

I started my interpretation with the 08/23/2018 IR heat perimeter. No new growth.


On the following maps yellow is 8/23/2018's IR heat perimeter. Red line is current IR heat perimeter.

There is a couple of isolated heat sources on the south side of the fire outside the main heat perimeter north and south of Cottonwood Creek.




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Light scattered heat throughout the fire. Most of the heat is on the north and northwest side of the fire.
