- Receptive fuel bed
- Numerous snags and dead/down fuels
- Large open stump holes
- Properly handle fire suppression tools
- Be aware of wildlife and environmental hazards – snakes/poison oak
- Report all injuries to your supervisor
- Report any incident or damage to your DIVS

Special Hazards - Driving

- Utilize caution and reduce speed.
- Utilize proper spacing when traveling on narrow roads.
