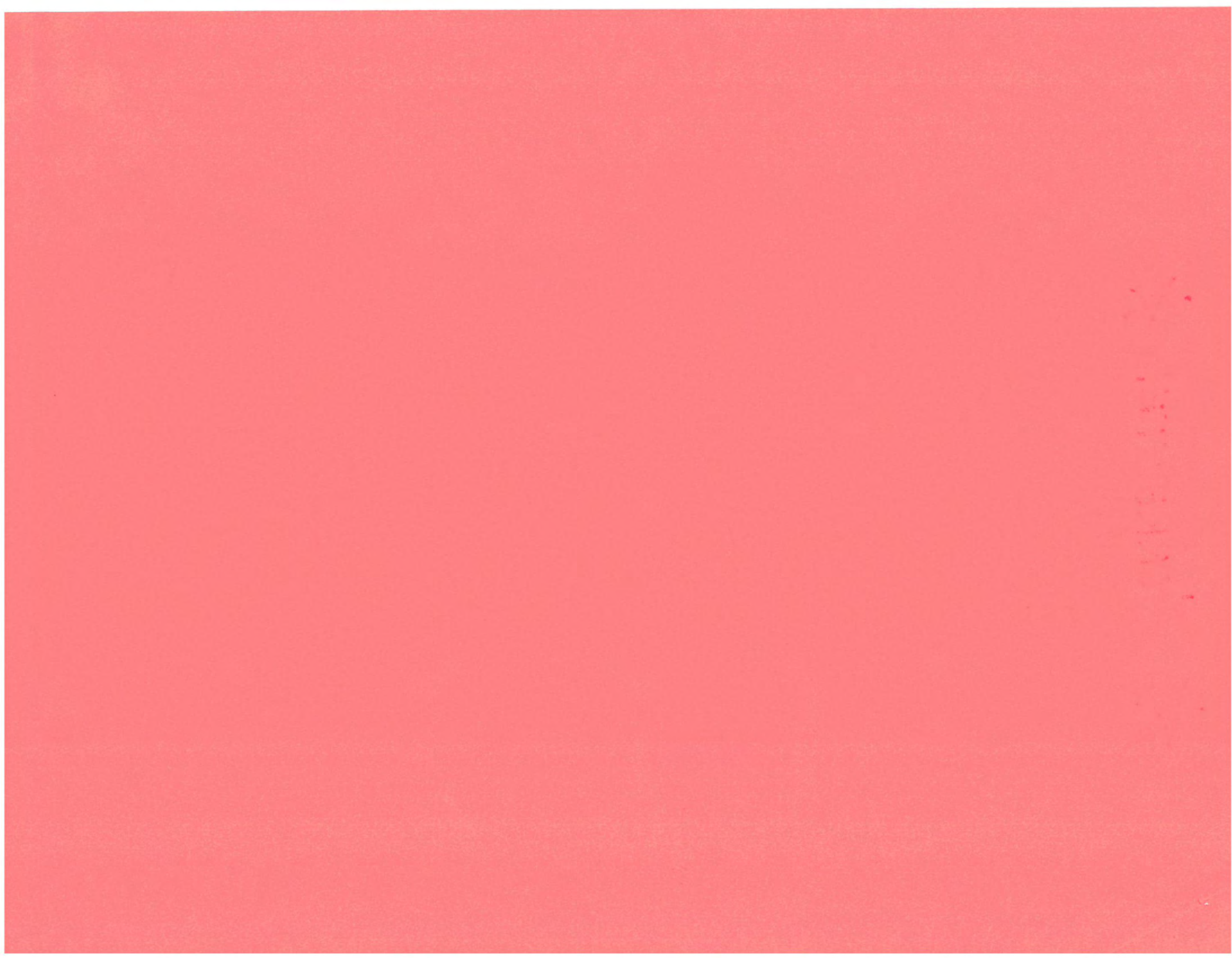

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A weak upper level trough will pass north of the fire today. The main impact of this system will be to increase winds. Winds will shift from a southeasterly direction in the morning to a southwesterly direction early this afternoon then northwesterly late this afternoon and tonight. Wind speeds will be higher than experienced the last couple of days with the strongest winds likely across Division T and to a lesser extent across Division U. Otherwise, persistent temperatures can be expected with slightly higher relative humidity.

A noticeable warming trend is expected from Wednesday through Saturday. Additionally, there will be an increase in mid-level monsoonal moisture by Friday and Saturday which could produce an isolated thunderstorm on and around the fire perimeter.

MANZANITA FUEL MOISTURE IS 80% WHICH IS CONSIDERED CRITICAL. THE ENERGY RELEASE COMPONENT OF THE NATIONAL FIRE DANGER RATING SYSTEM IS 72 (97TH PERCENTILE). PROBABILITY OF IGNITION NEAR 100% MID-AFTERNOON IN FULL SUN. DAY LENGTH NEARLY 15 HOURS. FIRE VERY ACTIVE FROM 1400-2000.

BRANCH II
 NO MOVEMENT OF THE FIRE IS ANTICIPATED. IGNITION PROBABILITY IN GRASS IS HIGH. ANY FIREBRAND IS A THREAT.

BRANCH III
 HEAVY TIMBER AND LITTER FUELS. THE DIVISION R AREA HAS A DISTURBANCE HISTORY OF HARVESTING ACTIVITY. LARGE CLEARCUT PATCHES HAVE GRASS AND BRUSH THAT IS VERY RECEPTIVE TO FIREBRANDS. SINGLE TREE AND GROUP TORCHING POSSIBLE WITH STRONGER WINDS.

BRANCH IV
 THE FIRE IS HOLDING IN THE KLAMATH RIVER DRAINAGE. WHEN THE WIND SWITCHES OVER THE DAY FROM SOUTH TO NORTHWEST, DRAINAGES IN DIV U ARE ORIENTED WITH THE WIND DIRECTION. THIS WILL CAUSE ACCELERATION OF THE WIND. SHORT RANGE SPOTTING IS POSSIBLE DOWN CANYON. IF A SPOT FIRE GETS ESTABLISHED IT WILL RUN RAPIDLY THROUGH FINE FUELS.

AIR OPERATIONS: SUNRISE 0544 SUNSET 2047
 WEAK MORNING INVERSION SHOULD HAVE LITTLE AFFECT ON AIR OPERATIONS.

SAFETY

- POST A WEATHER WATCH THROUGH THE DAY ON A PROMINENT RIDGE IF POSSIBLE. AS THE WIND MOVES AROUND THE COMPASS THIS WILL GIVE TIME FOR ESCAPE IF NECESSARY.
- STRONG WINDS ON RIDGE TOPS COULD THROW FIRE WEAKENED TREES OR BREAK BRANCHES AND TOPS.
- SCORCHED CANOPY CAN REBURN ESPECIALLY IN DEEP CANYONS WITH TIGHT CROWN SPACING

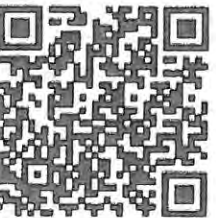

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



MEDIA

California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. Do not post:

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos
- Opinions regarding the incident or policy
- Endorsements of any kind

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

STRUCTURE DEFENSE TACTICAL ACTIONS

- **Check & Go** – Most appropriate action when no Safety Zone/TRA is present and fire front impact is imminent. Conduct rapid evaluation to check for occupants and evaluate for follow up action. **LEAVE promptly.**
- **Prep & Go** – Structure preparation can be safely completed prior to fire front impact. Potential fire activity is too dangerous to remain and/or there is no Safety Zone/TRA present. **LEAVE before escape routes are compromised.**
- **Prep & Defend** – Appropriate when a Safety Zone is nearby and TRA is present. Adequate time exists to prepare the structure for defense prior to fire front impact. Escape routes must be maintained.
- **Fire Front Following** – Follow-up tactic after passage of the fire front. Involves searching for victims, perimeter control, hot spotting, and ember control.
- **Bump & Run** – Resources move ahead of the fire front extinguishing spot fires and defending structures. Utilize extreme caution.
- **Anchor & Hold** – Resources use large volume fire streams to extinguish structure fires, stop structure-to-structure ignitions, protect exposures, and control embers.
- **Tactical Patrol** – Resources remain mobile and continuously monitor assigned area after fire front passage. Involves aggressive mop up around structures.

Structure defense tactics are a vital part of perimeter control operations.

- **Stopping fire spread significantly eliminates the fire's threat to structures.**
- **Connect contained points along the fire's perimeter – typically near the structures at risk ("Connect the Dots").**
- **Perimeter control and structure defense should be done concurrently.**

LEVELS OF ENGAGEMENT

Consider PACE

- Primary Plan (Offense)**
 - Focused on firefighter safety and objectives
- Alternate Plan (Offense)**
 - Fallback plan that closely resembles primary plan
- Contingency Plan (Defense)**
 - Focused on firefighter safety, move to a safety zone, temporary refuge areas
- Emergency Plan (Defense)**
 - Firefighter survival
 - Deployment zones/Refuge areas
 - Fire shelters

Consider DRAW-D

Defend – Reinforce – **A**dvance – **W**ithdraw – **D**elay

IMMEDIATE NEED EVACUATION CHECKLIST

- Co-locate with law enforcement at ICP
- Identify evacuation area utilizing local maps. Include area of incident potential when determining evacuation area.
- Identify traffic control points for entry and exit of resources and civilians
- Identify areas that must be immediately evacuated and label "evacuation order" areas
- Identify areas that are potentially threatened and label "evacuation warning" areas
- Identify community safe refuge areas inside evacuation areas
- Determine and publish evacuation routes
- Identify and clearly communicate the decision points for implementing additional evacuation areas
- Identify areas of special needs population and large animals
- Consider use of public notification systems for evacuations

STRUCTURE DEFENSE FUNDAMENTALS

- Back equipment in for tactical mobility
- Shield apparatus from radiant heat – be aware of structure ignition potential
- Park in a cleared area (watch for power lines, trees)
- Have an engine/crew protection line identified
- Determine if residents are home. Determine best course of action – evacuate if safe to do so or shelter in place at safe location
- Maintain communications with all crew members
- Maintain at least 100 gallons of water reserve in your tank
- Top off your tank at every opportunity (use garden hose)
- For roof access, place owner's ladder at a corner of the structure on the side with the least fire threat and away from power drop
- Keep fire out of heavier fuels (suppress in lighter fuels)
- Clear area around above-ground fuel tank, shutting off tank
- Close windows and doors, including garage, leaving doors unlocked
- Place combustible outside furniture inside the structure
- Charge and place garden hoses strategically around structure for immediate use
- Move wood piles away from structures
- Consider applying foam/gel to the structure (roof and siding) and/or fuels
- **REMEMBER** to follow up with **TACTICAL PATROL!**

EVACUATION NOTIFICATION SUMMARY

LEVEL 1 – Be Ready

Residents should be aware of the danger that exists in their area, monitor emergency services websites and local media outlets for information. This is the time for preparation and precautionary movement of persons with special needs, mobile property and (under certain circumstances) pets and livestock. If conditions worsen, emergency services personnel may contact you via an emergency notification system.

LEVEL 2 – Be Set

YOU MUST PREPARE TO LEAVE AT A MOMENTS NOTICE

This level indicates there is significant danger to your area, and residents should either voluntarily relocate to a shelter or with family/friends outside of the affected area, or if choosing to remain, to be ready to evacuate at a moment's notice. Residents **MAY** have time to gather necessary items, but doing so is at their own risk.

THIS MAY BE THE ONLY NOTICE THAT YOU RECEIVE

Emergency services cannot guarantee that they will be able to notify you if conditions rapidly deteriorate. Area media services will be asked to broadcast periodic updates.

LEVEL 3 – Leave Immediately

Danger to your area is current or imminent, and you should evacuate immediately. If you choose to ignore this advisement, you must understand that emergency services may not be available to assist you further. DO NOT delay leaving to gather any belongings or make efforts to protect your home.

THIS WILL BE THE LAST NOTICE THAT YOU RECEIVE

ENTRY TO EVACUATED AREAS MAY BE DENIED UNTIL CONDITIONS ARE SAFE.

AREA RADIO AND TV STATIONS HAVE BEEN ASKED TO BROADCAST PERIODIC UPDATES.

This document has been reviewed and accepted by Oregon State Sheriffs' Association, Oregon State Fire Marshal's Office, Oregon Emergency Management, Oregon Fire Chief's Association and Oregon Department of Forestry. This document should be considered an official document for use to the public on All Hazards Evacuations.

KLAMATHON INCIDENT Basecamp Map

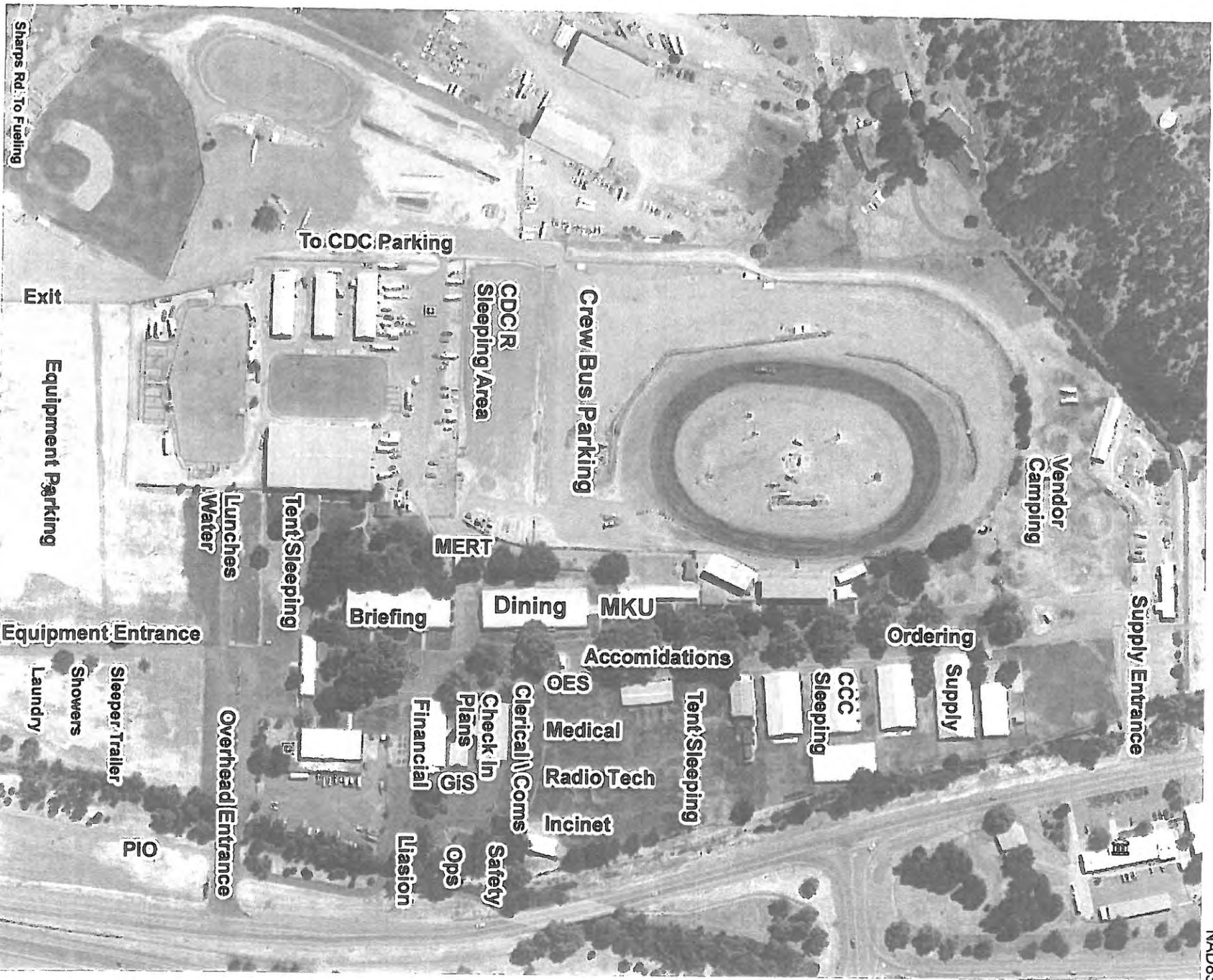
