



**WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...LOCAL RED FLAG WARNING FOR CARR FIRE FROM 1500 TO 2400...  
...EXCESSIVE HEAT WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT...**

Critical fire weather conditions are expected for today due to extreme dryness, heat, and locally gusty winds late this afternoon and evening. Winds will become gusty late this afternoon and into the evening as the thermal gradient tightens up over the fire area, especially in favored gaps and passes. By the early morning hours, winds will shift out of the north and become steady through Saturday morning. Very similar conditions are expected for the next few days. There is no rain in the forecast for at least the next 7 days.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY: ...INCREASING WEST WINDS LATE IN THE DAY...**

**WEATHER:** Sunny with smoke through the day.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 105-110°F. 3 DEG COOLER

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 6-10%. LITTLE CHANGE

**EYE-LEVEL WIND:** North 2-4 mph in the morning, becoming calm from 1200-1600. Winds increasing after 1600 from the West 4-8 mph with gusts to 12 mph.

**20-FOOT WIND:**

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** North 4-8 mph in the morning with gusts up to 20 mph, then becoming light from 1200-1600. Winds increasing again after 1600 from the West 10-15 mph with gusts 20 mph.



## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Fuels in the area range from grass in the lower elevations (cured), decadent brush in mid elevations (nearing critical), and stands of grey pine in the upper elevations and on the Northern aspects.

The topography in the fire area is steep and rugged. The drainages can be narrow and will funnel predominant winds. Ridgetops are also narrow, expect slop overs and spots on fire challenged ridgetops.

Observed fire behavior yesterday (7/26) included growth to the East under Westerly winds. Although wind played a factor, major growth is due to dry fuels and the position of the fire in relation to normal outflow winds from the West. Spotting of up to 1 mile and extreme fire behavior has been reported.

Expect similar conditions today as the fire will continue to be influenced by similar weather, fuels and terrain.

#### SPECIFIC:

##### Branch I

The fire south of the lake near Boulder Creek should be sheltered from the Westerly winds. Expect any growth or fire behavior to be fuels and terrain driven. If fire becomes established in the clear creek drainage expect significant runs due to strong downcanyon winds.

##### Branch II

Fire growth not expected, minimal fire activity.

##### Branch III

The fire will make advances to the north primarily through flanking fire. If the fire becomes established north of Cline gulch expect uphill runs to grow the fire northerly much more rapidly than the last several days.

The fire will continue to move east with uphill runs, backing and spotting. A Westerly push is expected again around 1700 hrs and will continue until after dark. When the fire enters the Sacramento River drainage it will be sheltered from the west wind but will be influenced by a Northerly wind down river from Shasta Lake. If the fire crosses the Sacramento river, fuels begin to decrease and suppression opportunities may become available.

##### Branch IV

The fire South of Hwy 299 near the Visitor center has the potential to become established in the Clear Creek drainage. If this happens expect rapid growth as it will be influenced by strong down canyon winds.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Inversion in the morning breaking with clear air around 1300hrs.

## SAFETY

Fuels are highly receptive to spot fires, post lookouts to monitor for this.

Safety Zones and Escape Routes need to be adjusted to account for rapid growth in rough terrain.



### MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS

#### Extreme Fire Behavior/Weather

Monitor weather for wind shifts, building columns, temperature changes, and decreased RH's throughout the day. Expect fuel and terrain driven fire, have a contingency plan with established decision points and safety zones.

#### Hydration/Nutrition/Fatigue

**EXTREME HEAT:** Drink plenty of fluids throughout the day, take tactical pauses to rehydrate and eat accordingly. Address dehydration and fatigue concerns immediately upon symptom onset, do not delay treatment for dehydration emergencies.

#### Situational Awareness/Accountability

Ensure Personal, Personnel, and Resource Accountability is being conducted due to extreme fire behavior and new resources arriving to the incident. Know who you are working for, make sure your assignment is clear, maintain crew integrity, and discourage freelancing.

#### Driving

Steep, narrow, one-way, dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing low visibility roadways. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Use caution and slow for uncontrolled intersections.

#### Hazardous Trees/Snags

Identify, Communicate, and flag hazardous trees. Avoid parking or taking breaks under trees. Mitigate hazards when possible with qualified felling personnel.

#### Mines/Hazardous Materials


Conduct thorough size up of working areas. Flag and make notifications of hazardous areas found on the line. Use caution when working around the plant on Iron Mountain.

#### Public in and around fire area

Be familiar with evacuation routes, give yourself plenty of time for escape and implement PACE due to possible delays because of heavy traffic and pedestrians around fire.



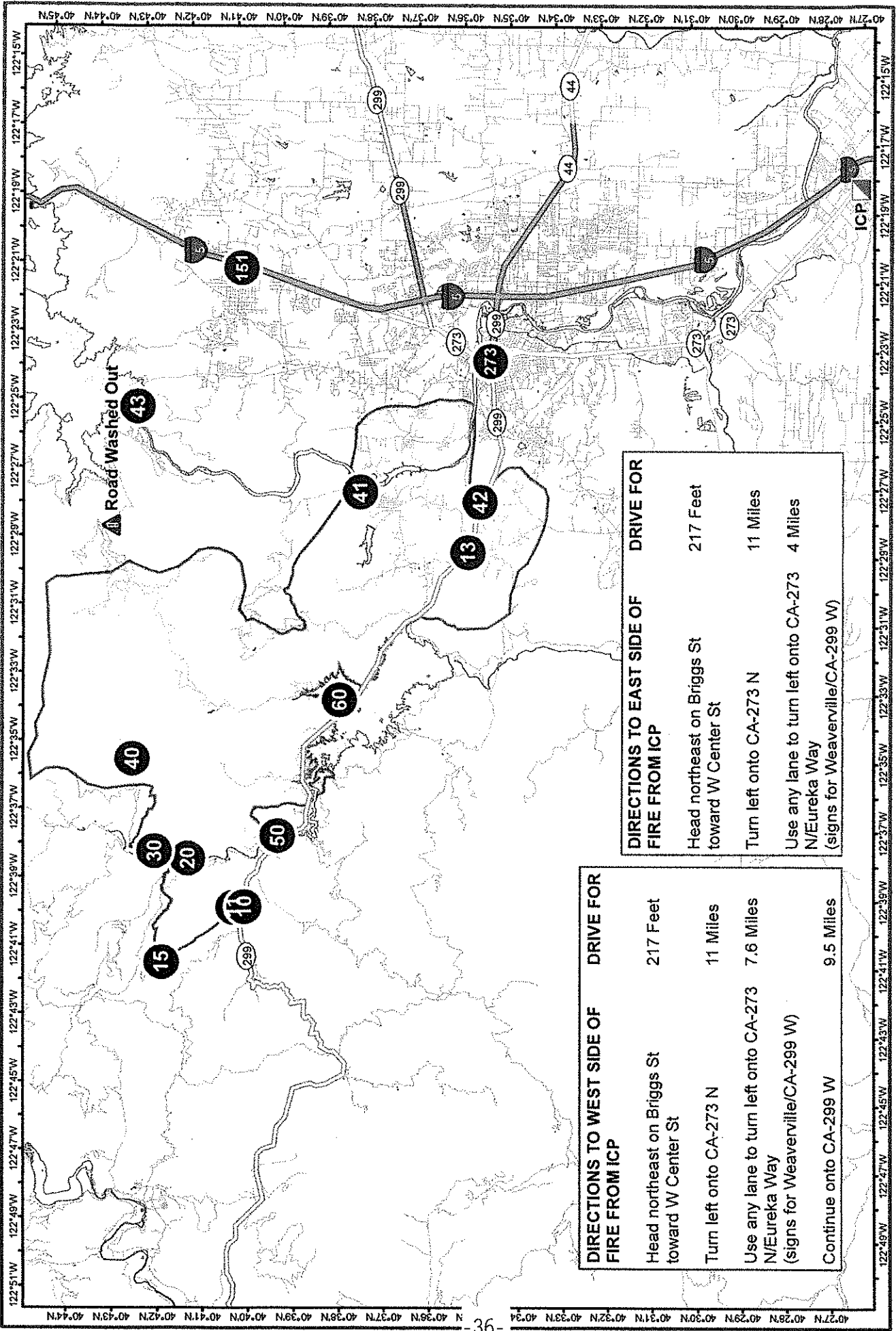
