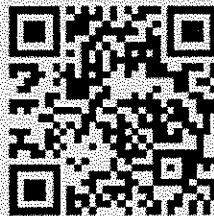

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

WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RED FLAG WARNING IN EFFECT THROUGH MONDAY MORNING...
...HEAT ADVISORY IN EFFECT THROUGH SUNDAY...

Critical fire weather conditions continue again for today due to dryness, heat, unstable conditions and locally gusty winds during the late afternoon and evening. Heavy smoke over the region has kept temperatures cooler, provided good shading for the fuels, and kept the thermal low from strengthening over the valley. This heavy smoke will continue for the next couple days, with only limited improvements to visibility. The atmosphere is primed for unstable conditions (HAINES 6) and plume dominated fire if we do get any clear air and alignment of the fire with fuels and topography. If a plume develops, the fire can produce it's own weather, including strong localized winds and whirlwinds. Northwest winds will kick in this evening and continue into the early morning hours with north winds by sunrise that are coming out of the drainages. Similar weather for the next 7 days.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR SUNDAY: ...UNSTABLE CONDITIONS WITH LATE AFTERNOON WINDS...

WEATHER: Sunny and smokey, especially in Branch 2 and 4. Some clearing in the afternoon possible.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 97-102°F. LITTLE CHANGE

MIN HUMIDITY: 8-13%. LITTLE CHANGE

EYE-LEVEL WIND: North 2-5 mph in the morning, becoming Southeast from 1100-1800. Winds increasing after 1800 from the West 4-8 mph with gusts to 12 mph.

20-FOOT WIND:
SLOPE/VALLEY - North 4-8 mph in the morning with gusts up to 20 mph, then becoming light from 1200-1600. Winds increasing again after 1700 from the West 10-15 mph with gusts 20 mph.

OUTPUTS

GENERAL: **Conditions exist for Plume Dominated Fire Behavior**

Fuels in the area range from grass in the lower elevations (cured), decadent brush in mid elevations (nearing critical), and stands of grey pine in the upper elevations and on the Northern aspects. All critically dry.

The topography in the fire area is steep and rugged. The drainages can be narrow and will funnel predominant winds. Ridgetops are also narrow, expect slop overs and spots on fire challenged ridgetops.

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

SPECIFIC:

Branch I

As the fire moves southward it will enter the "Arbuckle Wind" corridor. Anticipate more free air conditions from the west/northwest starting approximately 1700-1100. Fire is established in the Clear Creek Drainage and will move with down canyon winds to the south, expect the largest growth to occur overnight as down canyon winds increase. Fuel types convert to lighter and flashier grasses to the south.

Branch II

The fire will follow terrain and move to the West towards Hoadley Peak and County Line Road. Early morning solar heating with upslope/up canyon winds may test established lines to the west. Afternoon West winds will change conditions to downslope backburning and remove smoke shading.

Branch III

Growth to the North will see a fuel type conversion into timber and slash models. The Sheep fire of 1999 will have heavier timber litter slowing rates of spread. Torching could occur contributing to increased spotting distances.

Branch IV

Smoldering activity with pockets of activity possible. Keep alert to structural hazards and ash pots.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Best chances for clear air will be on the West side of the fire. Late in the afternoon may bring chances of clear air on the South side of the fire.

Mixing height: 3-5,000 ft., Transport winds: SW 10mph, Sunrise 0604, Sunset 2030.

SAFETY

Alignments must be identified for safe engagement.
Continually reevaluate escape routes based on changing fire behavior.

Identify, Communicate, and flag hazardous trees. Avoid parking or taking breaks under trees. Mitigate hazards when possible with qualified felling personnel.

Line Construction

Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel, use downhill line construction checklist (IRPG pg.8). Follow "Look Up, Look Down, Look Around" procedures (IRPG pg 2-3). Utilize Risk Management Process (IRPG pg 1)

Public in and around fire area

Be familiar with evacuation routes, give yourself plenty of time for escape and implement PACE due to possible delays because of heavy traffic and pedestrians around fire.




 - Use of fire shelter should not be necessary
 - Is there a viable Escape Route to the TRA or Safety Zone?
- Is "Prep and Go" tactic an option?
- Do you have communications with your supervisor and adjoining forces?
- If safety issues cannot be mitigated, **LEAVE NOW!**

FIRE ENVIRONMENT

- Can you survive based on current and expected fire behavior? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**
- Look up, Look Down, Look Around Indicators:
 - Fuels (characteristics, moisture, temperature)

 - Is wind in alignment with topography?
 - What is your position relative to topography?
 - Are you mid slope or on top of a ridge?
 - Atmospheric Stability
 - Fire Behavior (requires constant monitoring)
 - Spotting, crowning, sheeting, rate of spread?
 - Flame length and height?
- Other weather considerations:
 - What is the current relative humidity?
 - Is there an expected change?
 - Are thunderstorms forecasted?

ACCESS

- Is access compatible with time and distance factors necessary to utilize as an Escape Route to a Safety Zone?
 - Road surface adequate for speed necessary?
 - Adequate width?
 - Turnaround/turnouts?
 - Bridges within limits for fire apparatus?
 - Drainage ditches/culverts?
 - Steep grades?
 - Is there a safe place to spot apparatus?

CONSTRUCTION/CLEARANCE

- Does the structure have adequate defensible space, based on topography, fuels, and current and expected fire behavior?
- Can defensible space problems be mitigated quickly?
- Will building materials and yard clutter compromise safety?
- Is the construction wood siding or shake shingle roof?
- Are there vent openings, open eaves, large glass windows facing fire front, decks with vegetation below?
 - Will ember intrusion through attic or foundation vents be a problem?
- What are the contents in the garage and outbuildings?
- Are there hazardous materials present?
- Are there propane tanks, fuel tanks, or power lines?
- Is there an adequate water supply nearby?
- Are additional resources needed to mitigate issues?
- Consider "Prep and Go" or "Prep and Defend" tactics

TIME CONSTRAINTS

- Is there time for an adequate size up of the structure defense problem?
- Is there time to mitigate safety concerns?
- Is there time and adequate resources to properly prepare and defend the structure?
- Is there time to escape, utilizing Escape Routes, to a Safety Zone? **If not, LEAVE NOW!**

STAY OR GO

- Tactical decision based on the S-FACTS
- Is it safe to stay? If no, utilize "Check and Go" tactic
- Is there time to prepare the structure for defense and what will the fire behavior be when the fire gets here?
- "Prep and Go" or "Fire Front Following" tactics should be used when it is not safe to "Prep and Defend"

STRUCTURE TRIAGE CATEGORIES

Not-Threatened

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space make the structure unlikely to ignite
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

Threatened Defensible

- Safety Zone nearby and TRA present at structure
- Construction features/defensible space require structure defense tactics during fire front impact
- Residents may/may not have evacuated

Threatened non-Defensible

- Lack of adequate Safety Zone nearby
- Structure cannot be safely defended
- Residents must be evacuated
