




**WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RED FLAG WARNING THRU SATURDAY EVENING FOR DRY  
FRONTAL PASSAGE WITH CONTINUED LOW HUMIDITY...**

Red Flag Warning remains in effect today for increasing southerly winds ahead of an incoming dry cool front. **The key time will be late in the burn period from 3-7 pm when southerly winds will turn west to southwest with gusts 25 to 30 mph possible**, especially on any exposed ridges in Branch IV. One of the continued key watch outs today throughout your shift will be to watch for any rapid clearing of smoke that will allow the fire to ventilate. This front may be strong enough to mix the smoke out, which hasn't happened for a few days. However smoke from fires to our south will remain a wildcard. Otherwise weather conditions will remain seasonably hot and dry. Humidity recovery tonight will be moderate with slightly cooler temperatures behind the frontal passage.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY: ...RED FLAG WARNING FOR SHIFTING WINDS...**

**WEATHER:** Smoke and Haze. Continued hot and dry. Winds increasing after 3 pm.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 92-102°F (33-39°C). **LITTLE CHANGE**

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 12-19%. **LITTLE CHANGE**

**EYE-LEVEL WIND:** Downslope/downvalley through 1000, 2-5 mph (3-8km/h). Becoming upslope/upvalley 2-4 gust 6mph (3-7 gust 10 km/h) after 1200. South wind on ridges 5-10 gust 15 mph.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**VALLEY -** Downslope/downvalley 2-5mph (3-8 km/h) early becoming upslope/upvalley 3-5mph with gusts to 10mph (5-8 km/h gust 17 km/h) after 1200.

**MIDSLOPES/RIDGETOP -** S winds 3-6 gust 8mph (5-10 gust 13 km/h) before 1100 increasing to 8-13 gust 20mph (13-21 gust 32km/h) after 1200. Gusts 25-30 mph (40-48 km/h) from 4 pm thru sunset.

**HAINES INDEX:** 4-5 **INVERSION:** Strong inversion breaking after 1500

**FRIDAY NIGHT: ...RED FLAG WARNING FOR SHIFTING AND BREEZY RIDGE WINDS...**

**WEATHER:** Breezy on the ridges at least through sunset. Hazy and clear with moderate RH recovery.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 59-69°F (15-21°C). (Trend of 2-4 degrees cooler)

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 40-60% (Trend of 5% Wetter)

**EYE-LEVEL WIND:** **Downslope/downvalley** 3-7 mph (5-11 km/h) after 2200. Higher winds on ridges.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Downslope/downvalley 3-7 mph (5-11 km/h) after 2200. South winds in the Sacramento River valley and south to north oriented valleys 4-8 gust 11mph (6-13 gust 18km/h).

**RIDGETOP -** South 12-18 **gust 25-30 mph** (19-29 gust 40-48km/h) at least through 10 pm then easing.

**EXTENDED FORECAST: CONTINUED HOT AND DRY**

**SATURDAY:** Hazy with smoke. Max temps...92-102°F (33-39°C). Min RH 8-17%. Gusty south winds 15-20 mph.

Hazards throughout the fire area include: interior green islands and slopes, ash pits, fire weakened trees, dust devils, and roll-out.

New starts will see rapid growth and establishment. Winds will contribute to long range spotting.

### SPECIFIC:

#### Branch I

Smoldering with pockets of activity possible. Stronger winds may see trees topple and hot spots become active. Keep alert to structural hazards, ash pots and fire weakened trees. See Branch II for Division Y specifics.

#### Branch II

Creeping, backing, and smoldering with South winds exposure alignment. Torching and short crown runs may occur. Expect the largest growth to occur as afternoon winds increase. Fuel types convert to lighter and flashier grasses to the south. Dormant heat areas may flare with air movement. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines. Keep alert to unburned islands, fire weakened trees, and dust devils.

#### Branch III

Smoldering with possibility of roll-out across established lines. Keep alert to unburned islands, fire weakened trees, and dust devils.

#### Branch IV and V

Active fire spread with torching/crown runs and increased spotting distances. Smoke shading may briefly temper fire behavior. Look for areas of fuels treatment, timber harvest or previous fire activity for safety or control objectives. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines. Crown fire may see rates of spread up to 50 ch/hr.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate turbulence near Jackass Mtn. (Div. O) and Bohemotash Mtn. (Div. P)

Mixing height: 10,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SSW 15-20 mph, Sunrise 0615, Sunset 2017.

### SAFETY

Changes in fire behavior are often subtly signaled by atmospheric changes that can go unnoticed when firefighters are focused on more tangible effects of fire and terrain.

**MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS**

**LEVELS OF ENGAGEMENT:** Chose the appropriate level of engagement for the actions being taken. Never mentally disengage and always have a good situational awareness of what the fire is doing around you. Know where your escape routes and safety zones are located and share this information with adjoining resources.

**RESOURCE ACCOUNTABILITY:** Give clear instructions and ensure they are understood. Empower and influence your people in the event they need to make time sensitive decisions. Provide Purpose, Direction, and Motivation to fulfill small unit leadership operations.

**DRIVING:** Steep, narrow, dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Roads are being heavily traveled by fire suppression, recovery, and the repopulation. Implement Defensible Driving Practices. Flag off dead end roads.

**HAZARDOUS TREES AND SNAGS:** Be alert of snags and weakened trees caused by high winds and fire impingement. Stay diligent and flag hazardous areas. Avoid taking breaks under trees.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** Utilize human repeaters as necessary. Use proper terminology. Avoid using squirrel channels.


**HYDRATION/NUTRITION/FATIGUE:** Drink plenty of fluids throughout the day and eat accordingly. Balance electrolyte drinks at a 3:1 water to sport drink ratio. Address dehydration and fatigue concerns immediately upon symptom onset. Keep up on personal hygiene.

**LINE EMERGENCIES:** Take the time to discuss and train your people on the proper sequence of events to get help on the line. Review your 206 and Special Medical Emergency Procedures page in the IAP, "LEARN IT, KNOW IT, USE IT".

**FIRE BEHAVIOR/WEATHER:** Watch for winds to increase throughout the day and switch direction much like the previous days weather events. Post look outs, flag escape routes, implement PACE.

**BOAT/WATER SAFETY:** A briefing on the watercraft shall occur prior to departure, PFD's will be worn within 10' of the water line, no watercraft transportation after dark, a weather forecast shall be obtained prior to launching, follow manufacturer recommendations for safe operation.

# STRUCTURE DEFENSE GUIDE

## STRUCTURE TRIAGE DECISION PROCESS (S-FACTS)

### SURVIVAL

- Initial Assessment: can you survive here? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
- Is there a Safety Zone nearby? **If not, LEAVE NOW!** (IRPG)
- Do you have a viable Escape Route?
- What is the decision point at which you will leave based on fire behavior and rate of spread?
- Is there a Temporary Refuge Area (TRA) on site? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
  - Preplanned area for immediate, temporary refuge
    - Use of fire shelter should not be necessary
  - Is there a viable Escape Route to the TRA or Safety Zone?
- Is "Prep and Go" tactic an option?
- Do you have communications with your supervisor and adjoining forces?
- If safety issues cannot be mitigated, **LEAVE NOW!**

### FIRE ENVIRONMENT

- Can you survive based on current and expected fire behavior? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
- Look up, Look Down, Look Around Indicators:
  - Fuels (characteristics, moisture, temperature)
    - What will the intensity of the fire be when it arrives?
    - How long will it take to consume the fuels?
  - Wind
    - Current speed/direction
    - Expect changing winds
  - Terrain
    - Are you in a chute, chimney, or saddle? **If yes, LEAVE NOW!**
    - Is wind in alignment with topography?
    - What is your position relative to topography?
    - Are you mid slope or on top of a ridge?
  - Atmospheric Stability
  - Fire Behavior (requires constant monitoring)
    - Spotting, crowning, sheeting, rate of spread?
    - Flame length and height?
- Other weather considerations:
  - What is the current relative humidity?
    - Is there an expected change?
  - Are thunderstorms forecasted?

### ACCESS

- Is access compatible with time and distance factors necessary to utilize as an Escape Route to a Safety Zone?
  - Road surface adequate for speed necessary?
  - Adequate width?
  - Turnaround/turnouts?
  - Bridges within limits for fire apparatus?
  - Drainage ditches/culverts?
  - Steep grades?
  - Is there a safe place to spot apparatus?

## CONSTRUCTION/CLEARANCE

- Does the structure have adequate defensible space, based on topography, fuels, and current and expected fire behavior?
- Can defensible space problems be mitigated quickly?
- Will building materials and yard clutter compromise safety?
- Is the construction wood siding or shake shingle roof?
- Are there vent openings, open eaves, large glass windows facing fire front, decks with vegetation below?
  - Will ember intrusion through attic or foundation vents be a problem?
- What are the contents in the garage and outbuildings?
- Are there hazardous materials present?
- Are there propane tanks, fuel tanks, or power lines?
- Is there an adequate water supply nearby?
- Are additional resources needed to mitigate issues?
- Consider "Prep and Go" or "Prep and Defend" tactics

## TIME CONSTRAINTS

- Is there time for an adequate size up of the structure defense problem?
- Is there time to mitigate safety concerns?
- Is there time and adequate resources to properly prepare and defend the structure?
- Is there time to escape, utilizing Escape Routes, to a Safety Zone? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**

## STAY OR GO

- Tactical decision based on the S-FACTS
- Is it safe to stay? If no, utilize "Check and Go" tactic
- Is there time to prepare the structure for defense and what will the fire behavior be when the fire gets here?
- "Prep and Go" or "Fire Front Following" tactics should be used when it is not safe to "Prep and Defend"

## STRUCTURE TRIAGE CATEGORIES

### **Not-Threatened**

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space make the structure unlikely to ignite
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

### **Threatened Defensible**

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space require structure defense tactics during fire front impact
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

### **Threatened non-Defensible**

- Lack of adequate Safety Zone nearby
- Structure cannot be safely defended
- Residents must be evacuated

## ENTRAPMENT AVOIDANCE

- Are you adhering to the **10 Standard Firefighting Orders?** (IRPG)
- Have you considered the **18 Situations that Shout Watch Out?**
- Have you considered the **Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires?** (IRPG)
- Are you maintaining **LCES?** (IRPG)
- Look Up, Look Down, Look Around (IRPG)
- Have Decision Points ("Trigger Points") been established?
- Conduct Risk Management (IRPG)
  - Situational Awareness – Hazard Assessment – Hazard Control – Decision Point – Evaluate

## DEMOB PROCEDURES

- CHECK THE DEMOB LIST EACH MORNING. YOU CAN FIND THE DEMOB LIST THROUGH THE “QR” CODE ON THE I.A.P. COVER OR ON LISTS POSTED THROUGHOUT CAMP. **ONLY REPORT TO DEMOB AT YOUR SCHEDULED TIME.** EARLY ADMITTANCE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.
- REPORT TO DEMOB AT APPOINTMENT TIME TO RECEIVE A CHECKOUT FORM (ICS-221), THEN GO TO THE FOLLOWING UNITS TO OBTAIN THE NECESSARY SIGNATURES:

- **DO NOT REPORT FOR VEHICLE INSPECTION PRIOR TO YOUR APPOINTMENT**

The gravity of this event is large. Many of us have been impacted by the events that have occurred as well as past incidents.

A peer support team has been assembled and Peers are available at the ICP. The Peer Support contact number is (916)-591-9004, which is available 24/7.

Some of the signs and symptoms you may be experiencing include, but are not limited to:

Irritability, lack of sleep, quick to anger, withdrawal, above average tobacco use, an increase in negative coping mechanisms such as excessive alcohol and/or substance abuse. You might experience lack of appetite, isolate yourself, and various other unexplained responses to normal every day events.

You may not be experiencing these symptoms now or during this fire incident. However, you may find yourself experiencing them when you return to your home or unit. You may find yourself being triggered by a past event that has impacted you, while assigned to future incidents. A sight, sound, smell, or touch could trigger a memory that previously existed, but you may not have been aware of.

If you find yourself in this situation and need to talk to someone contact your Employee Assistance Program (EAP). EAP programs are here to help. It is important to be able to talk to someone and get stuff off your chest vs carrying this around for your career.

## **Cultural and Historic Properties: Fireline Guidance for the Carr Fire Shasta and Trinity Counties, CA**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible however:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to springs, streams, and rivers but can occur in other areas as well. Prehistoric sites in this area include scatters of chipped stone flakes, circular depressions in the ground, and/or localized areas of dark soil. Gold Rush era historic mining sites include shallow test pits, horizontal adits, and vertical shafts, rock tailing piles, and/or water ditches. Late 19<sup>th</sup> century copper mining sites in the NE incident area include mine adits on the mountain sides, smelter-remains and home/cabin sites for workers near the Sacramento River, and aerial tramway towers (and cable) in between. Historic homestead sites marked by stone foundations, rock chimneys, wells, ditches, and/or old fruit trees can be found throughout the incident area. Several historic cemeteries are present as well.
2. Known sites will be flagged with pink and black striped or red and white striped plastic flagging tape. Note that much of the area has never been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered or flagged.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as they may have been intentionally placed there for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. Note locations of discovered resources on a map. Better yet take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist with the Plans Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Use flagging to mark site.
6. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease ground disturbing work in the area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

1200-1400 Open to public (one-way pilot car)

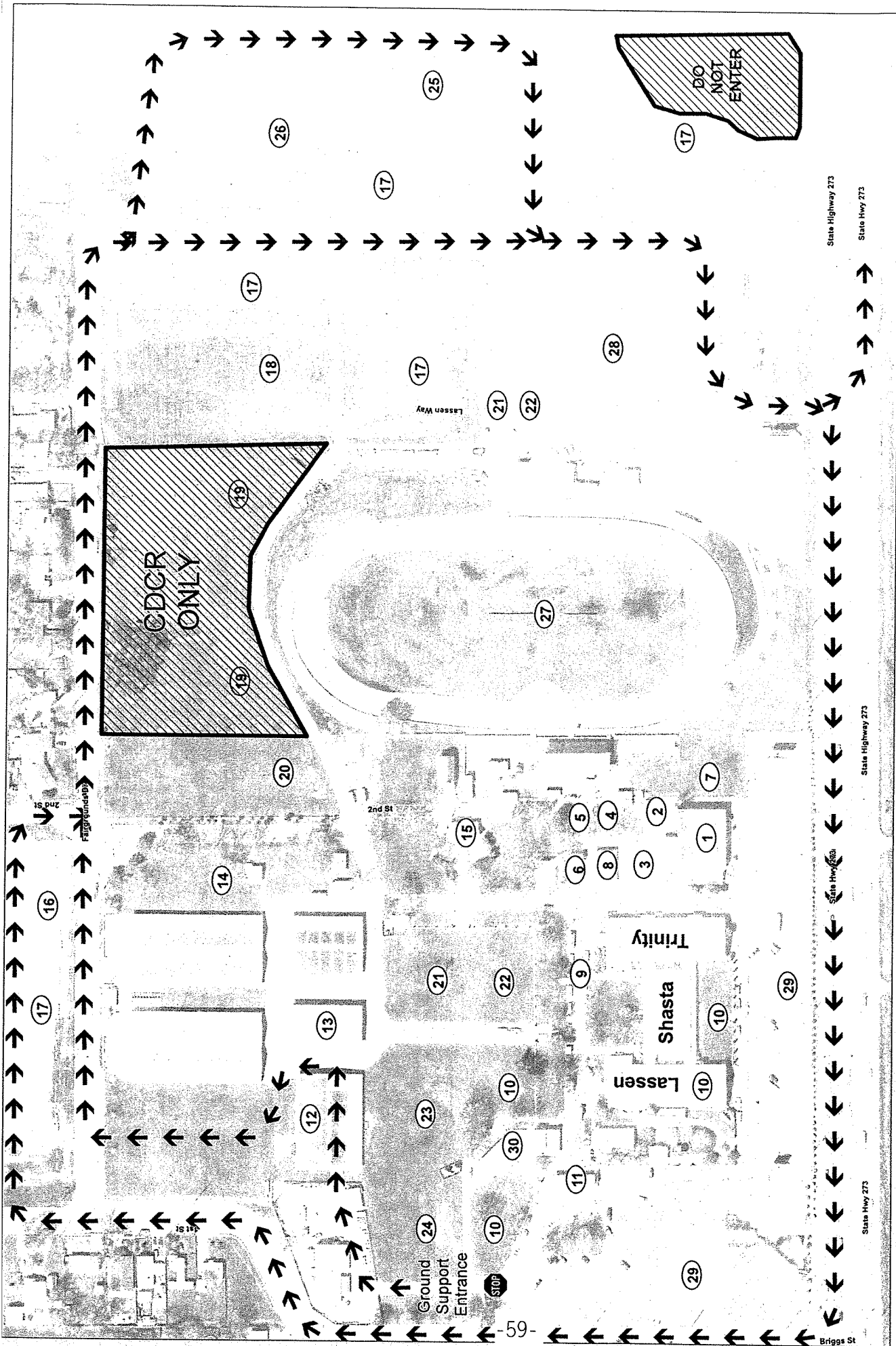
1400-1800 No public traffic
