

#### Watch out

- For trees that have burned, or have been exposed to excessive heat
- For trees that have been flagged
- For increased winds that may impact weakened trees and cause them to fall

#### Mitigation

- Avoid working under or near trees , or branches that have been exposed to fire
- Do Not approach or work near any trees that appear weakened or compromised

### INCLEMENT WEATHER

INCREASED POTENTIAL FOR ACCIDENT DUE TO RAIN AND WIND

#### Watch Out

- Vehicle maintenance records and annual maintenance

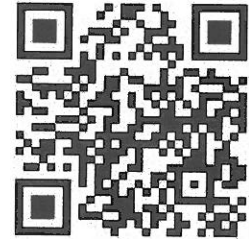

### Execution:

#### **Coroners Issues:**

\*\*\*\*If remains are located as a result of a welfare check, stop and DO NOT CALL the RP listed on the call sheet.\*\*\*\*

If remains are located, write down description of location (Inside structure, Inside vehicle, Outside)

Mark location of remains with flagging, use caution not to disturb site

Notify BCSO dispatch by phone \*\*\*530-538-3845\*\*\* of location and number of decedents

Day: Maintain security of scene until directed otherwise by Coroner's division

Night: No Coroner's Cases will be taken during night shift. Provide extra patrols throughout shift

#### **Traffic Control Points:**

If a traffic control point appears to be in the wrong location, providing the wrong directions to citizens or missing altogether, notify the Operations Sergeant to relay to the Liaisons at Fire ICP. Do not give directions to traffic control personnel (CHP or National Guard).

#### **Peer support:**

Peer support is available from Chaplains and doctors at the staging area and in the field. County employees check your email regarding meeting about resources.

**Deployment:**

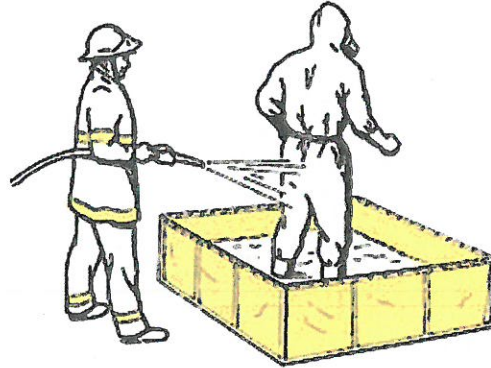

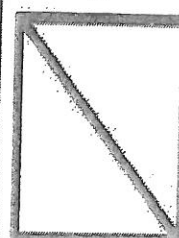

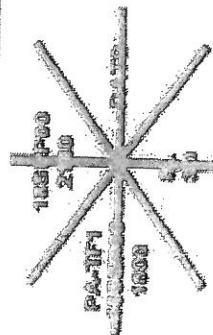
