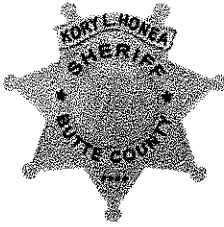



**WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RAIN BEGINS WEDNESDAY AND CONTINUES THROUGH FRIDAY...**

Breezy northeast winds this morning will taper off as the morning progresses, finally switching to an upslope/updrainage flow by 1300. Little mixing during the day and increased smoke activity will lower visibilities over the course of the day, with the best air expected over Branches VI, I,X,XI over the morning hours. Winds become northeast again after 2000. Even lighter winds are expected Tuesday before rain moves into the region Wednesday and again Thursday night into Friday as the ridge breaks down over California. Several inches of rain are expected over the 3-day period.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY: ... WINDY IN THE MOUNTAINS, DECREASING AFTER 1000...**

**WEATHER:** A few high clouds with heavy smoke through the day.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 55-65°F LITTLE CHANGE

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 20-30%. LITTLE CHANGE

**20-FOOT WIND:** ...BREEZY MORNING WINDS...

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Winds in the morning from the northeast 5-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph. Up to 30 mph along the Feather River drainage and other NE-SW aligned valleys. Lighter winds down near Chico and Oroville. Winds decrease and become light upslope/updrainage by 1300.

**RIDGETOP -** Northeast 10-15 mph with gusts up to 30 mph. Winds decrease and become 5-10 mph upslope/updrainage around 1300.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** 1500 ft AGL in the afternoon      **TRANSPORT WINDS:** West to southwest 5-10 mph.

**TONIGHT: ...NORTHEAST WINDS OVERNIGHT...**

**WEATHER:** Breezy with smoke.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 35-45°F LITTLE CHANGE

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 25-35% LITTLE CHANGE

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Winds increasing from the Northeast 5-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph after 2000 along the Feather River drainage and other NE-SW aligned valleys. Lighter winds down near Chico and Oroville.

**RIDGETOP -** Northeast 5-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph.

**EXTENDED FORECAST: ...RAIN WEDNESDAY AND AGAIN THURSDAY NIGHT/FRIDAY...**

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY:

MORE MODERATE HUMIDITY AND LESS WIND. STILL BREEZY AT NIGHT. SEE IMET FORECAST.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

FUEL DRYNESS IS TYPICAL OF LATE SUMMER. ENERGY RELEASE COMPONENT OF THE NATIONAL FIRE DANGER RATING SYSTEM FINALLY TRENDING DOWNWARD. THE LOWER ELEVATIONS HAVE BEEN 217 DAYS WITHOUT A STORM THAT DELIVERED OVER 1/2" OF RAIN. LIVE FUEL MOISTURES IN MANZANITA ARE 74% (80 IS CONSIDERED CRITICAL). 100 HR FUELS 5%. 1000 HR FUELS 7%. SPOTTING DISTANCES UP TO 0.1 MILE. PROBABILITY OF IGNITION 32%, HIGHER IN DIRECT SUN. CONSIDERABLE REBURN POTENTIAL IN INTACT CANOPY IN BRUSH AND TIMBER.

#### SPECIFIC:

##### BRANCH I

SMOLDERING MATERIAL COULD IGNITE UNBURNED TREES AND CAUSE EMBER TRAVEL UP TO 1/10 MILE. TACTICAL PATROL WILL BE IMPORTANT TO PREVENT FURTHER DAMAGE.

##### BRANCH II AND III

NO MOVEMENT ANTICIPATED. SMOLDERING FUELS ARE A HAZARD TO IGNITE SCORCHED CANOPY AND REBURN.

##### BRANCH VI

SPOTTING POTENTIAL ACROSS FROM GRIZZLY CREEK. EXPECT BACKING FIRE SPREAD.

##### BRANCH X

IF A SPOT CROSSES GRIZZLY CREEK A HIGH INTENSITY UPSLOPE RUN WILL TAKE ABOUT 4-8 HOURS TO GET TO THE TOP OF GRIZZLY DOME. DAYTIME CONDITIONS WILL BE FAVORABLE FOR FIRING.

##### BRANCH XI

SPOTTING HAZARD WILL BE HIGH IN SHARP BENDS OF THE FEATHER RIVER. A SPOT ACROSS THE LAKE WILL ARRIVE IN BERRY CREEK WITHIN A FEW HOURS.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

SMOKE DECREASES VISIBILITY MOST OF THE DAY.

## SAFETY

- FIRE WEAKENED TIMBER ALL OVER THE FIRE AREA IS A SAFETY HAZARD. DON'T TAKE BREAKS OR EAT LUNCH WITHOUT LOOKING UP FIRST.
- REBURN COULD MAKE SEEMINGLY VIABLE SAFETY ZONES UNTENABLE.
- ROCKS CAN BE DISLODGED BY FIRE ON STEEP SLOPES. POST A LOOKOUT FOR THIS.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California Geographic Area

November 9, 2018

**Subject:** Unseasonably dry, mild weather the past few weeks has amplified fuel dryness in all size classes across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid to dangerous rates of spread continue to occur with high potential for that to persist through the week of November 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Discussion:** Unseasonably mild, very dry weather in recent weeks across Northern California this fall has kept fuels very dry and been expanding drought conditions. Although reasonably plentiful rain fell across much of the Geographic Area right around the beginning of October, recent dry weather has essentially erased any fuel moisture gains from that event. Much of the time since then, a ridge of high pressure persisting out over the Pacific Ocean has mostly been keeping a very dry airmass over the Geographic Area. The weather pattern during the past 3 weeks been particularly dry with a steady series of N to E foehn wind events that have contributed significantly to fuel dryness and challenging fire control conditions. Fires have recently shown or exhibited rapid or dangerous spread rates or generate extreme fire behavior. Even some internal islands in earlier large fire perimeters (e.g. Carr Fire) have reportedly rekindled, apparently from long-held residual heat. It is not just windy areas that have experienced rapid spread, but some fuel-and-slope-driven fires have also seen unseasonable, very active fire behavior.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California normally sees enough precipitation by late October to bring about fire season-ending conditions. Early October's precipitation did mitigate fire danger for a bit, but unseasonably dry weather since then and several significant foehn wind events the past few weeks have created very dry fuel conditions much later into the fall season than usual. Very low daily afternoon minimum relative humidity (RH) values of 5-12% have been common, and recent wind events have limited overnight RH recovery to less than 25% in many locations and to less than 15% in some. This has had a dramatic effect on fuel dryness and fire danger indices which are now either near seasonal record values or at core fire season severity levels. ### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- One hour fine fuel loading across the Geographic Area remains well above normal.
- Firefighters should be prepared for potential extreme fire behavior and dangerous or otherwise rapid rates of spread at any time of day, especially during foehn wind events.
- The potential for extreme fire activity will be likely to continue until enough precipitation occurs to significantly increase fuel moisture.
- Rapid rates of spread could have a significant impact on public safety and make evacuations difficult.

### Mitigation Measures:

- All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions.
- Employ LCES principles (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety zones).
- Review current fire potential products from Predictive Services at <https://gacc.nifc.gov/oncc/predictive/weather/index.htm> or potential Red Flag conditions from the National Weather Service at Weather at <https://www.wrh.noaa.gov/fire2/cafw/>.

**Area of Concern:** Most areas across Northern California could see active fire behavior, but the most severe conditions are in the Sacramento Valley and surrounding foothills, the western slopes of Cascade and Northern Sierra Nevada mountains, and Mendocino County southward, including all of the Bay Area. The PSA numbers associated with those areas are NC03A, NC03B, NC05 and NC07.

## CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post:** Inappropriate information, Inappropriate pictures or videos, Opinions regarding the incident or policy, Endorsements of any kind.

## FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

Think before you post:

- On official time, do official duties; if using government equipment, do government business.
- Don't use your official position/title for private gain.
- Do share government information that is publically available (such as links to Inciweb, weather reports, feature stories, official evacuation notices etc...) Do not disclose (via any medium) non-public information to further private interests or the private interests of others.
- Do not share information outside official channels that could be associated with a crime or a claim, (for instance do not post on social media about serious accidents, deaths or destroyed property).
- Do not accept compensation for statements made over social media that relate to official duties.
- Never use your official title while engaging in "political activity" (activity directed toward the success or failure of a political party, partisan candidate or partisan political group).
- Federal employees may express their opinions concerning partisan political candidates and political parties on social media when they are off duty and away from the federal workplace.
- If you have questions about content you'd like to post on social media, contact a PIO, they can help you.

## CITIZENS IN THE AREA

As citizens start to repopulate into the affected areas we would like to remind you that you are a great asset and resource ambassador of the fire service. As you come into contact with the citizens please treat the citizens as if they were the citizens of your own community.

These citizens just went through a very tragic incident. Please help curb aggressive media away from citizens who may not want to be interviewed or allowed on their private property.

## PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

## MEDIA

California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

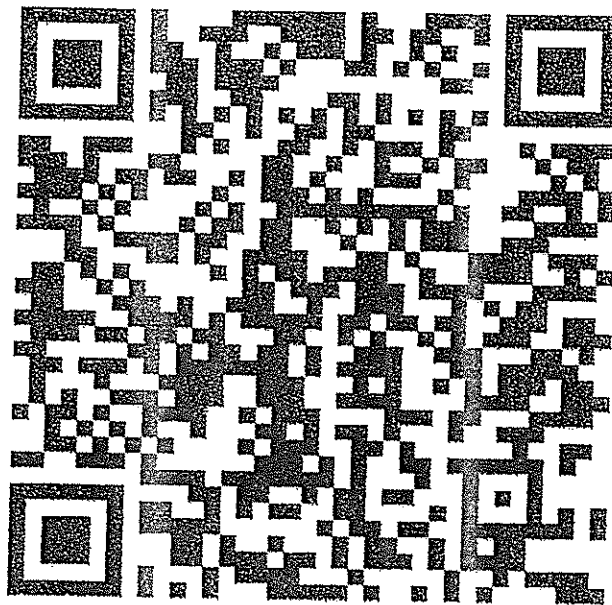

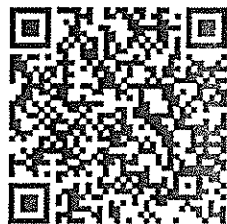

## **Archaeological and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Camp Incident, Butte County CA**

*Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties.  
When possible and prudent:*

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric archaeological sites. These sites may include seasonal camps marked by the presence of obsidian and/or basalt flakes, bedrock mortar food processing sites, and village sites that contain the above and dark midden soils. The Native American group living in the area at time of historic contact was the Maidu.
2. Be on the lookout for historic archaeological sites. These sites may include old homesteads now marked by the presence of foundations, wells, and can dumps, early sawmill sites, abandoned ditches, mining tailings, and other mining features including adits (horizontal) and shafts (vertical).
3. Look for these prehistoric and historic sites in flat areas, especially adjacent to streams and springs.
4. Known sites will be marked with red/white or red/black striped plastic flagging tape.
5. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites attempt to avoid if possible. If you can't avoid, minimize ground disturbance as much as possible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth as necessary. Try to go around sites with dozers rather than through them. Flag new sites if possible.
6. If you find artifacts leave them in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
7. Note locations of discovered artifacts, features, and/or sites on a map. Better yet take a GPS reading if possible. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Situation Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair.
8. If you encounter a burial site cease work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

## EMERGENCY FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN - CAMP INCIDENT

**Fire Suppression Repair** is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas caused by the fire. We cannot upgrade facilities beyond their pre-fire condition. Fire suppression repair shall be applied to mitigate infrastructure damage and natural resource damage.

**Infrastructure Damage:** Culverts and other watercourse crossings, water sources, trails, road barriers removed for fire access, trash, debris and supplies left by fire suppression activities; miscellaneous.

**Natural Resource Damage:** Repair of existing problems caused by fire suppression activities (direct effect) to natural resources and to prevent likely future problems such as accelerated erosion caused by rains (indirect effect). The goal is to minimize soil erosion, adverse impacts to water quality, and adverse impacts to protected species of plants and animals

### REPAIR GUIDELINES

**General:** Restore berms and barriers removed for fire control access.

**Drop Points/Staging Areas/Safety Zones:** New construction - cross drain and abandon (if applicable). Existing - repair to original condition, remove debris resulting from use. Pick up all trash.

**Roads:** Reshape soil surfaced roads that were used during fire control operations. Roads should be out-sloped with rolling dips where degradation of the road prism has resulted from fire control operations. Clean out culvert inlets and outlets as needed. Report any damaged culverts to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist for specific repair guidance. Breach berms, where appropriate, to facilitate drainage.

**Firelines:** Break apart dozer piles of pushed over trees, vegetation and soil, and spread along tractor roads, tractor fire breaks, or any other areas disturbed during fire suppression activities. Lop and scatter displaced vegetation to a height of less than 30 inches or chip within 100' of a gravel road or structure. Scatter the lopped material along the fire line. Pull back any excess soil material sidecast along roads or tractor disturbed areas that are located within 100 feet of any watercourse or spring. Install waterbreaks on all constructed or used dozer lines using the following criteria:

Fireline and road gradient(%) grasslands:	0-10	11-25	26-50	>50
Fireline waterbreak spacing:	150'	100'	75'	75'
Road waterbreak spacing:	300'	200'	150'	100'
Fireline and road gradient(%) all other areas:	0-10	11-25	26-50	>50
Fireline waterbreak spacing:	100'	75'	50'	25'
Road waterbreak spacing:	150'	100'	75'	50'

Waterbreaks and/or rolling dips shall be used to reduce the volume and velocity of water by directing it off fire lines as soon as possible at controlled locations. The outfall end of all waterbreaks shall be opened by hand if necessary. Waterbreaks should be located to discharge into natural vegetation. Waterbreaks should cross the fire line at an angle of approximately 45 degrees.

**Handlines:** Install waterbreaks as needed based on slope and soil erodibility.

All waterbreaks shall be installed diagonally with a minimum cut of 6" into existing grade, and minimum height of 12". Waterbreaks shall be constructed to allow for drainage at the discharge end into non-erodible material.

**Slash Piles:** Piles within 150' of permanent structures or public roads will be lopped and/or scattered within 18" of the soil surface.

Piles along roads and fences: Lop to fire protection standards to ensure decreased fire risk is obtained. Scatter smaller debris where applicable.

**Watercourse Crossings:** All slash, soil, and debris deposited into watercourses resulting from fire suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized above the high-water line.

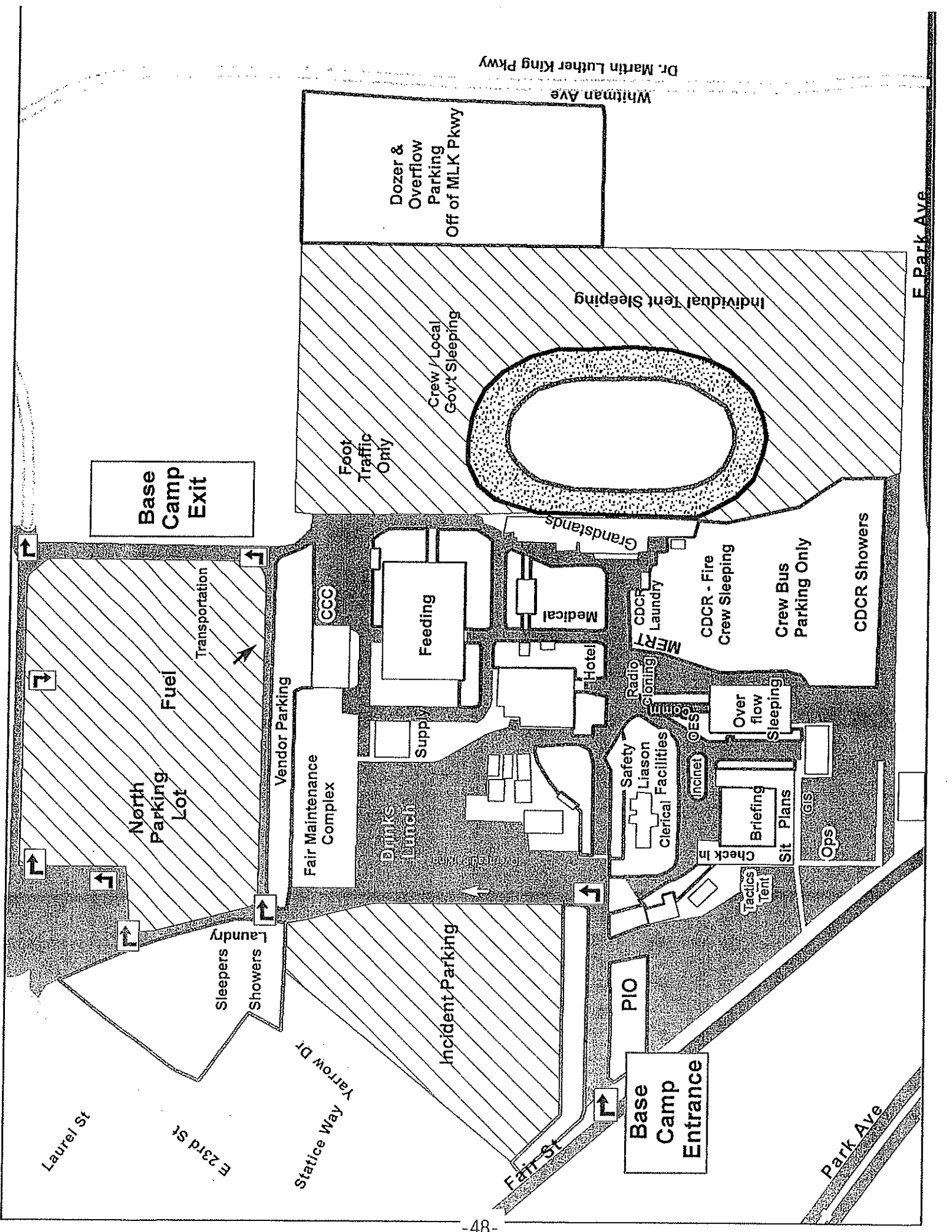
Major watercourse damage, if present, shall be reported to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist prior to the end of the shift day.

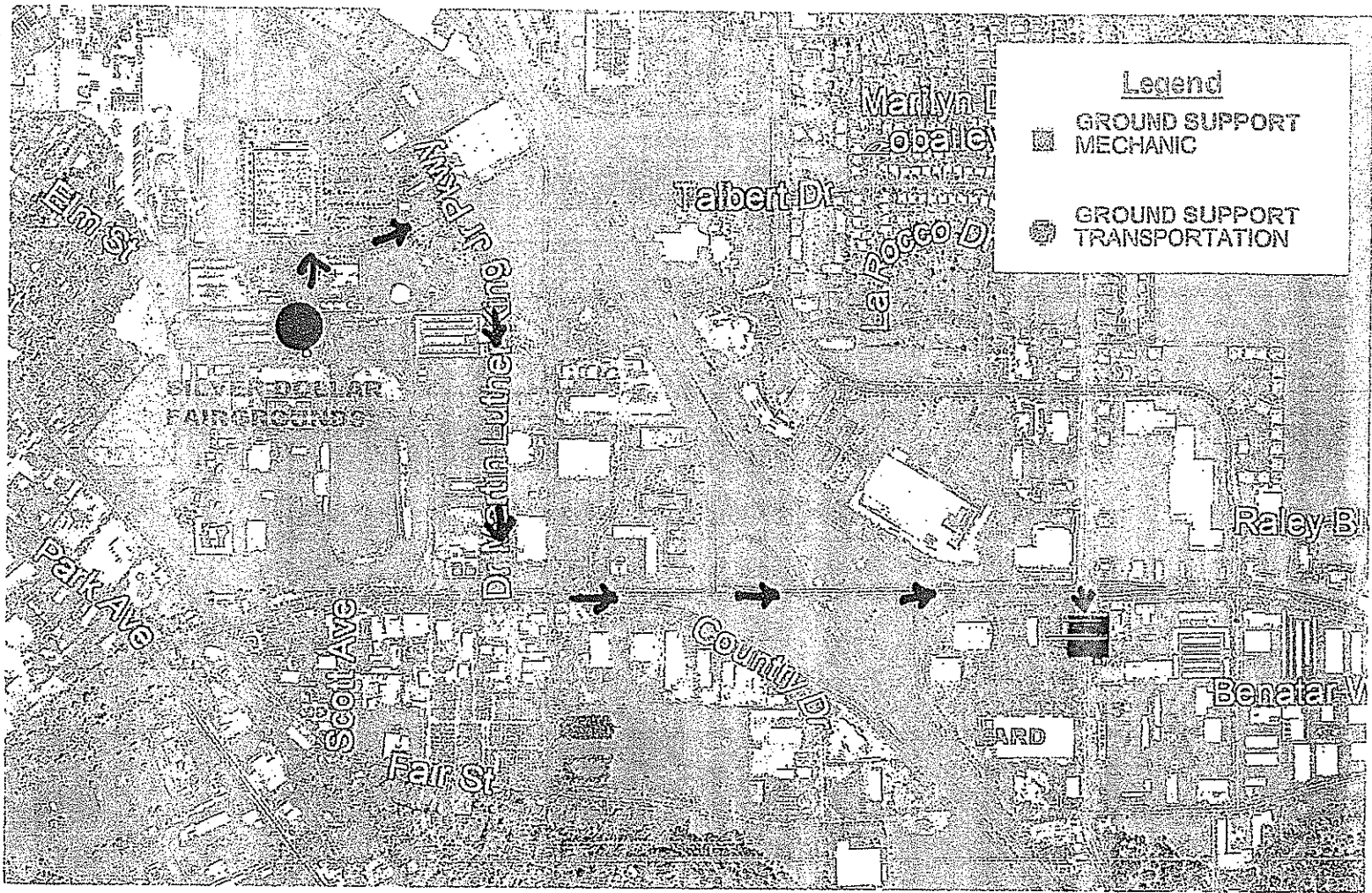
Where fire lines are constructed within 100' of flowing watercourses, slash or straw mulching will be applied. All loose soil must be pulled away from the watercourse and stabilized.

**Archaeological or Historic Sites:** All potential sites shall be avoided. Contact Incident Archaeologist.

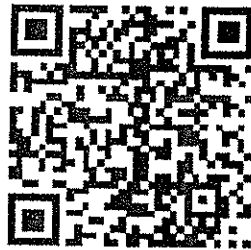
