

WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RED FLAG WARNING TONIGHT THROUGH SUNDAY AFTERNOON...

Critical fire weather conditions will ramp up later tonight through Sunday afternoon. During the day, generally light winds are forecast, with the exception of breezy downcanyon winds in the Feather River this morning. Heavy smoke will remain over the fire area today with poor visibilities. Starting this evening after 1800, winds will begin to increase from the northeast. Peak gusts up to 50 mph will be after midnight and through 1000 Sunday morning, especially over upper-slopes, ridges, and aligned drainages including the Feather River Canyon. Dry conditions with humidity around 15-25% will accompany the critical winds. Lighter winds are expected Monday and Tuesday, then rain will likely to move into the region Wednesday and again Thursday night into Friday as the ridge breaks down over California.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY: ... LIGHT SLOPE WINDS DURING THE DAY...

WEATHER: A few high clouds with heavy smoke through the day.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 60-68°F LITTLE CHANGE

MIN HUMIDITY: 30-40% in the valleys/drainages 15-25% along the thermal belt and higher.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light, downdrainage winds in the morning, becoming upslope/updrainage 2 to 5 mph in the afternoon.

RIDGETOP- Northeast 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the morning, then becoming upslope/upvalley 5 to 10 mph afternoon.

MIXING HEIGHT: 1500 ft AGL in the afternoon

TRANSPORT WINDS: West 5 mph.

TONIGHT: ... WINDY TONIGHT IN THE MOUNTAINS...

WEATHER: Windy with smoke. Lighter winds along the HWY 99 corridor

RIDGETOP - Northeast 20-25 mph with gusts up to 50 mph.

SUNDAY: Red Flag Warning remains in effect through Sunday 1600. Strong Northeast Winds 15-25 mph with gusts up to 50 mph. Strongest winds will peak in the morning around Humidity around 15-25%. Temperatures in the 60s.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

FUELS ARE BEYOND SEASONAL PEAK DRYNESS YOU WOULD EXPECT IN SEPTEMBER. ENERGY RELEASE COMPONENT OF THE NATIONAL FIRE DANGER RATING SYSTEM HAS SET NEW RECORDS FOR THE AREA EVERY DAY OF THE FIRE SO FAR. THE LOWER ELEVATIONS HAVE BEEN 215 DAYS WITH A STORM THAT DELIVERED OVER ½" OF RAIN. LIVE FUEL MOISTURES IN MANZANITA ARE 74% (80 IS CONSIDERED CRITICAL). HEAVY SMOKE WILL SHADE FUELS EARLY. 100 HR FUELS 9%. 1000 HR FUELS 8%. SPOTTING HAS BEEN A MAJOR MEANS OF FIRE SPREAD DURING STRONG WINDS. SPOTTING DISTANCES UP TO ½ MILE. PROBABILITY OF IGNITION.

SPECIFIC:

BRANCH I

INCREASING WINDS AFTER 1600 WILL IGNITE SMOLDERING MATERIAL AND CAUSE EMBER TRAVEL UP TO ½ MILE. TACTICAL PATROL WILL BE IMPROTANT TO PREVENT FURTHER LOSS.

BRANCH II AND III

NO MOVEMENT ANTICIPATED.

BRANCH VI

EARLY FIRE ACTIVITY WILL BE TOPOGRAPHY DRIVEN WITH UPHILL AND SOUTH ASPECTS BEING RISK FOR SPOTTING AND SPREAD. AFTER 1600 WIND WILL MOSTLY BE IN FAVOR FOR BURNING AND HOLDING.

BRANCH X

EARLY FIRE BEHAVIOR WILL BE SMOLDERING AND CREEPING IN HEAVY FUELS. AFTER 1600 FIRE WILL BE FLANKING WITH DOWNWIND RUNS POSSIBLE IF FINGERS OR POCKETS ARE EXPOSED TO NORTHEASTERLY WINDS. FLAME LENGTHS AND SPREAD RATES WILL BE LESS SEVERE THAN

BRANCH XI

MAJOR CONCERN IS BIG BEND. THE BIG BEND MOUNTAIN ITSELF WILL BE AN OBSTRUCTION TO THE WIND FLOW AS THE NORTHEAST WINDS SURFACE AFTER 1800. BUT THAT OBSTRUCTION IN THE FLOW WILL RESULT IN EDDY CURRENTS AND TURBULENT FLOW AT THE LAKE LEVEL. SOME AREAS WILL BE CALM AND A SHORT DISTANCE AWAY WINDS WILL BE STRONG. SPOTTING HAZARD WILL BE HIGH IN TURBULENT AREAS. A SPOT ACROSS THE LAKE WILL ARRIVE IN BERRY CREEK WITHIN AN HOUR OR LESS.

AIR OPERATIONS:

HEAVY SMOKE MORNING AND AFTERNOON. ANY CLEARING WILL BE AFTER CUTOFF AT LOWER LEVELS. MORNING AIR WILL LIKELY BE BUMPY AS WINDS WILL BE PEAKING AT SUNRISE.

SAFETY

- RETURN OF WIND DRIVEN FIRE BEHAVIOR WILL MAKE RAPID SPREAD IN ALL FUELS POSSIBLE. SHORTER ESCAPE TIMES TO LARGER SAFETY ZONES WILL BE REQUIRED. TEMPORARY REFUGE AREAS WILL NEED TO BE IDENTIFIED IN ADVANCE AND FLAGGED.
- SMOKE COVERED TERRAIN GIVES LOOKOUTS LESS TIME TO SOUND THE WARNING TO ESCAPE.
- STRONG WINDS MAY BRING DOWN FIRE WEAKENED TIMBER ALL OVER THE FIRE AREA

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California Geographic Area

November 9, 2018

Subject: Unseasonably dry, mild weather the past few weeks has amplified fuel dryness in all size classes across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid to dangerous rates of spread continue to occur with high potential for that to persist through the week of November 11th.

Discussion: Unseasonably mild, very dry weather in recent weeks across Northern California this fall has kept fuels very dry and been expanding drought conditions. Although reasonably plentiful rain fell across much of the Geographic Area right around the beginning of October, recent dry weather has essentially erased any fuel moisture gains from that event. Much of the time since then, a ridge of high pressure persisting out over the Pacific Ocean has mostly been keeping a very dry airmass over the Geographic Area. The weather pattern during the past 3 weeks been particularly dry with a steady series of N to E foehn wind events that have contributed significantly to fuel dryness and challenging fire control conditions. Fires have recently shown or exhibited rapid or dangerous spread rates or generate extreme fire behavior. Even some internal islands in earlier large fire perimeters (e.g. Carr Fire) have reportedly rekindled, apparently from long-held residual heat. It is not just windy areas that have experienced rapid spread, but some fuel-and-slope-driven fires have also seen unseasonable, very active fire behavior.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California normally sees enough precipitation by late October to bring about fire season-ending conditions. Early October's precipitation did mitigate fire danger for a bit, but unseasonably dry weather since then and several significant foehn wind events the past few weeks have created very dry fuel conditions much later into the fall season than usual. Very low daily afternoon minimum relative humidity (RH) values of 5-12% have been common, and recent wind events have limited overnight RH recovery to less than 25% in many locations and to less than 15% in some. This has had a dramatic effect on fuel dryness and fire danger indices which are now either near seasonal record values or at core fire season severity levels. Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- One hour fine fuel loading across the Geographic Area remains well above normal.
- Firefighters should be prepared for potential extreme fire behavior and dangerous or otherwise rapid rates of spread at any time of day, especially during foehn wind events.
- The potential for extreme fire activity will be likely to continue until enough precipitation occurs to significantly increase fuel moisture.
- Rapid rates of spread could have a significant impact on public safety and make evacuations difficult.


Mitigation Measures:

- All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions.
- Employ LCES principles (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety zones).
- Review current fire potential products from Predictive Services at <https://qacc.nifc.gov/oncc/predictive/weather/index.htm> or potential Red Flag conditions from the National Weather Service at Weather at <https://www.wrh.noaa.gov/fire2/cafw/>.

Area of Concern: Most areas across Northern California could see active fire behavior, but the most severe conditions are in the Sacramento Valley and surrounding foothills, the western slopes of Cascade and Northern Sierra Nevada mountains, and Mendocino County southward, including all of the Bay Area. The PSA numbers associated with those areas are NC03A, NC03B, NC05 and NC07.

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post:** Inappropriate information, inappropriate pictures or videos, Opinions regarding the incident or policy, Endorsements of any kind.

FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

Think before you post:

- On official time, do official duties; if using government equipment, do government business.
- Don't use your official position/title for private gain.
- Do share government information that is publically available (such as links to Inciweb, weather reports, feature stories, official evacuation notices etc...) Do not disclose (via any medium) non-public information to further private interests or the private interests of others.
- Do not share information outside official channels that could be associated with a crime or a claim, (for instance do not post on social media about serious accidents, deaths or destroyed property).
- Do not accept compensation for statements made over social media that relate to official duties.
- Never use your official title while engaging in "political activity" (activity directed toward the success or failure of a political party, partisan candidate or partisan political group).
- Federal employees may express their opinions concerning partisan political candidates and political parties on social media when they are off duty and away from the federal workplace.
- If you have questions about content you'd like to post on social media, contact a PIO, they can help you.

CITIZENS IN THE AREA

As citizens start to repopulate into the affected areas we would like to remind you that you are a great asset and resource ambassador of the fire service. As you come into contact with the citizens please treat the citizens as if they were the citizens of your own community.

These citizens just went through a very tragic incident. Please help curb aggressive media away from citizens who may not want to be interviewed or allowed on their private property.

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

MEDIA

California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

Archaeological and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Camp Incident, Butte County CA

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible and prudent:

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric archaeological sites. These sites may include seasonal camps marked by the presence of obsidian and/or basalt flakes, bedrock mortar food processing sites, and village sites that contain the above and dark midden soils. The Native American group living in the area at time of historic contact was the Maidu.
2. Be on the lookout for historic archaeological sites. These sites may include old homesteads now marked by the presence of foundations, wells, and can dumps, early sawmill sites, abandoned ditches, mining tailings, and other mining features including adits (horizontal) and shafts (vertical).
3. Look for these prehistoric and historic sites in flat areas, especially adjacent to streams and springs.
4. Known sites will be marked with red/white or red/black striped plastic flagging tape.
5. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites attempt to avoid if possible. If you can't avoid, minimize ground disturbance as much as possible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth as necessary. Try to go around sites with dozers rather than through them. Flag new sites if possible.
6. If you find artifacts leave them in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
7. Note locations of discovered artifacts, features, and/or sites on a map. Better yet take a GPS reading if possible. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Situation Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair.
8. If you encounter a burial site cease work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

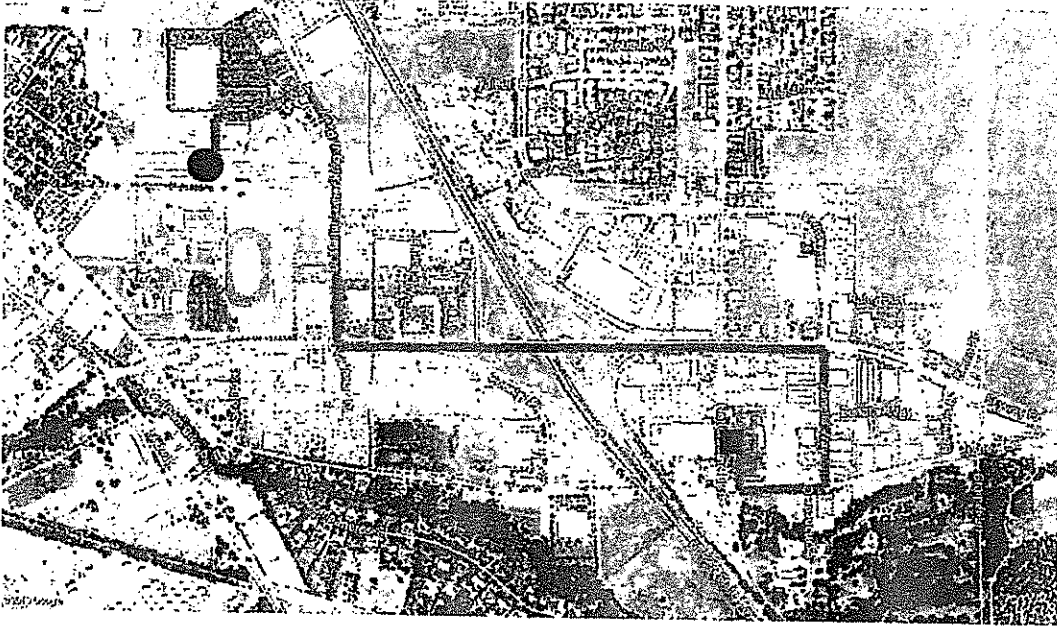

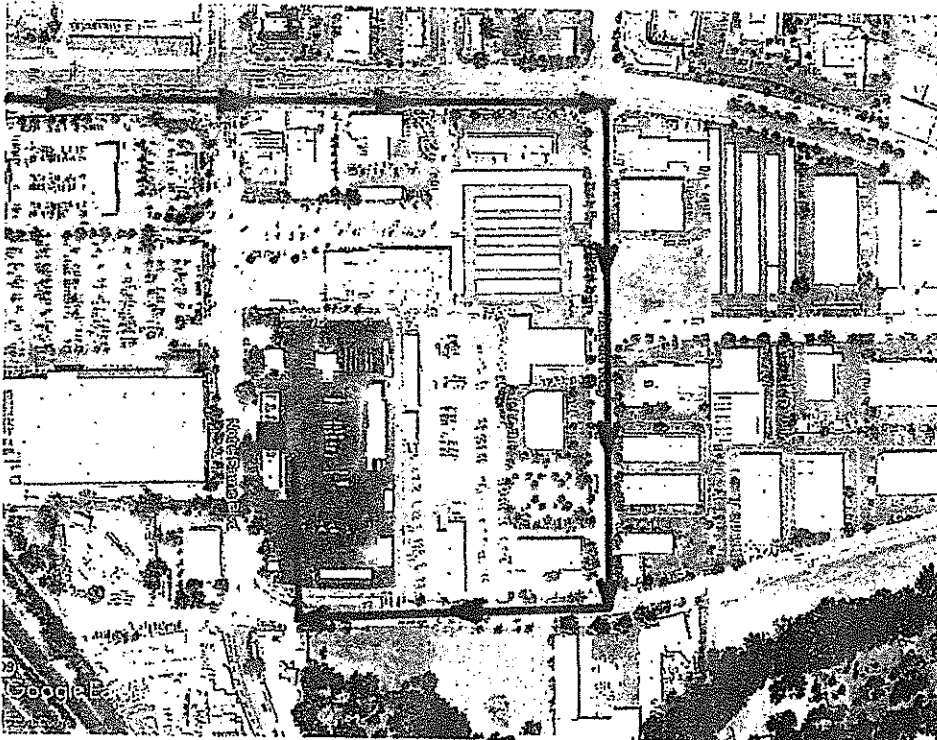
DRIVING ROUTE

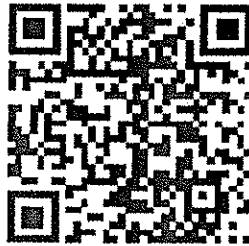
