WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper trough of low pressure will approach the north coast maintaining onshore flow and a marine influence to the fire area today. Cool temperatures and higher relative humidity values will continue before returning to much lower daytime and nighttime RH's as well as warmer temperatures on Thursday. The trough will also usher in a more general south and southwest wind flow over the fire area but strong winds are not expected. A more significant rise in temperature and drop in both daytime and nighttime humidity is expected to begin Saturday as another strong ridge of high pressure returns over the region.

#### WEATHER FORECAST TODAY (WEDNESDAY DAYTIME):

SKY/WEATHER: Continued cooler with some morning low clouds and smoke likely...then sunny.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 79 - 84 MIN HUMIDITY 2000 ft: 24 - 32%.

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

Valley Floor to Midslope:

South and southeast 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 12 mph through mid

morning then becoming southwesterly 7 to 12 mph with

gusts to 18 mph through midnight.

Midslope to Ridge:

South winds 6 - 10 mph through mid morning...then increasing to south and southwest 12 to 16 with afternoon gusts to 22 mph through midnight.

STABILITY / INVERSION: Moderately Unstable.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South-southwest 25 mph.

#### WEATHER FORECAST WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

SKY/WEATHER: Low clouds and smoky through the morning hours.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 49 - 54. MAX HUMIDITY: 90 TO 100%.

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

South and southwest 10 to 15 mph with locally higher gusts to 20 mph through 0200 hours. South winds diminishing to 5 to 10 mph through sunrise.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY: Sunny and warmer...and much lower RH's. Max Temps: 87 to 92. Min RH: 17 to 22%. Wind: Upslope or southwest 4 to 8 mph...gusts to 15 mph after 1200 PDT. East Side: Upslope or south-southeast 4 to 8 mph...gust to 15-20 mph in the afternoon.

Smoke Transport Wind: South-southwest 25 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR FRIDAY THROUGH SUNDAY: Mainly clear and becoming hot and dry again. Max Temps 96 to 101. Min RH 16 - 21%...near 10% Saturday and Sunday. Mainly west winds 5 to 10 mph.

#### WEATHER SUMMARY:

Daytime: Sunny with temps near 79°-84°. Relative humidity 24%-32%.

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Today will be the coolest and most moist day this week. This favorable weather should keep fire behavior to a moderate level but a south wind will push the fire towards heavier fuels. The expected fire behavior this operational period is for moderate growth, but fuel conditions have been accelerating fire behavior despite cooler weather. The fire is burning in a mix of Grass, Brush and Conifers. South winds will align with the most active branches of the fire this operational period.

Probability of Ignition 70-80%

Spotting Distance ½ mile

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 3-4%

#### SPECIFIC:

#### Branch II

Much of fire activity on this branch has transitioned to lower elevations and has been holding on control lines. The only exception is the far north portion of the branch that will have opportunity for dangerous fire spread as heavier fuels align with wind. The rates of spread in the grass can exceed 90 ch/h and 80 ch/h in the brush were wind and slope align. Fuel continuity varies by aspect and elevation but all fuels are expected to support fire growth.

#### Branch IV

This branch is mainly grass oak woodland that has been back burning towards farming areas on the east and towards Hwy 128 on the south. A successful burning operation has brought most of the control lines to lower elevations and are expected to have very little activity. The area of concern is for pockets of unburned fuel that could ignite and impact the Hwy 128 area. If wind and slope align on this branch, expect the values in grass to exceed 90 ch/h and 80 ch/h in the brush.

#### Branch VI

The fire has progressed down to Lake Berryessa on most of this branch. A favorable wind should aid to complete any burn operations that were not completed last operational period. Look for pockets of unburned fuel that may become active by a new wind direction influence. The rates of spread in the grass can exceed 90 ch/h and 80 ch/h in the brush were wind and slope align.

#### **Branch VIII**

The fire has been back burning, finding slope reveal and accelerating to the north. The afternoon south wind may push the fire up the Knoxville Rd corridor with dangerous rates of spread. The rates of spread in the grass can exceed 90 ch/h and 80 ch/h in brush were wind and slope align. Spotting will find opportunity in dry receptive grass.

#### Branch X

This branch is predicted to be the most active portion of the incident this operational period. Heavy fuels aligned with south winds will push the fire to the north towards Hwy 40. Spotting from large column development may out pace ground and air resources. Indirect line construction must monitor fire conditions for accelerated spread compromising escape routes. The rates of spread in the grass can exceed 100 ch/h and 90 ch/h in brush where wind and slope align.

AIR OPERATIONS: Air resources may be grounded due to smoke, make your plan with this in mind

#### SAFETY

- Fire behavior has been extreme. Make all plans with this as a basis.
- Ensure that you have established a realistic escape route.
- · Look for increased fire activity after 1400hrs.



PHOTOGRAPHS AND VIDEOS OF INCIDENT — We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means news/broadcast industry, but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video, photographs and post them onto social media sites in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately, we have seen some instances of photographs or videos that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens, it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could expose oneself to unwanted ramifications. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera loses their situational awareness.

The Public Information Office would like copies of the video and pictures that you safely took while not in an emergency situation, fire suppression activity or in an overhead assignment. Bring your video and pictures to the Public Information trailer; they will be reviewed and possibly uploaded to our many CAL FIRE social media sites. Remember, we don't want photographs or videos that depict unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances, which are a serious breach of ethics.

**LOST AND FOUND** – The Information Section will manage lost and found items for the incident. If you have lost an item please leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well.

MAIL SERVICE - The Information Section can assist you with sending and receiving mail.

#### SHIFT TICKETS / HIRED EQUIPMENT VENDORS:

Line supervisors are responsible for completing shift tickets for all hired equipment resources working for them. Please turn completed shift tickets into the CAL FIRE Time Unit at the end of your shift. We will not accept shift tickets from vendors.

#### FEDERAL TIME:

Federal agency timekeepers are on site and available to assist our federal government cooperators with personnel and equipment time.

#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT TIME KEEPING:

The CAL OES representative is on site to handle F-42 and any questions you may have. If you are a local government cooperator from the Sonoma-Lake-Napa Unit (including Yolo County), please check in with the CAL FIRE Time Unit.

#### SUPRESSION DAMAGES:

Please report all fire suppression damage to the Comp Claims Unit Leader. We will need location, lat/long, property owner, type of damage, etc. Examples of "fire suppression damage: Damaged fence, crush culverts, pipe damage, broken gates, etc.

#### FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN: COUNTY INCIDENT

Fire suppression repair is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is <u>not</u> the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas that happened as a result of the fire itself.

Damaged facilities will be returned to functional status in order to prevent further damage. Projects too large or complex to be completed by the Fire Suppression Repair Group shall be transferred to the Comp/Claims Unit or the local Unit. Repair work shall only occur in locations authorized by the Operations Division and where fire suppression activities are complete. Fire Suppression Repair Group resources shall evaluate all Divisions for appropriate repair needs. This includes areas inside and outside the fire perimeter, provided the damage was caused by official fire suppression activities. Extra care will be exercised and equipment will be monitored when operating in locations where new fire starts are more likely to occur, such as rocky areas in dry grass. New fires will be reported following the instructions in the radio call plan.

Examples of items that may be repaired include, but are not limited to:


#### Dozer Line Repair

Dozers construct both fire and contingency lines. Dozer line width varies greatly. The following measures shall be implemented for constructed dozer line:

- Berms and push-piles shall be spread out to the extent feasible. This may be accomplished by back-blading and/or using ripper shanks or grapples. Debris piled against trees or perched above watercourses is especially important to remove or disperse.
- Waterbreaks shall be constructed at a 30-45 degree angle and shall be a minimum depth of 12 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where feasible, the discharge from waterbreaks shall be directed into vegetated or rocked areas.
- Where slopes exceed the range at which a tractor can effectively work, waterbreaks shall be constructed with hand tools.
- Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in the same condition they were found or better. Gravel and soil-surfaced roads shall be watered to prevent excessive dust. Where fire suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable dips shall be installed for drainage.
- Where fire suppression activities have filled in or damaged inside ditches, the ditches shall be cleaned and left unobstructed.
- Spacing of waterbreaks shall be as follows:

Prevailing gradient	Maximum waterbreak spacing
0-10%	200 feet
11-25%	150 feet
26-50%	100 feet
>50%	75 feet

Spacing criteria is a general guide. Actual location of waterbreaks should be tailored to the topography and placement suited to the best dispersal of water flow.



## Archaeological and Historic Properties: General Fire-line Guidance for the BLM Ukiah Field Office.

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible and prudent:


- 1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
- 2. Note, that much of the area has ever been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
- 3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
- 4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
- Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
- 6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
- 7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.


