

...Red Flag Warning 8 pm Saturday through 11 am Monday...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Smoke filled skies to start the day Saturday with generally light winds through afternoon that will represent the calm before the storm. Temperatures in the upper 70s and mid 80s this afternoon with a general wind direction from the Northeast but fairly light. Winds coming up Highway 101 may have a light southerly component this afternoon. **Use sunset or the time around 7 pm for a Safety Check.** There is high confidence that very strong Northeast winds will develop sometime between 8-11 pm as a dry cold front passes through the region. Sustained winds from 30-40 mph with frequent gusts to 60 mph will first arrive near the Lake County line and then sweep over the fire. **This is a historically strong event potentially much stronger than the 2017 event and notably stronger than the wind event from Wednesday night when the fire started.** The strong winds will try and push down to the 101 overnight with very strong winds lasting at least through lunchtime Sunday before gradually diminishing.

WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY:

WEATHER: Smoke. Otherwise mostly sunny but increasing high clouds late as the front approaches.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 77-84 **HUMIDITY:** Afternoon humidity 12-18%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - North to Northeast 5-10 mph a few afternoon gusts 14-18 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light then afternoon southerly upslope 3-7 mph, mainly Branch III

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate to strong morning inversion slowly lifting after 1300

WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Smoke. **Becoming very windy after 9 pm !**

TEMPERATURES: Overnight lows upper 50s to mid 60s by morning.

HUMIDITY: Overnight recovery to around 30% by morning.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - *Northeast 10-20 mph until 8 pm then increasing 25-40 mph with frequent gusts 50-60 mph and localized gusts 65-80 mph overnight through sunrise.*

SLOPE/VALLEY - Northeast 5-10 mph until 8 pm then increasing 15-25 mph with gusts 35 to 50 mph overnight.

Extended Forecast: Winds still strong through Sunday but slowly diminishing by midday Monday. Another light offshore wind event is possible by midweek. Dry through early November.

SAFETY INFORMATION: Every person on the incident should plan now for damaging winds across the fire and throughout the county. Make sure all levels of personnel have Safety Plans.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:
 Expect varying windows for direct attack versus indirect, as related to flame lengths and rates of spread, based upon forecast wind and smoke coverage. Expect wind increase around 2000 hours; this is a historic wind event with high confidence in timing and strength. Personnel need to have significant situational awareness and maintain LCES.

SPECIFIC:

Grass Fuels: Grass fuels will dry out quickly. Fine flashy fuels will be extremely receptive for spot fires.

Shrub Fuels: Short slope driven runs are likely in drainages.

Timber Fuels: Expect isolated crown fire runs, and some group torching in heavier fuels of DIV A, B, D, F, and P. Flame lengths may reach >25', especially with wind gusts.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate turbulence, gusty winds, and limited visibility with consumption of heavy fuels.
 Mixing height: 3,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: N 10-15 mph, Sunrise 0732, Sunset 1819.

SAFETY

Escape routes: In flashy fuels with gusty winds, your escape route should be one foot in the burn.
 Make sure to identify escape routes and safety zones early in the shift before dark, and before the wind event.
 High winds may snap tops and branches or fell entire trees, even those not weakened by fire!

- Stay aware of what is happening around you and adapt your exit strategy accordingly.

- Monitor your hydration/nutrition intake and keep adequate supplies of each.
- Watch for congested roadways and heavy traffic in and around the incident. Maintain a safe following distance.

- No PPE allowed in the eating areas. Wash hands regularly and always before entering the eating areas.

GEYSERS SAFETY MESSAGE

This Safety Message applies to any resource assigned to the Geysers, in addition to the Kincadee Incident Safety Message.

- ⇒ The Geysers is a power distribution area, assume all power lines are energized.
DO NOT CUT ANY DOWN POWERLINES.
- ⇒ Steep winding UNMARKED roads are throughout the Geysers. Drive defensively with headlights on anticipating the unexpected.
- ⇒ The Geysers area contain vertical and horizontal mines shafts, look down for vertical mines and stay away from horizontal mine openings.
- ⇒ Earthquakes are prevalent throughout the Geysers, LOOK OUT for rolling rocks and take earthquake precautions if earthquakes are felt.
- ⇒ Hydrogen Sulfide (H₂S) in parts per million can be hazardous, if available utilize air monitoring equipment to detect for this hazard.
- ⇒ Natural steam vents exist in many areas. DO NOT mistake steam for smoke you may be BURNED.
- ⇒ Reclaimed hydrants are painted PURPLE do not drink water from the hydrant system in the Geysers.
- ⇒ Stay upwind of cooling towers, the steam may contain hazardous materials. Use DEFENSIVE tactics on cooling tower fires.





Media Law

The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence. When working around the media, remember:

- Media is **not permitted** on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. Remember to wear all the appropriate PPE.
- If needed call for an incident PIO through the chain of command.
- Never speculate, give opinions or speak for others.
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE Social Media Policy (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore when on a CAL FIRE incident you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the incident Public Information Officer. While assigned to the incident, there will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials
- No opinions
- No endorsements
- Inappropriate pictures or videos

Archaeological and Historic Properties: General Fire-line Guidance.

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties.
When possible and prudent:**

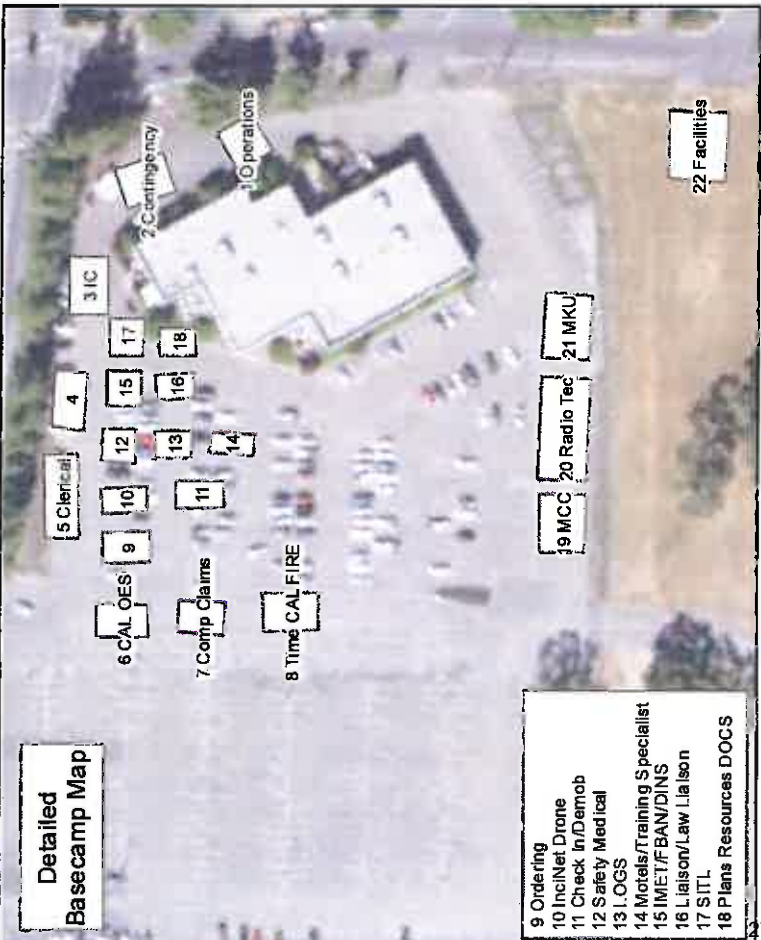
1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
2. Note, that not much of the area has ever been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

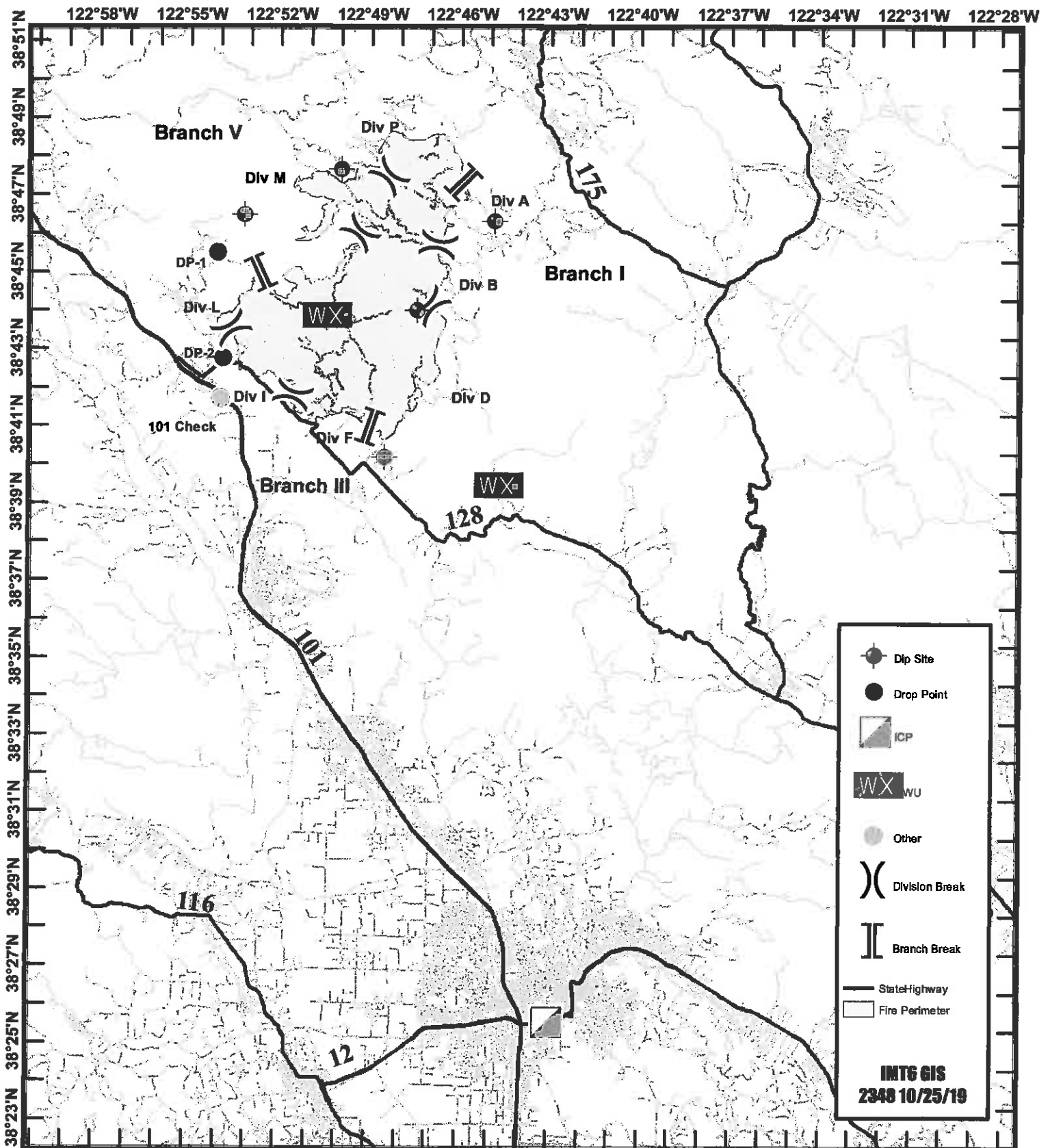

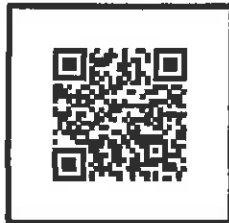
