermal belt will increase in spotting and fire behavior with influence of overnight winds.

Areas of tactical advantage (water features, highways), normally utilized as barriers to fire spread, continue to be compromised with winds via spotting, during the entire shift. The fire has crossed a 300-foot span of Lake Oroville 3 times.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Poor visibility at higher elevations; little to no visibility in lower elevations. Heavy fuel consumption will continue to hinder operations with turbulence and smoke inversion.

Mixing height: 1,200 ft. AGL, Transport winds: stagnant, Sunrise 0652, Sunset 1650.

## SAFETY

Short intense fire runs are possible. Make sure you know where your safety zone is at and the time it takes to get there.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California Geographic Area

November 9, 2018

**Subject:** Unseasonably dry, mild weather the past few weeks has amplified fuel dryness in all size classes across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid to dangerous rates of spread continue to occur with high potential for that to persist through the week of November 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Discussion:** Unseasonably mild, very dry weather in recent weeks across Northern California this fall has kept fuels very dry and been expanding drought conditions. Although reasonably plentiful rain fell across much of the Geographic Area right around the beginning of October, recent dry weather has essentially erased any fuel moisture gains from that event. Much of the time since then, a ridge of high pressure persisting out over the Pacific Ocean has mostly been keeping a very dry airmass over the Geographic Area. The weather pattern during the past 3 weeks has been particularly dry with a steady series of N to E foehn wind events that have contributed significantly to fuel dryness and challenging fire control conditions. Fires have recently shown or exhibited rapid or dangerous spread rates or generate extreme fire behavior. Even some internal islands in earlier large fire perimeters (e.g. Carr Fire) have reportedly rekindled, apparently from long-held residual heat. It is not just windy areas that have experienced rapid spread, but some fuel-and-slope-driven fires have also seen unseasonable, very active fire behavior.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California normally sees enough precipitation by late October to bring about fire season-ending conditions. Early October's precipitation did mitigate fire danger for a bit, but unseasonably dry weather since then and several significant foehn wind events the past few weeks have created very dry fuel conditions much later into the fall season than usual. Very low daily afternoon minimum relative humidity (RH) values of 5-12% have been common, and recent wind events have limited overnight RH recovery to less than 25% in many locations and to less than 15% in some. This has had a dramatic effect on fuel dryness and fire danger indices which are now either near seasonal record values or at core fire season severity levels. ### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- One hour fine fuel loading across the Geographic Area remains well above normal.
- Firefighters should be prepared for potential extreme fire behavior and dangerous or otherwise rapid rates of spread at any time of day, especially during foehn wind events.
- The potential for extreme fire activity will be likely to continue until enough precipitation occurs to significantly increase fuel moisture.
- Rapid rates of spread could have a significant impact on public safety and make evacuations difficult.

### Mitigation Measures:

- All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions.
- Employ LCES principles (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety zones).
- Review current fire potential products from Predictive Services at <https://gacc.nifc.gov/oncc/predictive/weather/index.htm> or potential Red Flag conditions from the National Weather Service at Weather at <https://www.wrh.noaa.gov/fire2/cafw/>.

**Area of Concern:** Most areas across Northern California could see active fire behavior, but the most severe conditions are in the Sacramento Valley and surrounding foothills, the western slopes of Cascade and Northern Sierra Nevada mountains, and Mendocino County southward, including all of the Bay Area. The PSA numbers associated with those areas are NC03A, NC03B, NC05 and NC07.

- All personnel who have not received a briefing shall notify their direct supervisor
- Supervisors will engage their personnel in an active briefing

- Loose soil, Rolling logs, rolling rocks
- Poor footing
- Be aware of dozers and other equipment working above you

##### Mitigation

- Walk your line and identify the hazardous locations on your division and communicate to your personnel and adjoining divisions and agencies
- Reduce the number of personnel on a steep slope to the minimum required to complete the mission.
- Assess whether missions on a steep slopes are necessary to meet Incident objectives.

## CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post:** Inappropriate information, inappropriate pictures or videos, Opinions regarding the incident or policy, Endorsements of any kind.

## FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

### **Think before you post:**

- On official time, do official duties; if using government equipment, do government business.
- Don't use your official position/title for private gain.
- Do not share government information that is publically available (such as links to Inciweb, weather reports, feature stories, official evacuation notices etc...) Do not disclose (via any medium) non-public information to further private interests or the private interests of others.
- Do not share information outside official channels that could be associated with a crime or a claim, (for instance do not post on social media about serious accidents, deaths or destroyed property).
- Do not accept compensation for statements made over social media that relate to official duties.
- Never use your official title while engaging in "political activity" (activity directed toward the success or failure of a political party, partisan candidate or partisan political group).
- Federal employees may express their opinions concerning partisan political candidates and political parties on social media when they are off duty and away from the federal workplace.
- If you have questions about content you'd like to post on social media, contact a PIO, they can help you.

## CITIZENS IN THE AREA

As citizens start to repopulate into the affected areas we would like to remind you that you are a great asset and resource ambassador of the fire service. As you come into contact with the citizens please treat the citizens as if they were the citizens of your own community.

These citizens just went through a very tragic incident. Please help curb aggressive media away from citizens who may not want to be interviewed or allowed on their private property.

## PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

## MEDIA

California State Penal Code Section 409.5(g) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

## Archaeological and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Camp Incident, Butte County CA

*Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible and prudent:*

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric archaeological sites. These sites may include seasonal camps marked by the presence of obsidian and/or basalt flakes, bedrock mortar food processing sites, and village sites that contain the above and dark midden soils. The Native American group living in the area at time of historic contact was the Maidu.
2. Be on the lookout for historic archaeological sites. These sites may include old homesteads now marked by the presence of foundations, wells, and can dumps, early sawmill sites, abandoned ditches, mining tailings, and other mining features including adits (horizontal) and shafts (vertical).
3. Look for these prehistoric and historic sites in flat areas, especially adjacent to streams and springs.
4. Known sites will be marked with red/white or red/black striped plastic flagging tape.
5. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites attempt to avoid if possible. If you can't avoid, minimize ground disturbance as much as possible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth as necessary. Try to go around sites with dozers rather than through them. Flag new sites if possible.
6. If you find artifacts leave them in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
7. Note locations of discovered artifacts, features, and/or sites on a map. Better yet take a GPS reading if possible. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Situation Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair.
8. If you encounter a burial site cease work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

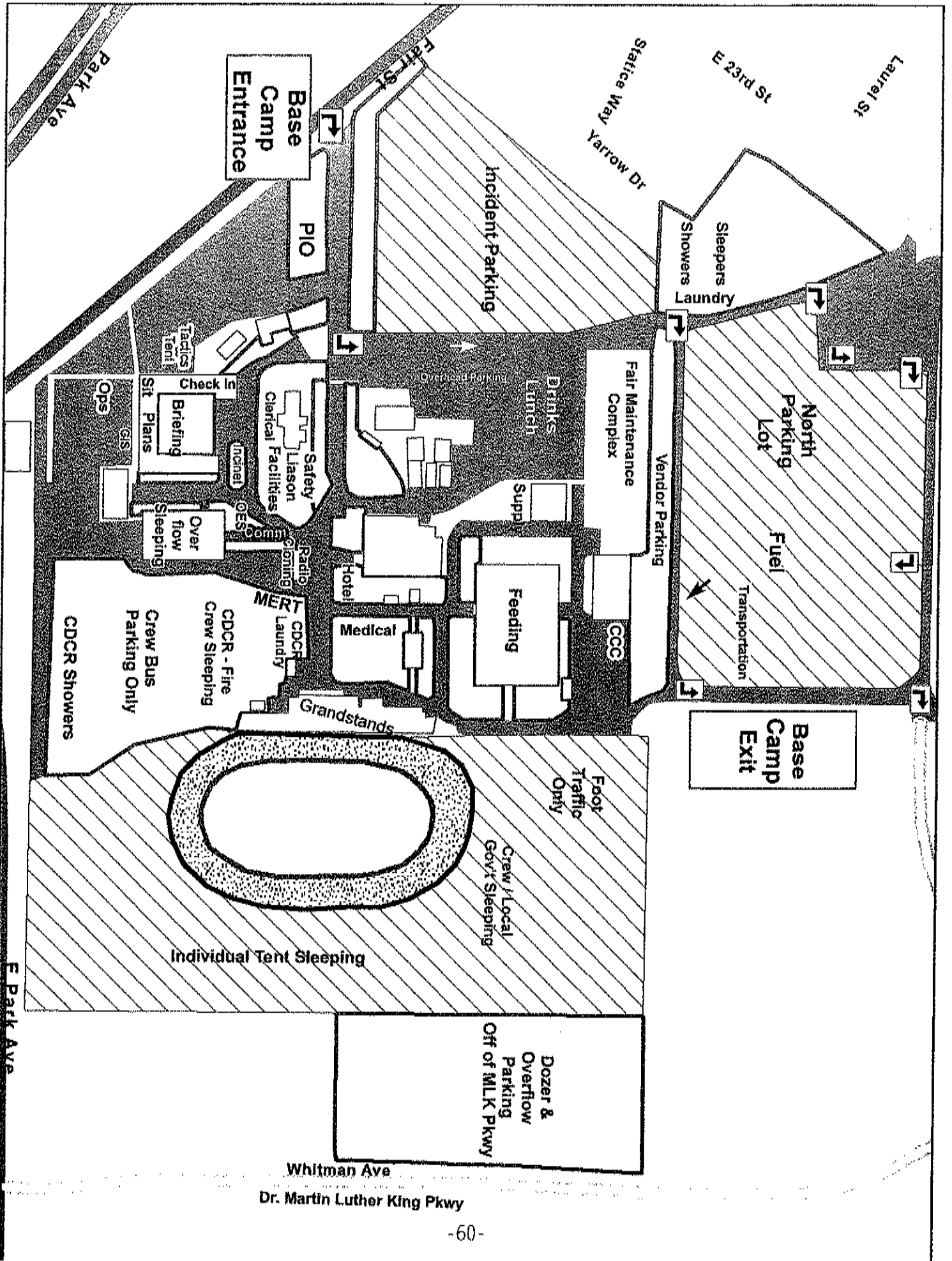

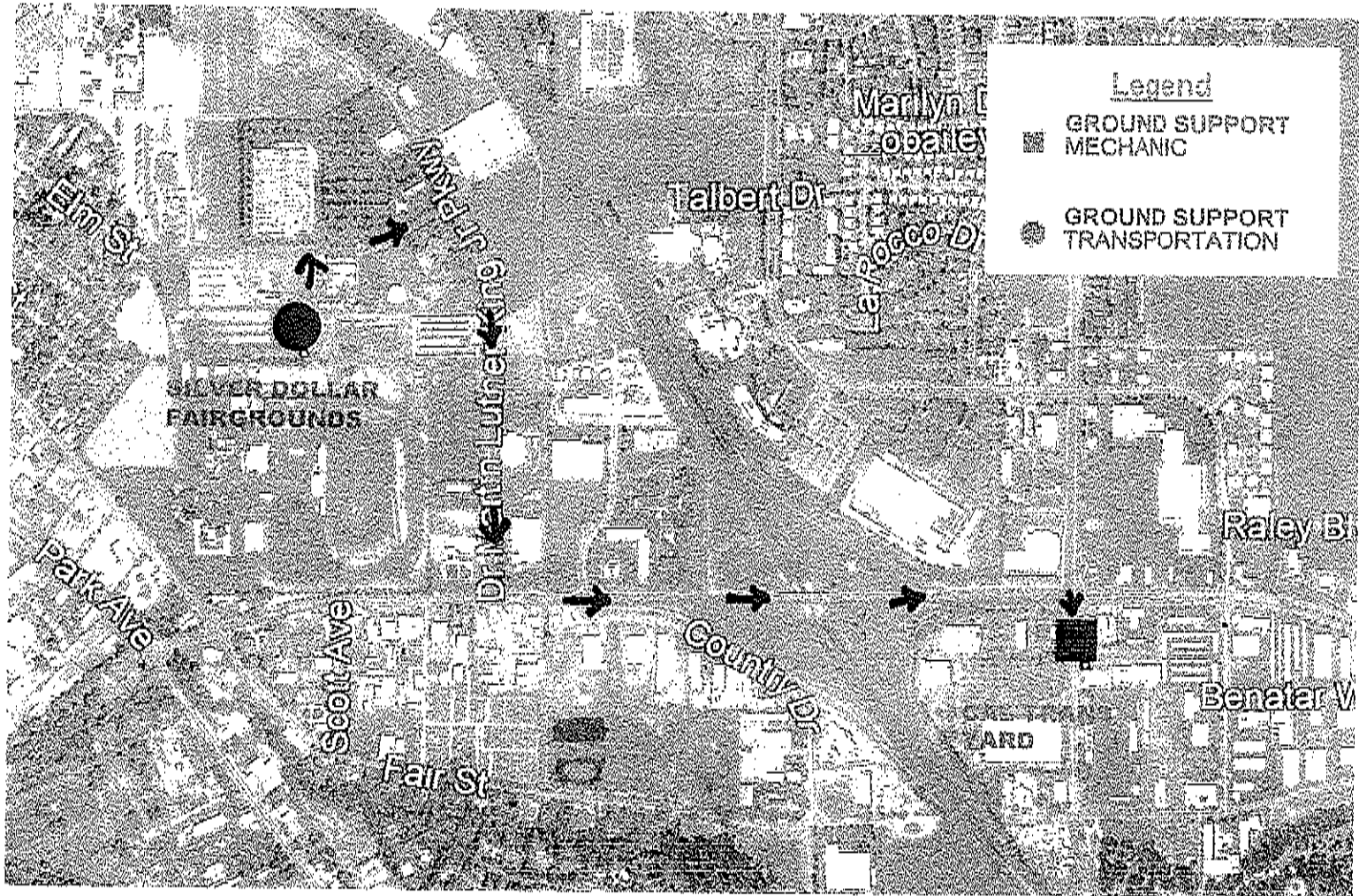
