

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong high pressure over the western U.S will move slightly eastward today. For the most part, weather conditions will not change much with poor overnight RH recovery and low daytime RH continuing. Smoke cover will be the main weather issue today. A slight increase in Southwest flow aloft should help clear out the smoke cover some by afternoon. If this occurs, stability will be decreased so column buildup will be possible as well as collapse and locally erratic surface. Otherwise, winds in the afternoon will continue mainly westerly and occasionally breezy over the ridges. A Pacific trough will approach the coast on Friday bringing a slight cooling but also increasing west to northwest winds and slightly more unstable conditions. Winds should be similar to other clear air days on this fire. Warm, dry and breezy conditions will continue through the weekend as the trough passes by to the north.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Smoky through the morning hours with some clearing by afternoon.

TEMPERATURES: Highs above 1500 feet...83-90. Morning mins 69-74.
Highs below 1500 feet...93-97. Morning mins 57-61.

HUMIDITY: Minimum RH above 1500 feet 11-16%. After Max recovery of 35-45% evening hours dropping to around 25-35% by the early morning hours.
Minimum RH below 1500 feet 10-15% After Max recovery of 70-80%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Northwest to north 4-7 mph gusts to 12 mph in the morning becoming southwest to northwest after about 1400 to 7-12 mph with gusts 15-20 mph afternoon and evening hours.

**** Erratic winds possible Under large columns. ****

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light and variable in the morning becoming southwest to northwest after about 1400 7-12 mph gusts to 15-20 mph upper slopes. East slopes and wind protected areas becoming upslope 3-7 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions holding through about 1400. Neutral to slightly unstable in the afternoon.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY NIGHT: Fair skies except smoky in vicinity of fires. Min temperatures around 57 lower elevations to 74 ridges and upper slopes. Max RH recovery 65 to 75% lower elevations below 1500 feet. 30-40% above 1500 feet during the evening. Highest RH before midnight then decreasing into the 20-30% range through the morning hours higher elevations. Ridge winds transitioning to northwest to north 8-12 mph with occasional gusts 15 to 20 mph after about 2100. Slope winds transitioning after about 2100 to downslope to downcanyon to 5 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY: Fair skies except smoke in vicinity of fires. Max temps 82 ridges 96 lower elevations. Min RH 12-18%. Ridge winds becoming west to northwest 8-14 mph with gusts to 20-25 mph after about noon. Slope winds becoming southwest to northwest after about 1200 7-12 mph gusts to 15-20 mph. Lower east slopes and wind protected areas becoming upslope 3-7 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR SATURDAY: Fair skies except smokey near the fire. Slightly warmer and direr. Slightly lighter winds.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: **** *A Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory has been issued for much of Northern California* ****

The fire is burning in a mixture of grass, brush, oak woodlands and scattered pine stands. The grass component is fully cured, with a moderate to heavy fuel loading. The fire spread has been driven by the critical fuel moistures, high temperatures, humidity in the teens, and high mid-afternoon winds. These combinations have led to erratic fire behavior with long range spotting. Activity may increase over the fire after the smoke clears from atmospheric instability. Atmospheric instability could allow the production of large, pyro cumulous columns that could collapse and cause erratic winds in all directions.

River: No growth expected.

Branch I & II: Expect fire to continue to rollout and back down slopes remaining primarily on the surface with occasional torching. Watch out for slope reversals increasing fire activity. Smoke cover has subdued fire spread temporarily along portions of Sullivan Ridge and Letts Lake area. When skies clear anticipate fire behavior to increase in intensity and transition readily from surface to crown.

Branch III: Fire activity will be minimal until the smoke coverage over the Branch clears out mid-afternoon. Morning winds will be from the Northwest. By mid-afternoon, winds will fluctuate between Southwest and Northwest. Fire activity will increase in areas of that have pockets of unburned fuel or residual heat. Winds in the evening will transition to downslope/down canyon winds after 2100.

Branch IV: Fire activity will be minimal until the smoke coverage over the Branch clears out mid-afternoon. Morning winds will be from the Northwest. By mid-afternoon, winds will fluctuate between Southwest and Northwest. Fire activity will increase in areas of that have pockets of unburned fuel or residual heat. Watch for roll out if working on a slope with unburned fuel below you.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke may make it difficult to see resources working on Divisions.

SAFETY

- Watch for activity to increase once smoke clears the fire area.
- Be aware of unburned fuel between you and the fire.



MENDOCINO HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE

Incident within Incident (IWI) procedures - Review your ICS 206 and know what to do.

Line Construction: Construct line from a safe anchor point, use caution when there is unburned fuel between you and the fire. Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel. If you cannot see the main fire, then stay in contact with someone who can. Ensure LCES in place prior to engagement.

Extreme Fire Behavior: Fuels are receptive to fire spread. Be alert to changes in wind direction and expect changes in fire behavior. Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels, such as grass and light brush or islands within fire perimeters of unburned or partially burned fuels.

Structure Defense: Use the Structure Triage Decision Process of S-FACTS. Ensure your survival, consider the fire environment before you commit, and evaluate access in and out of the area. Is clearance around and construction of buildings conducive for structure defense. Is there enough time before the fire arrives to prep structures, do you have a TRA or Safety Zone nearby?

Firing Operations: Follow the Firing Operations Checklist. Conduct thorough briefing. Use qualified personnel. Required PPE to be worn by all personnel involved.

Dozer/Heavy Equipment Safety: Utilize good communications working around heavy equipment and maintain safe working distances. Watch for rolling material if working below equipment. Stay out of the dust.

Fatigue: Manage yourself and those around you for fatigue. As fatigue increases, injuries tend to increase also. Keep an eye on your crew and partner, the shift doesn't end until you have driven off the line back to camp safely. Be smart in your decision making.

Mop Up: Use all required PPE, including eye protection. Maintain proper spacing and overhead clearance. Be alert for stump holes and root cavities. Evaluate unburned islands, and consider re-burn potential.

Common Denominators of Tragedy Fires

- On deceptively quiet areas of the fire.
- In relatively light fuels such as grass or light brush.
- When there is an unexpected shift of wind direction or in wind speed.
- When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.
- Utilize **PACE** planning: Have a Primary, Alternative, Contingent, and Emergency plan in place that everyone understands with known trigger points.

Fatigue


- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift.
- Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system.
- Eat small meals often and when possible. Drink electrolyte drinks at a 3 waters to 1 sport drink ratio.

RANCH	DIRECT and INDIRECT LINE CONSTRUCTION	Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (inside rear cover IRPG). Ensure LCES in place prior to engagement. Establish adequate safety zones. Use Downhill Line Checklist. Follow "Look Up, Look Down, Look Around" procedures. Construct line from a safe anchor point, use caution when there is unburned fuel between you and the fire. If you cannot see the main fire, then stay in contact with someone who can.
RANCH	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR	Know your LCES and maintain Situational Awareness. Use experienced Look Outs. Adhere to the downhill line construction guidelines. Monitor weather for changes in the wind, temp, and RH. Expect rapid rates of spread with spotting, have a contingency plan with established decision points and safety zones.
RANCH	FIRING OPERATIONS	Follow the Firing Operation Checklist. Assure that lookouts are posted, communications are established with both firing and holding teams, escape routes and safety zones are established and not compromised by the firing operations. Also, it has been approved and relayed to all adjoining forces.
RANCH	STRUCTURE DEFENSE	Triage all structures and ensure there is a Safety Zone or Temporary Refuge Area (TRA) close by before committing. Ensure your survival and consider the fire environment before you commit. There should be good clearance around the structure and construction of buildings conducive for structure defense. Maintain LCES and have trigger points established when to leave the area.
ALL	FATIGUE/HEAT/DEHYDRATION	Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Drink water before, during and after shifts. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system. Eat small meals often and when possible.
ALL	STEEP TERRAIN / ROLLING DEBRIS	Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	Slow Down! Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on. Narrow roads with limited passing room. Coordinate your movements on one-lane roads. Use warning devices when operating near traffic. Be aware of your level of fatigue before driving.
RANCH	AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS	Monitor air-to-ground frequency, they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft. Only utilize aircraft to insert personnel on the line when necessary.
ALL	HEAVY EQUIPMENT	Watch for rolling material and avoid working below heavy equipment. Monitor safe working distances. Avoid working below heavy equipment. Utilize communication with the operator (radio or hand signals). Stay out of the dust.
ALL	COMPLACENCY	Having the same assignment on the same ground day after day can lead to complacency and make us more vulnerable to accidents. Maintain your situational awareness through to the end of your assignment.
ALL	HAZARD TREES	Identify and isolate the area to provide for the safety of others. Flag and make proper notifications. Do not fall trees out of your certification level.
RANCH	POWER LINES	Follow <i>Power Line Safety</i> guidelines in the IRPG. Extinguish all power poles that are on fire before the fall. Flag area around downed power lines and deny access. Treat all downed power lines as energized.
ALL	PERFORM TAIL GATE SAFETY MEETINGS	Everyone should be briefed on the conditions/circumstances regarding the fire and their assignments per the IRPG. Ensure all personnel have PPE, food, and water.
RIVER	FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR	Maintain accountability of personnel at all times. See HEAVY EQUIPMENT above and COMPLACENCY below.
BR 3	MERCURY MINES	Be aware of abandoned mercury mines on the East side of Walker Ridge.





CAL FIRE WUI Guidelines

STRUCTURE DEFENSE TACTICAL ACTIONS

CHECK AND GO

"Check and Go" is a rapid evaluation to check for occupants requiring removal or rescue.
Structure Triage Category – Threatened Non-Defensible

PREP AND GO

"Prep and Go" implies that some preparation of the structure may be safely completed prior to resources leaving the area. Structure Triage Category – Threatened Non-Defensible

PREP AND DEFEND

"Prep and Defend" is a tactic used when a Safety Zone and TRA are present and adequate time exists to safely prepare a structure for defense prior to the arrival of the fire front.
Structure Triage Category – Threatened Defensible

FIRE FRONT FOLLOWING

"Fire Front Following" is a follow up tactic employed when Check and Go, Prep and Go, or Bump and Run tactics are initially used. A tactic used to come in behind the fire front.

BUMP AND RUN

"Bump and Run" is a tactic where resources typically move ahead of the fire front in the spotting zone to extinguish spot fires and hot spots, and to defend as many structures as possible.

ANCHOR AND HOLD

"Anchor and Hold" is a tactic utilizing control lines and large water streams from fixed water supplies in an attempt to stop fire spread. The goal is to extinguish structure fires, protect exposures, and reduce ember production.

TACTICAL PATROL

"Tactical Patrol" is a tactic where the key element is mobility and continuous monitoring of an assigned area.

LEVELS OF ENGAGEMENT

PACE

Implement PACE. prior to engaging in any structure protection action.

P - Primary Plan [Offense]

Is focused on fire fighter safety and mission objectives

A - Alternate Plan [Offense]

A fall back plan that closely supports the Primary Plan

C - Contingency Plan [Defense]

Focused on the firefighter's safety, move to a safety zone or temporary refuge area

E - Emergency Plan [Defense]

Firefighter survival, deployment zones, fire shelters

ALWAYS HAVE A DEPLOYMENT SITE IDENTIFIED!

DRAW-D

D - Defend – Holding actions, protecting priority areas, protect the structures, hold and improve the line

R - Reinforce – Bring more resources to bear, add resources necessary to *advance* or *defend*

A - Advance – Anchor and Flank, Direct or Indirect Attack, Active burnout operations

W - Withdraw – Cease current activities until conditions modify, Abandon an established position or constructed line in response to an increase in fire intensity, Not a stigma, but a decision to move away from a threat

D - Delay – Wait until the situation has modified sufficiently to allow a different level of engagement, Waiting for conditions to meet pre-identified triggers necessary to *advance* or *defend*, not a lack of effort, but a conscious decision to maximize long term effectiveness

Fire Suppression Repair – Mendocino Complex

Fire Suppression Repair is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas caused by the fire. We cannot upgrade facilities beyond their pre-fire condition. Any projects too large or complicated to be completed by the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist shall be turned over to the Comp/Claims Unit or the local Unit.

Infrastructure Damage

Fences and gates; culverts/ bridges/ other watercourse crossings; water sources, utility distribution lines; above or below ground; road barriers removed for fire access, trash, debris and supplies left by fire suppression activities; misc. damage to residential property

Natural Resource Damage

Repair of existing problems caused by fire suppression activities (direct effect) to natural resources and to prevent likely future problems such as accelerated erosion caused by winter rains (indirect effect). The goal is to minimize:

- Soil erosion
- Adverse impacts to water quality
- Adverse impacts to protected species of plants and animals

Dozers constructed most of the fire perimeter and all of the contingency lines. Dozer line width ranges greatly. The following measures shall be implemented for constructed dozerline:

- Berms and push-piles shall be dispersed spread out to the extent feasible. This is may be accomplished by back-blading and /or using ripper shanks or grapples if present. Debris piled against trees or perched above watercourses are especially important to correct.
- Waterbreaks shall be installed at a spacing which corresponds to a moderate erosion hazard rating in the California Forest Practice Rules. Maximum spacing shall be as follows:

Prevailing Gradient	0-10%	11-25%	26-50%	>50%
Maximum Waterbreak Spacing	200 Feet	150 Feet	100 Feet	75 Feet

NOTE: This waterbreak spacing information is a general guide for maximum spacing, actual location of waterbreaks should be tailored to the topography and placement should be suited to the best dispersal of water flow.

- Waterbreaks shall be constructed at an approximately 45 degree angle and shall be a minimum depth of 10 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where possible the discharge from the waterbreaks shall be directed into vegetated areas to minimize erosive forces.
- Where slopes exceed the range at which a tractor can effectively work, waterbreaks shall be constructed with handtools.
- Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in at least as good a condition as they were found. Gravel and soil surface roads shall be watered to prevent excessive dust formation. Where suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable drainage dips shall be installed for drainage.
- Where suppression activities have filled in or damaged inside ditches, the ditches shall be cleaned and left unobstructed.

Cultural Resources Site Damage

Any disturbance to known or suspected archaeological/historical sites and artifacts must be reported to the Incident Archaeologist immediately. Intentional removal or disturbance to any artifact is not permissible.

Supervisory personnel are to identify resources excess to the needs of the incident at the earliest opportunity. If possible, this should be done within 36 hours in advance of a proposed release by filling out a General Message Form (ICS 213) or Declaration of Excess Resource Sheet. Please include name, request number, date, ETD, ETA, and if available for reassignment. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have met the 2:1 work rest requirements, have rested for a minimum of 8 hours.

Section Chiefs will approve all excess resource lists and the lists will be forwarded to the Resources Unit for processing.

The release priorities are:

- Local Government
- OES
- Hired Equipment
- Cooperating Agencies
- Federal Resources/CAL FIRE Resources

The needs of the incident and off-incident issues may necessitate the modification of these priorities in certain cases.

Information concerning surplus resources will be forwarded to the expanded dispatch by the Demobilization Unit (with ECC Support Team at incident). This information will include the resource name, request number, ETD, and ETA. Additionally, the availability of the resource for a new assignment will be provided.

All government equipment and rental vehicles must be safety inspected prior to release. Safety inspections shall be coordinated with the Ground Support Unit Leader. All deficiencies will be corrected prior to departure for home unless agency head signs a waiver of inspection.

Surplus resources lists will be posted within the ICP and at the Demobilization Unit with a schedule for resources to pick up the checkout form (ICS-221) at the Demobilization Unit and begin the checkout process at the demobilization time given. Finance will be the final stop prior to returning to the Demobilization Unit. All resources must complete the demobilization process. Once the ICS-221 has been completed and returned in to the Demobilization Unit, the resource will be released from the incident to home, re-assigned to another incident, or held as directed by Northern Region Operations Center (North-Ops).

All Resources will meet any agency-specific and/or DMV rest requirements before demobilizing from the incident. The operator must be rested prior to driving. A resource encountering a delay enroute will contact the appropriate home unit or incident.

MEDIA

California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post:**

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos
- Opinions regarding the incident or policy
- Endorsements of any kind

FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

Think before you post:

- On official time, do official duties; if using government equipment, do government business.
- Don't use your official position/title for private gain.
- Do share government information that is publically available (such as links to Inciweb, weather reports, feature stories, official evacuation notices etc...) Do not disclose (via any medium) non-public information to further private interests or the private interests of others.
- Do not share information outside official channels that could be associated with a crime or a claim, (for instance do not post on social media about serious accidents, deaths or destroyed property).
- Do not accept compensation for statements made over social media that relate to official duties.
- Never use your official title while engaging in "political activity" (activity directed toward the success or failure of a political party, partisan candidate or partisan political group).
- Federal employees may express their opinions concerning partisan political candidates and political parties on social media when they are off duty and away from the federal workplace.
- If you have questions about content you'd like to post on social media, contact a PIO, they can help you.

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

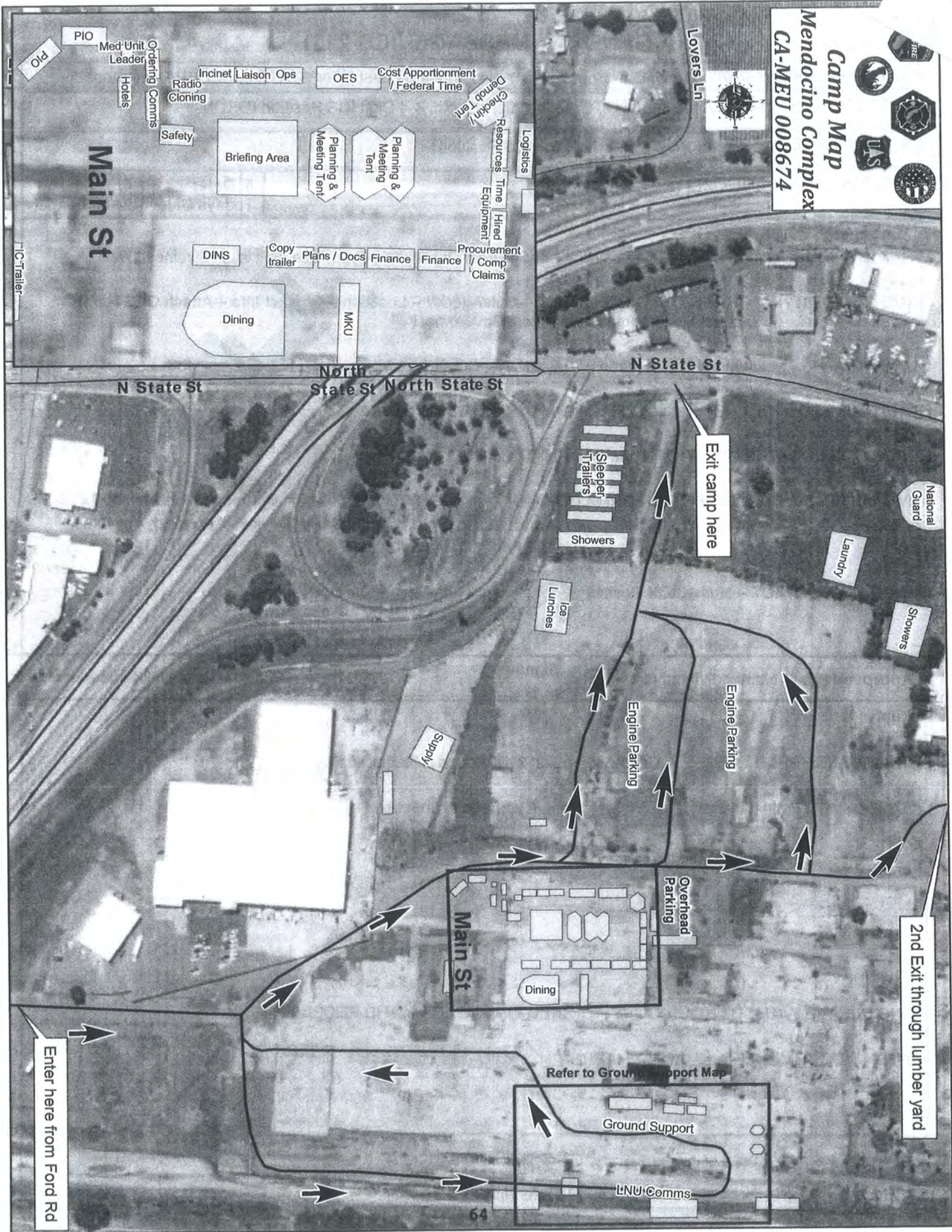

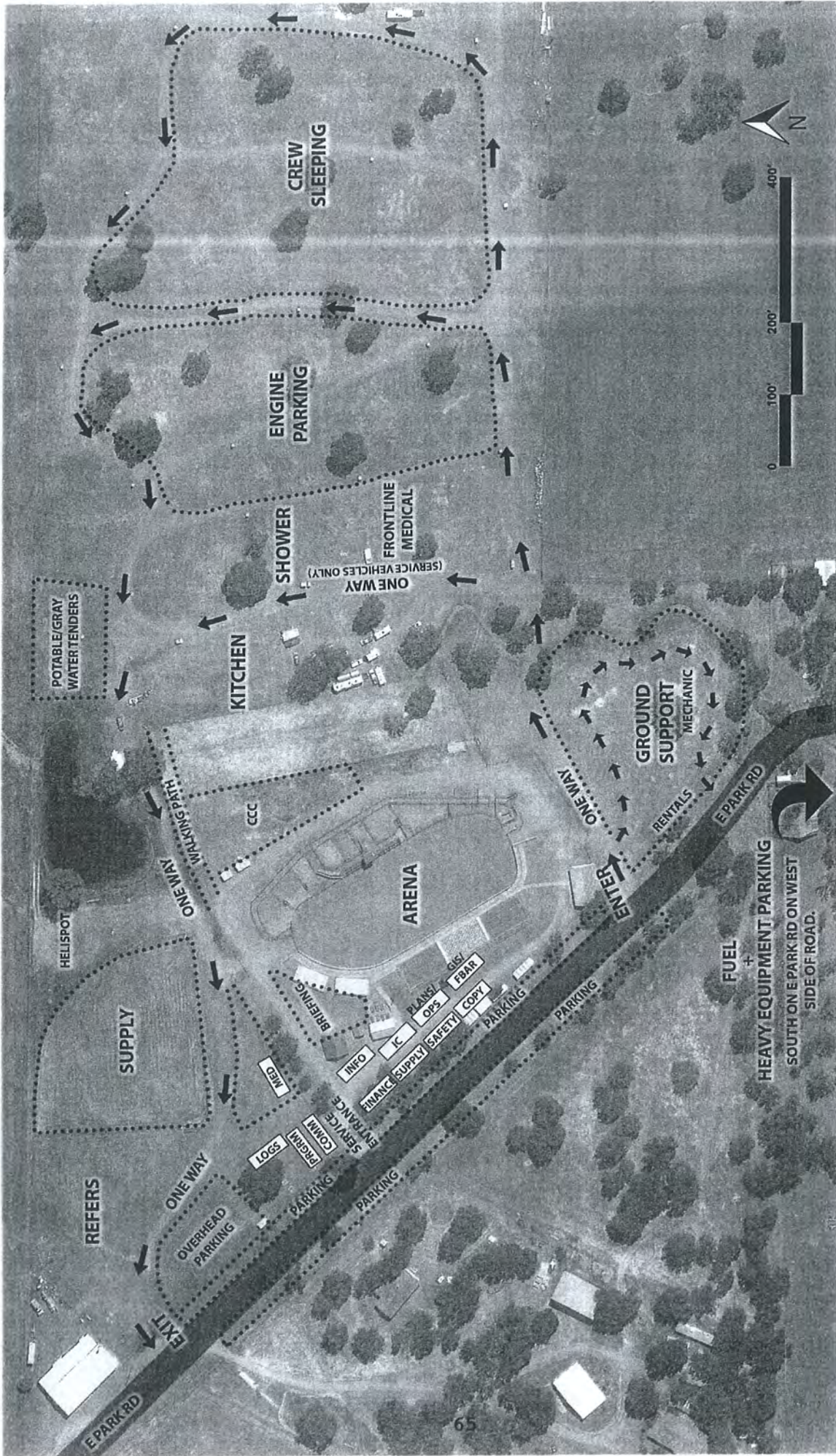

Abandoned Mercury Mines

- There are abandoned mercury mines located in Branch IV and X, in Divisions P, Q and RR.
- Access roads to the mines have been flagged off to restrict access to the sites.
- These areas are to be considered Life Safety Hazards for soil disturbance which may expose the underlying hazardous material.
- There are no Health or Inhalation Hazards if the identified are exposed to fire as the mines and material have been capped with soil.
- Restrict access around these areas for all personnel, vehicles, and equipment.
- Avoid these areas for implementing control lines, staging areas, or drop points.

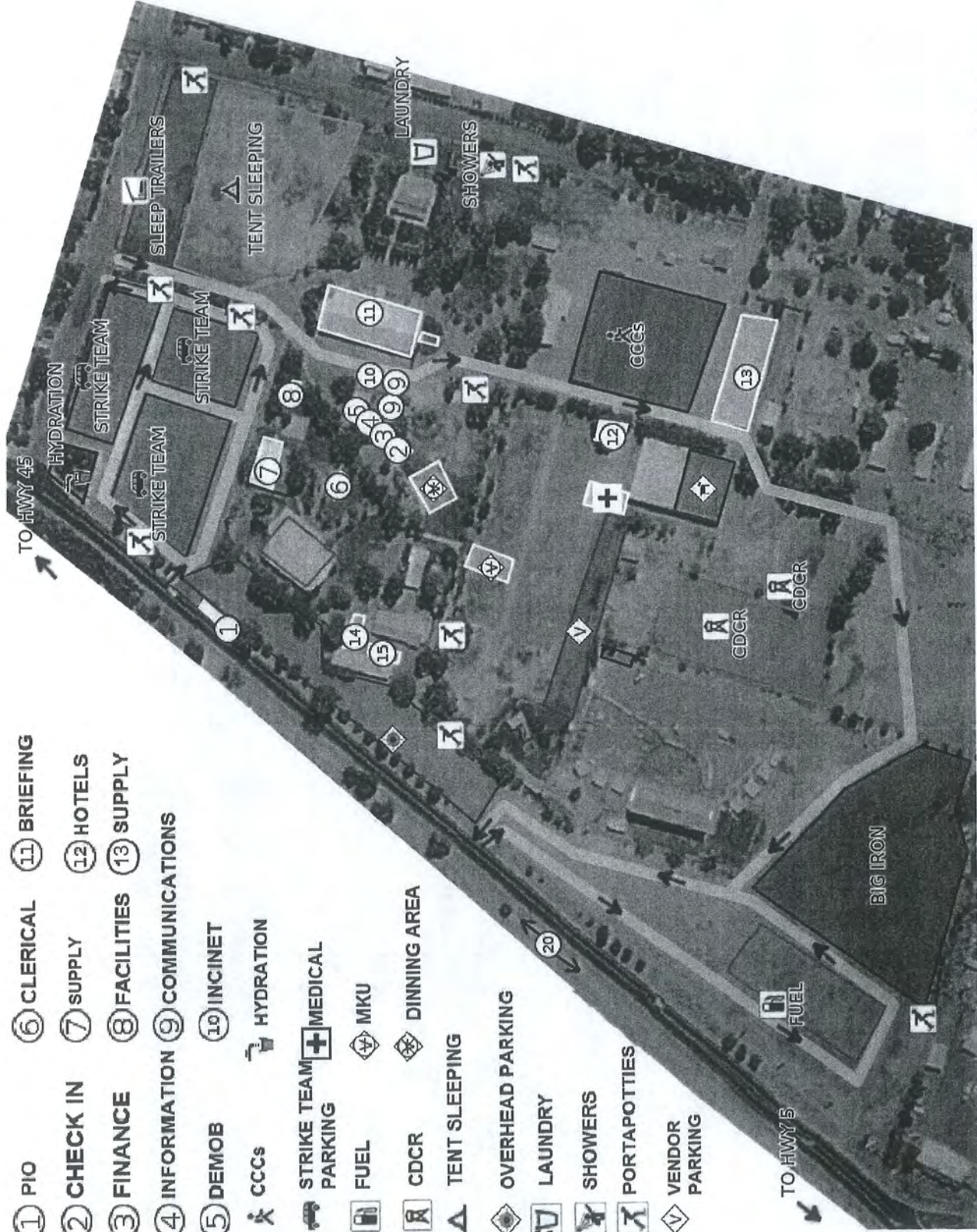
