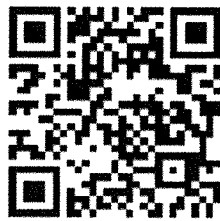

- Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds.
- Critical fire weather conditions continue again for today due to hot, dry unstable weather conditions including locally gusty winds.
- Hydration/ Nutrition/ Fatigue: drink water, eat, and rest when necessary and appropriate.
- Re-energized power transmission lines: Be aware that lines may be live.



**WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...DRY AND UNSTABLE TODAY ...**

Moving into the new week will bring more of the same for much of the incident. A warming trend through the first half of the week will push temperatures back above normal. Continued low relative humidity values both day and night coupled with an atmospheric instability will favor near critical fire weather conditions. Winds will be terrain driven for valleys and midslopes, with a southwest wind on ridges in the afternoon and evening. Areas that receive more sun during the day are likely to see plume development due to a Haines index of 6.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR SUNDAY: ...LOW HUMIDITY WITH UP DRAINAGE WINDS...**

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with a few clouds. Dry conditions.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 90-96°F.... around 100°F near Redding. **LITTLE CHANGE**

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 11-18%. **LITTLE CHANGE**

**EYE-LEVEL WIND:** Downslope/downvalley early, 5-9 gust 16 mph. Becoming upslope/upvalley 6-12 gust 16 mph after 1200.

**20-FOOT WIND:** ...**TERRAIN DRIVEN WINDS, BATTLING WINDS IN UPPER DRAINAGES AFTER 1300...**

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Downslope/downvalley early becoming upslope/upvalley 7-12 mph with gusts to 17 mph after 1200.

**RIDGETOP-** NW 6-12 gust 18mph in the AM, becoming SW 11-16 gusting to 25 mph after 1200.

**HAINES INDEX:** 6 (in clean air)

**SUNDAY NIGHT: ...POOR RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERIES...**

**WEATHER:** Clear and smokey.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 57-67°F. **LITTLE CHANGE**

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 38-48% **LITTLE CHANGE**

**EYE-LEVEL WIND:** **Downslope/downvalley** 6-12 mph with gusts to 18 mph after 2400.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Downslope/downvalley 6-12 mph with gusts to 18 mph after 2400.

**RIDGETOP -** Southwest 9-16 gust 25mph through 2200 becoming Northwest 8-14 with gusts to 20 mph.

**EXTENDED FORECAST: **WARMING TREND INTO THE MIDDLE OF THE WEEK****

**MONDAY AND TUESDAY:** Sunny. Max temps...93-100°F. Min RH 8-15%. Up drainage winds will be the dominant winds both day and night 5-10 with gusts to 15 mph in the midslopes and valleys. Southwest winds on the ridges in the afternoon 10-15 gust to 20mph. Northwest winds 10-15 gust 20 mph on ridges overnight.

**WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY:** Sunny. Max temps...97-104°F. Min RH 8-18%. Upslope/upvalley during the day, downslope/downvalley overnight 5-10 gust 15mph. Northwest winds 7-12 gust 20mph on ridges overnight.

## OUTPUTS

**GENERAL:           \*\*Conditions exist for Plume Dominated Fire Behavior\*\***

Critically dry fuels with significant grass fuel loading will contribute to ember production and spotting.

Terrain driven winds often overcome forecast winds throughout the day resulting in great variations and sudden changes in fire behavior. Dust devils may carry hot material across established lines.

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

### SPECIFIC:

#### Branch I

Smoldering with pockets of activity possible. Keep alert to structural hazards, ash pots and fire weakened trees.

#### Branch II

Daytime SW winds will have fire backburning with occasional upslope runs. Torching and short crown runs may occur. Expect the largest growth to occur as afternoon winds increase. Fuel types convert to lighter and flashier grasses to the south. Dormant heat areas may flare with air movement. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines. Keep alert to unburned islands, fire weakened trees, and dust devils.

#### Branch III

Downslope movement to the West during the day. Expect roll-out and subsequent runs with crown fire up drainages with alignment. Spot fire potential in multiple directions due to variable winds. Keep alert to unburned islands, fire weakened trees, and dust devils.

#### Branch IV

Fire spread with torching/crown runs could occur with increased spotting distances. Battling daytime winds from SW and SE will see fire behavior wax and wane with smoke shading. Look for areas of fuels treatment, timber harvest or previous fire activity for safety or control objectives. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Visibility limited over Branch I and II in afternoon.

Mixing height: 11,000 ft., Transport winds: WSW 10-15mph, Sunrise 0610, Sunset 2022.

### SAFETY

Humidity (RH) below 30% and an eye level wind of 8 mph will see significant increases in fire behavior.














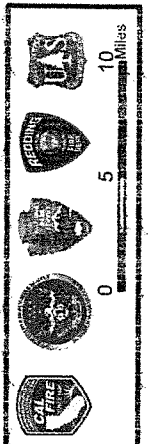

# STRUCTURE DEFENSE GUIDE

## STRUCTURE TRIAGE DECISION PROCESS (S-FACTS)

### SURVIVAL

- Initial Assessment: can you survive here? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
- Is there a Safety Zone nearby? **If not, LEAVE NOW!** (IRPG)
- Do you have a viable Escape Route?
- What is the decision point at which you will leave based on fire behavior and rate of spread?
- Is there a Temporary Refuge Area (TRA) on site? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
  - Preplanned area for immediate, temporary refuge
    - Use of fire shelter should not be necessary
  - Is there a viable Escape Route to the TRA or Safety Zone?
- Is "Prep and Go" tactic an option?
- Do you have communications with your supervisor and adjoining forces?
- If safety issues cannot be mitigated, **LEAVE NOW!**

### FIRE ENVIRONMENT

- Can you survive based on current and expected fire behavior? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
- Look up, Look Down, Look Around Indicators:
  - Fuels (characteristics, moisture, temperature)
    - What will the intensity of the fire be when it arrives?
    - How long will it take to consume the fuels?
  - Wind
    - Current speed/direction
    - Expect changing winds
  - Terrain
    - Are you in a chute, chimney, or saddle? **If yes, LEAVE NOW!**
    - Is wind in alignment with topography?
    - What is your position relative to topography?
    - Are you mid slope or on top of a ridge?
  - Atmospheric Stability
  - Fire Behavior (requires constant monitoring)
    - Spotting, crowning, sheeting, rate of spread?
    - Flame length and height?
- Other weather considerations:
  - What is the current relative humidity?
    - Is there an expected change?
  - Are thunderstorms forecasted?

### ACCESS

- Is access compatible with time and distance factors necessary to utilize as an Escape Route to a Safety Zone?
  - Road surface adequate for speed necessary?
  - Adequate width?
  - Turnaround/turnouts?
  - Bridges within limits for fire apparatus?
  - Drainage ditches/culverts?
  - Steep grades?
  - Is there a safe place to spot apparatus?

## CONSTRUCTION/CLEARANCE

- Does the structure have adequate defensible space, based on topography, fuels, and current and expected fire behavior?
- Can defensible space problems be mitigated quickly?
- Will building materials and yard clutter compromise safety?
- Is the construction wood siding or shake shingle roof?
- Are there vent openings, open eaves, large glass windows facing fire front, decks with vegetation below?
  - Will ember intrusion through attic or foundation vents be a problem?
- What are the contents in the garage and outbuildings?
- Are there hazardous materials present?
- Are there propane tanks, fuel tanks, or power lines?
- Is there an adequate water supply nearby?
- Are additional resources needed to mitigate issues?
- Consider "Prep and Go" or "Prep and Defend" tactics

## TIME CONSTRAINTS

- Is there time for an adequate size up of the structure defense problem?
- Is there time to mitigate safety concerns?
- Is there time and adequate resources to properly prepare and defend the structure?
- Is there time to escape, utilizing Escape Routes, to a Safety Zone? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**

## STAY OR GO

- Tactical decision based on the S-FACTS
- Is it safe to stay? If no, utilize "Check and Go" tactic
- Is there time to prepare the structure for defense and what will the fire behavior be when the fire gets here?
- "Prep and Go" or "Fire Front Following" tactics should be used when it is not safe to "Prep and Defend"

## STRUCTURE TRIAGE CATEGORIES

### **Not-Threatened**

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space make the structure unlikely to ignite
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

### **Threatened Defensible**

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space require structure defense tactics during fire front impact
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

### **Threatened non-Defensible**

- Lack of adequate Safety Zone nearby
- Structure cannot be safely defended
- Residents must be evacuated

## ENTRAPMENT AVOIDANCE

- Are you adhering to the **10 Standard Firefighting Orders?** (IRPG)
- Have you considered the **18 Situations that Shout Watch Out?**

You may not be experiencing these symptoms now or during this fire incident. However, you may find yourself experiencing them when you return to your home or unit. You may find yourself being triggered by a past event that has impacted you, while assigned to future incidents. A sight, sound, smell, or touch could trigger a memory that previously existed, but you may not have been aware of.

If you find yourself in this situation and need to talk to someone contact your Employee Assistance Program (EAP). EAP programs are here to help. It is important to be able to talk to someone and get stuff off your chest vs carrying this around for your career.



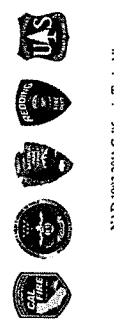
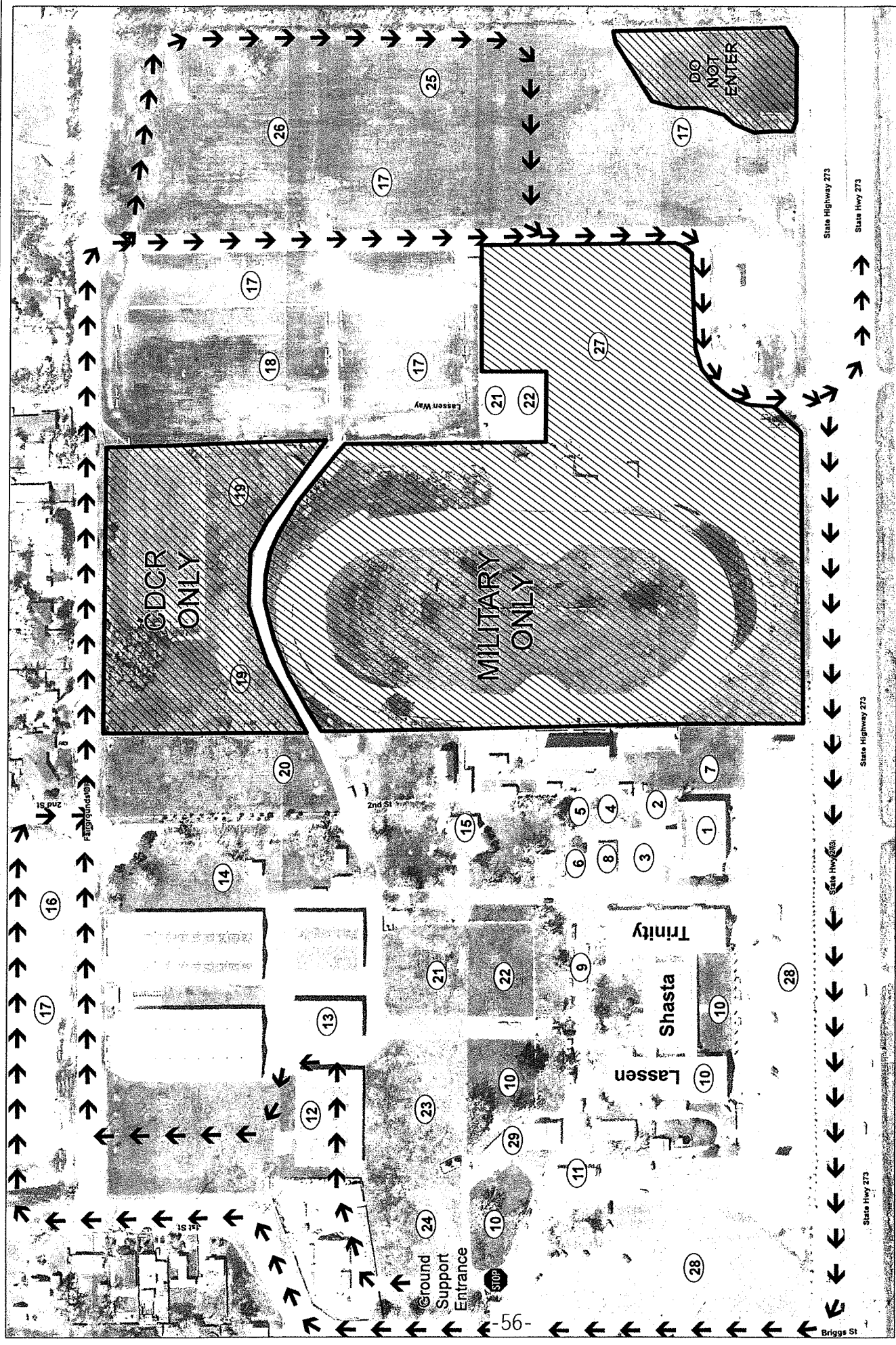
## **Cultural and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Carr Fire Shasta and Trinity Counties, CA**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible however:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to springs, streams, and rivers but can occur in other areas as well. Prehistoric sites in this area include scatters of chipped stone flakes, circular depressions in the ground, and/or localized areas of dark soil. Gold Rush era historic mining sites include shallow test pits, horizontal adits, and vertical shafts, rock tailing piles, and/or water ditches. Late 19<sup>th</sup> century copper mining sites in the NE incident area include mine adits on the mountain sides, smelter-remains and home/cabin sites for workers near the Sacramento River, and aerial tramway towers (and cable) in between. Historic homestead sites marked by stone foundations, rock chimneys, wells, ditches, and/or old fruit trees can be found throughout the incident area. Several historic cemeteries are present as well.
2. Known sites will be flagged with pink and black striped or red and white striped plastic flagging tape. Note that much of the area has never been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered or flagged.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as they may have been intentionally placed there for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. Note locations of discovered resources on a map. Better yet take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Plans Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Use flagging to mark site.
6. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease ground disturbing work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

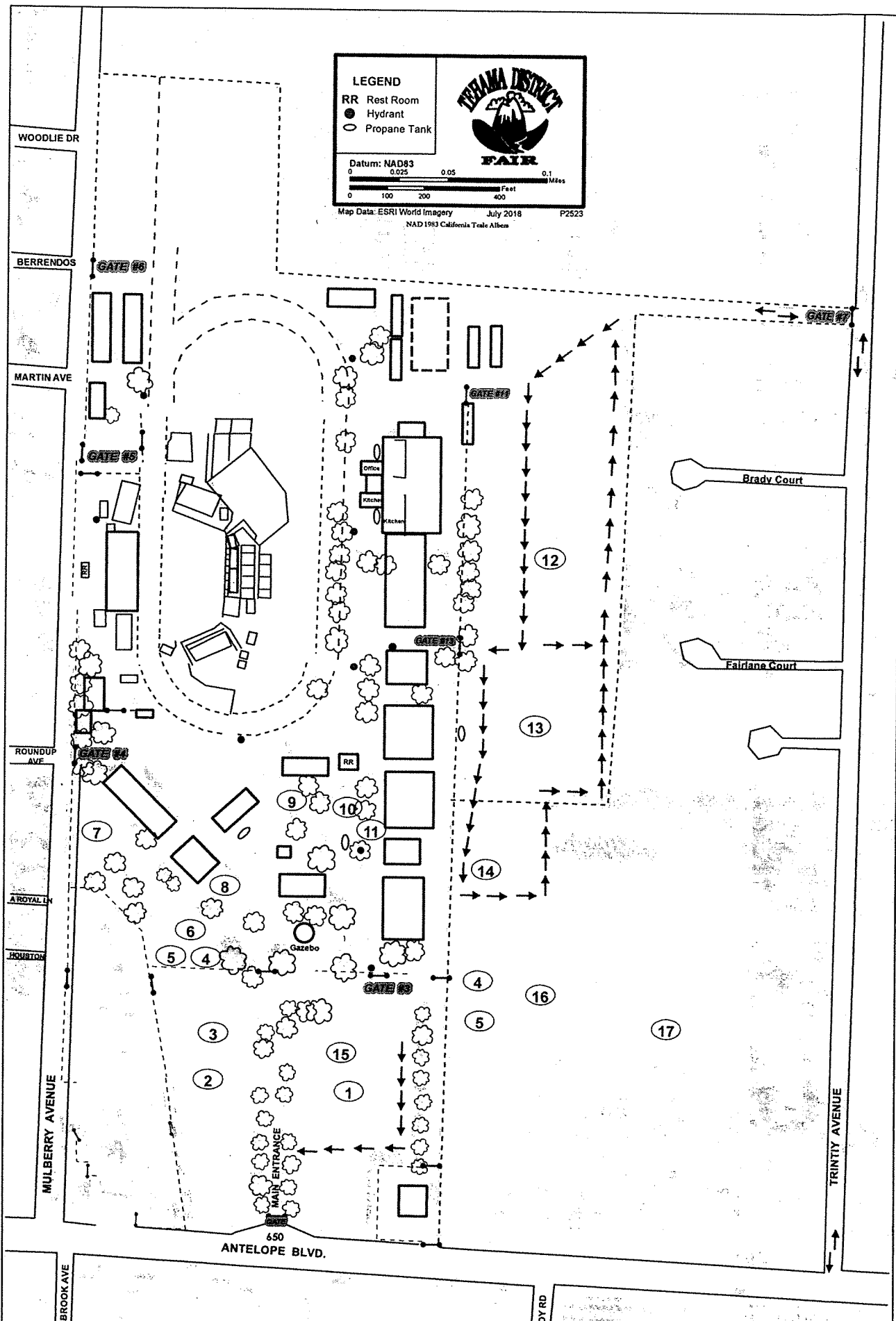

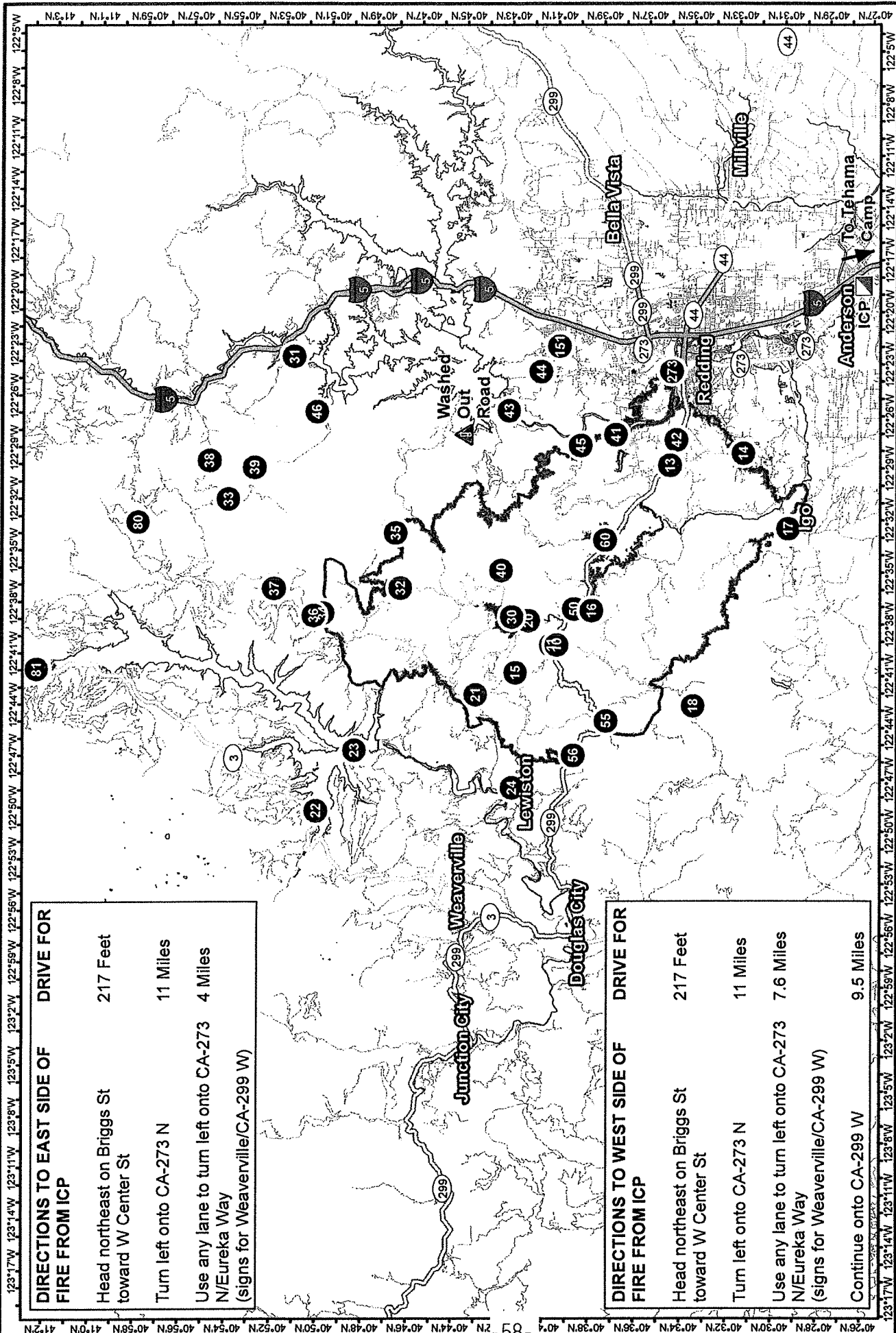

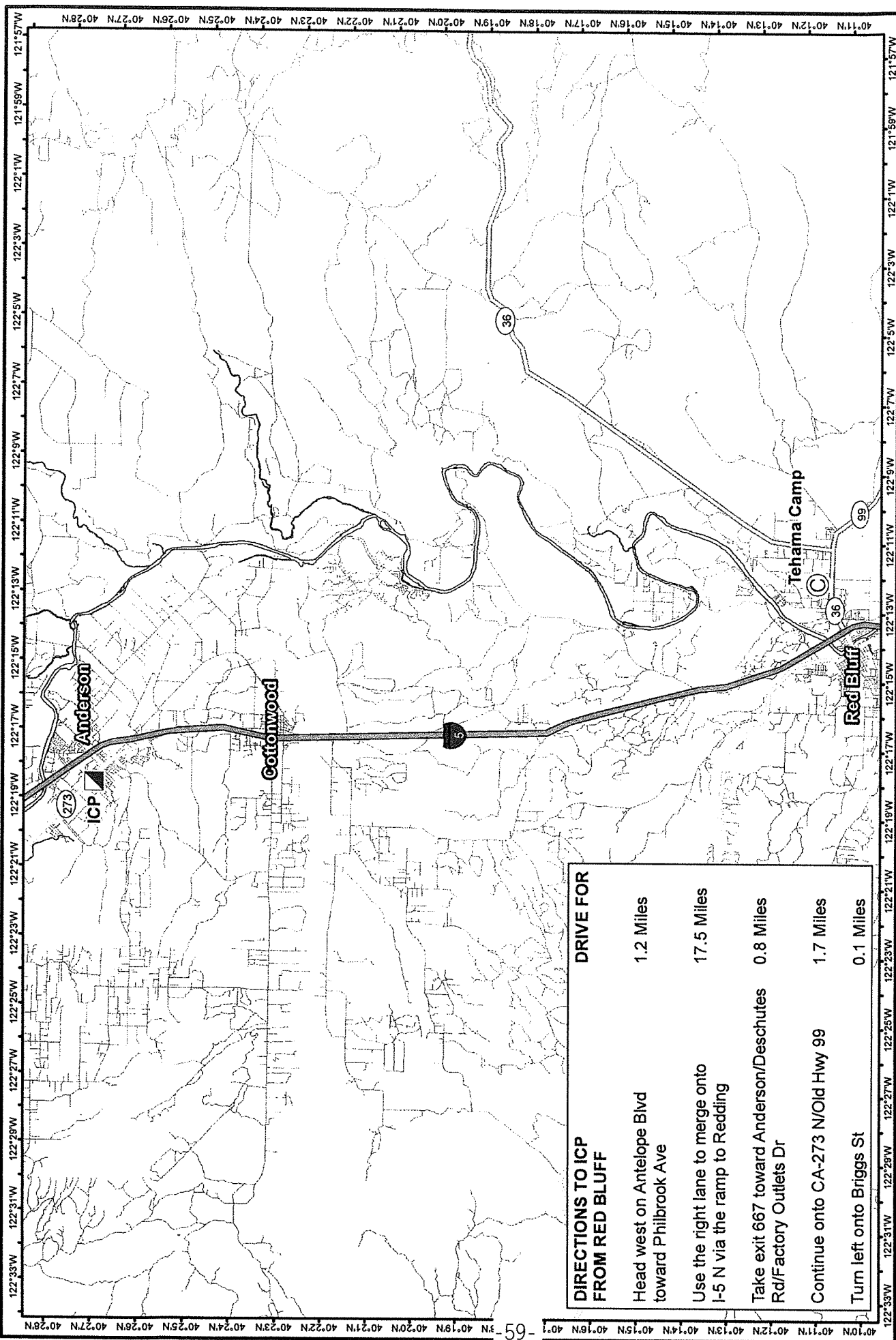
