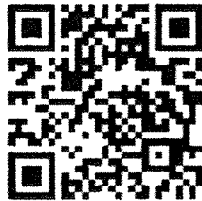



Fire Weather Forecast

WEATHER DISCUSSION: No big forecast changes today with smoke being the driving factor for much of the associated fire behavior. The inversion will still be strong for much of the day but may break later this afternoon as an upper level weather system passes through. The biggest weather related threat will likely continue to be heat related illness as hot temperatures, poor air quality and lack of sleep weaken the immune system. Temperatures will warm into the 90s once again with smoke being the limiting factor for hotter temperatures while also limiting solar pre-heating of fuels. Humidity values will bottom out around 15% again during the late afternoon as diurnal/southerly upvalley winds develop. The peak burn period looks to begin around 1600 hours as the inversion weakens, winds are strongest and temp/humidity peak. For tonight expect slightly stronger winds this evening as the upper level weather system moves through which will also lead to better humidity recovery compared to the last two nights.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR SUNDAY:

WEATHER: Heavy smoke. Continued hot and dry. Southerly winds developing after 1400 hours.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 88 smokey areas above 3000 ft to 97°F below 1000 ft. 2-4 degrees cooler.

MIN HUMIDITY: 12-21%. Trend of 2-4% wetter.

20-FOOT WIND:

VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley 2-5 mph early becoming upslope/upvalley 3-5 mph with gusts to 10 mph after 1400.

MIDSLOPES/RIDGETOP- Northerly winds 2-5 gust 7 mph before 1000 becoming South 5-8 gusts 12-14 mph after 1400.

HAINES INDEX: 4 **LAL:** 1 **INVERSION:** Strong inversion slowly lifting after 1400

SUNDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Smoke settling over the fire area and ICP. Otherwise clear with poor RH recovery.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 62-68°F. Little change

MAX HUMIDITY: 40-50% Trend of 10-15% wetter

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley 2-5 mph after 2200. Then North 2-5 mph overnight.

RIDGETOP - Southwest 4-8 gust 12 mph through sunset. Turning Northerly 3-6 gust 8-10 mph late.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY: A more seasonable weather pattern is forecast to develop early next week with a weak trough of low pressure over Oregon. This will translate to seasonable daytime highs from the upper 80s to mid 90s. Afternoon humidity will lower 15-25% with moderate night time recovery around 50%. Winds look to remain fairly light and diurnally driven with afternoon southerly winds turning light northerly drainage at night. Haines indices of 3 anticipated.

SAFETY MESSAGE: Watch for signs of the inversion breaking late today and use that as a trigger point. Monitor humidity trends, especially afternoon and overnight. There is also a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for the region. Heat related issues may be the highest weather related threat for mop-up operations. Focus on hydration!

OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Fuels and topography driven activity.

Hazards throughout the fire area include: interior green islands and slopes, ash pits, fire weakened trees, dust devils, and roll-out.

New starts will see rapid growth and establishment. Smoke columns will contribute to long range spotting.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I, II & III

Interior smoldering activity. Dormant heat areas may flare with air movement. Interior islands and green slopes with wind exposure alignment may see activity. Expect most activity to occur as afternoon winds increase and smoke clears. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines. Keep alert to unburned islands, fire weakened trees, ash pits, and dust devils.

Branch IV and V

Significant smoke coverage will temper fire behavior. Keep alert to unanticipated smoke clearing that will see increase in fires' activity. Predominately surface fire spread. Expect areas with understory preheating via slash piles, fuel jackpots or topography to transition into canopy. Interior Torching and short crown runs possible. Look for areas of fuels treatment, timber harvest or previous fire activity for safety or control objectives. Roll-out and spotting potential across established lines. Anticipate locations above drainages to be susceptible spotting areas.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Most of fire area should remain smoked in for majority of burn period. Break in inversion not anticipated. Mixing height: 8,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 5-10 mph, Sunrise 0624, Sunset 2005.

SAFETY

For new starts, light flashy 1-hour fuels are the primary carrier of fire.
Rapid action is paramount before establishment in heavier fuels.

MAJOR HAZARDS and RISKS: STEEP and ROCKY TERRAIN – TIGHT NARROW ROADS- FATIGUE

“Leadership is a responsibility to do more, not an excuse to do less”

- Hazard Trees- Identify and notify supervisor of all hazard trees. Use appropriate flagging when it can be safely done. If falling trees, stay within certified falling capabilities.
- Stay hydrated and monitor for fatigue.
- While working and driving be alert for rolling materials and rocks. Remain vigilant while driving within the fire and while traveling to and from the incident.
- Ash pits are an inherent and hidden risk to firefighters that can cause serious burns and injuries. Wear all PPE. Flag hazardous areas and watch for stumps that have been smoldering for multiple days
- Identify and notify immediate supervisor of any downed lines, treat as if energized.
- Demob: Complete good walk arounds of vehicle prior to leaving and periodically during travel.
- Boat/Water Safety: A briefing on the watercraft shall occur prior to departure. PFD's will be worn within 10' of the water line. Watercraft transportation is available after dark for emergencies only. A weather forecast shall be obtained prior to launching. Follow manufacturer recommendations for safe operation

My Safety

An important aspect of safety is individual responsibility for one's own health & safety. Some of those individual responsibilities are:

Fitness for duty. Begin each work shift both mentally and physically prepared. Get adequate sleep, maintain a healthy diet, and utilization of personal protective equipment. Wear your PPE without being told. Each individual is responsible for performing their own risk assessments. If a hazard is identified that can be mitigated by wearing a particular PPE component it should be utilized. Fireline supervisors have more important duties to focus on other than performing glove patrol.

If you are unsure of how to perform a job task safely, ask your supervisor or experienced coworker. It is your responsibility to ask questions if you do not understand the task requested of you.

Escape Route/Safety Zone Checklist

- *More than one escape route
- *Scouted – soils, vegetation, slope
- *Timed – slowest person, fatigue, dozer speed
- *Marked – flagged for day and night use

Safety Zone:


- *Survivable without a shelter

The gravity of this event is large. Many of us have been impacted by the events that have occurred as well as past incidents.

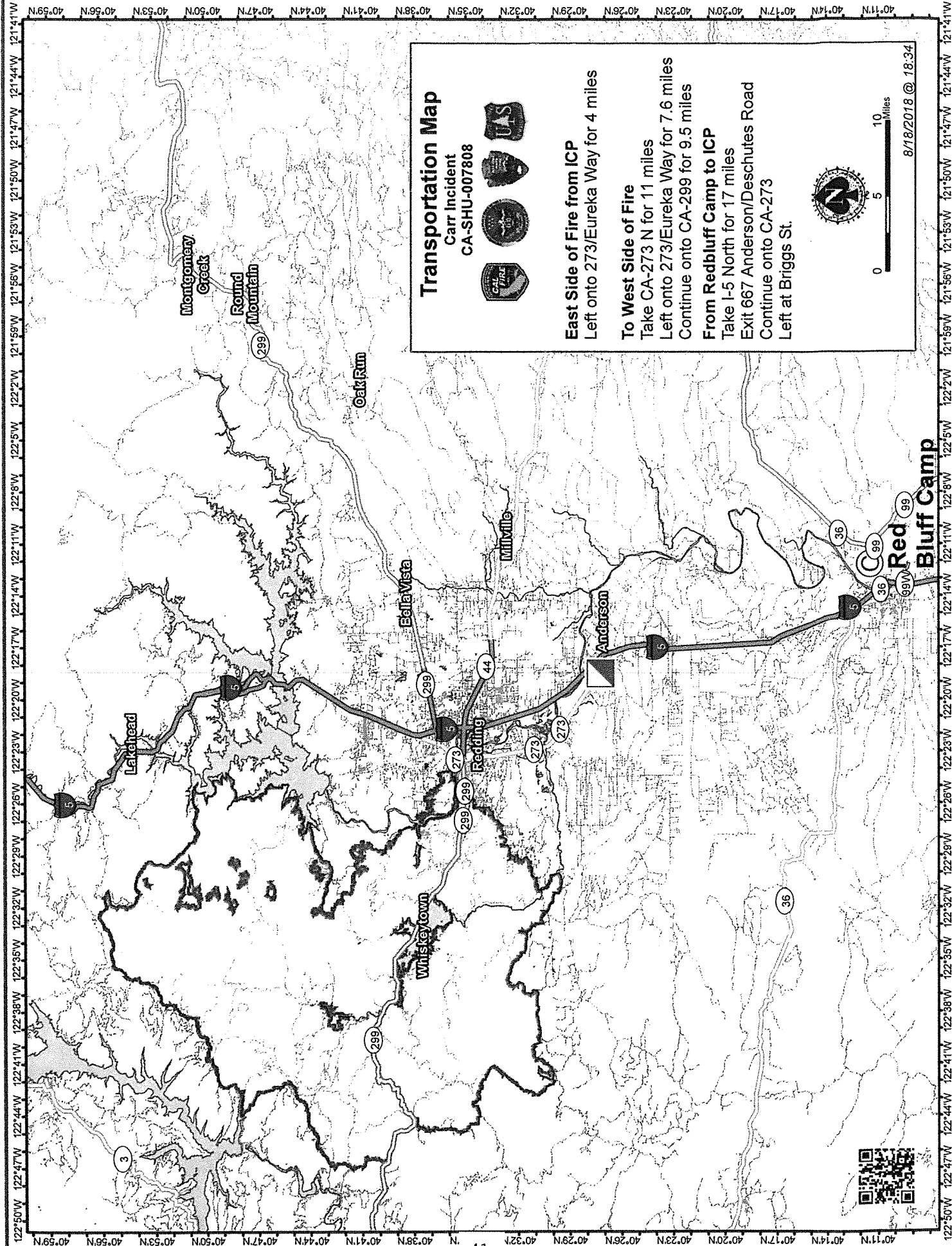
A peer support team has been assembled and Peers are available at the ICP. The Peer Support contact number is (916)-591-9004, which is available 24/7.

You may not be experiencing these symptoms now or during this fire incident. However, you may find yourself experiencing them when you return to your home or unit. You may find yourself being triggered by a past event that has impacted you, while assigned to future incidents. A sight, sound, smell, or touch could trigger a memory that previously existed, but you may not have been aware of.

If you find yourself in this situation and need to talk to someone contact your Employee Assistance Program (EAP). EAP programs are here to help. It is important to be able to talk to someone and get stuff off your chest vs carrying this around for your career.

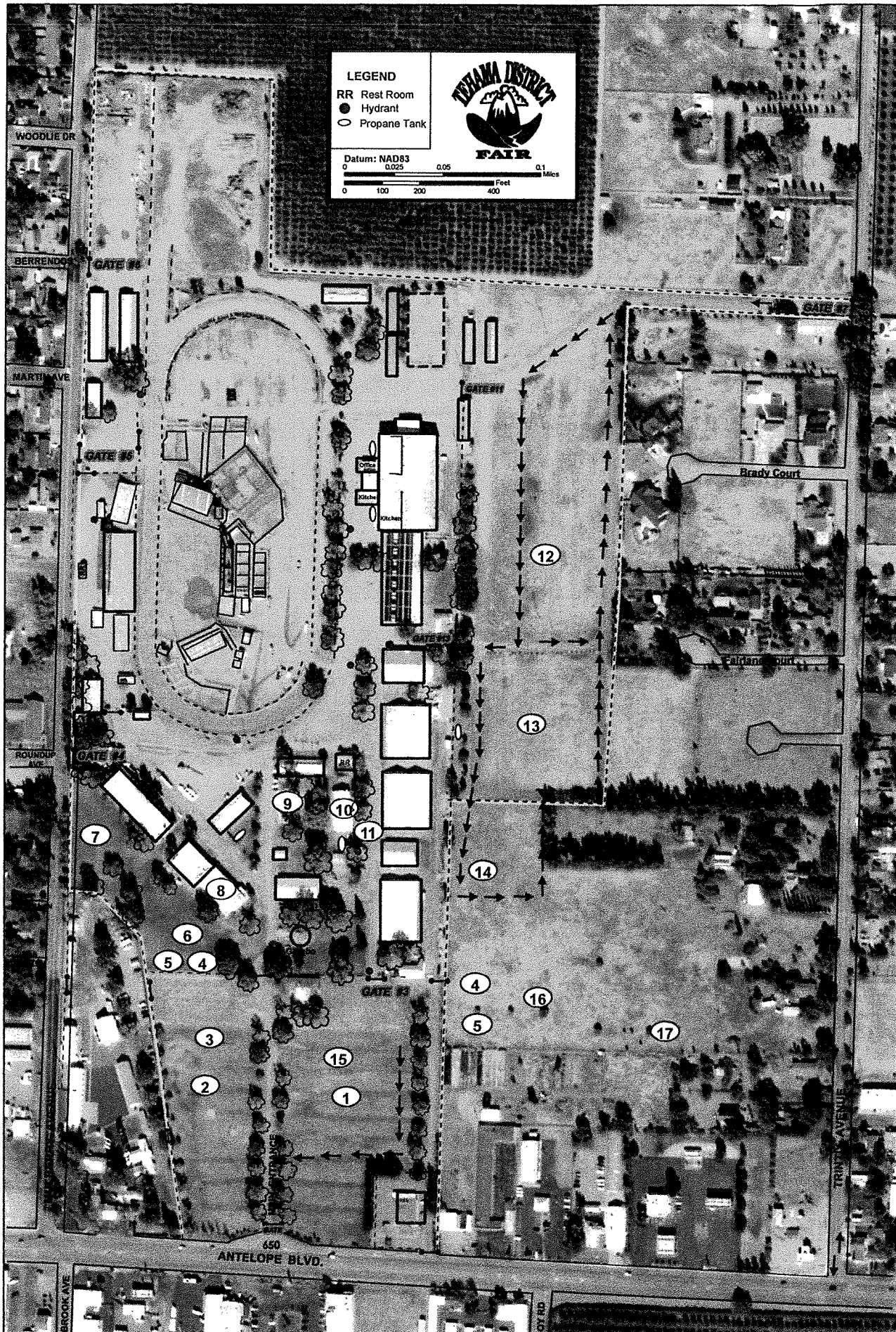

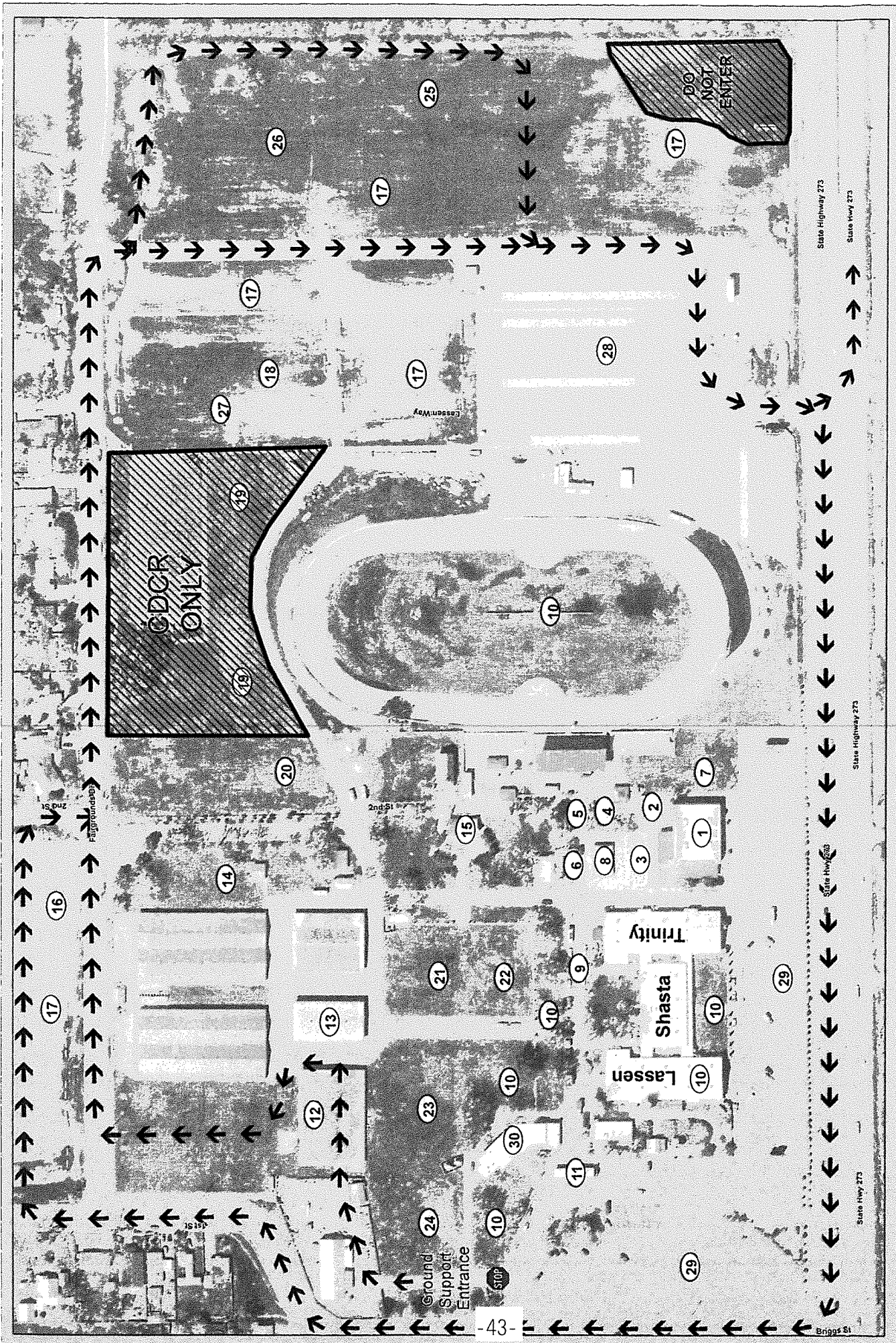
