**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** ... **LIGHT WINDS WITH DRY CONDITIONS WILL CONTINUE...**  
Clear skies will continue through Monday with slightly warmer temperatures. Daytime RH values remain near very low on Saturday. Fair to excellent humidity recoveries are expected in valley locations with poor to no humidity recovery in the mid and upper slopes. Winds will continue to be light through Monday. Rainfall is not expected through the next 7 days.

**WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Lingering smoke and haze. Otherwise sunny.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs mid 60s above 1500 feet and upper 70s valleys.

**HUMIDITY:** 13-20%



### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Potential for human ignitions near the fire area; new starts have the potential to make fast runs, especially when in alignment with drainages. Ember cast into the extremely dry brush and light fuels will cause spot fires to ignite easily, and grow rapidly if left unchecked.

Live Fuel Moistures being recorded at the Geysers was 50% on 10/7/19, 10 points BELOW critical levels.

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

#### SPECIFIC:

- Branch I: Greatest area of potential remains DIV B.
- Branch III / V: Reburn potential exists. Spots could ignite in flashy fuels.
- Branch IV: Minimal fire activity expected.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Strong inversion overnight with marginal improvement by afternoon. Expect limited visibility.  
Mixing height: 3,300 ft. AGL. Minimal transport winds, ~5 mph. Sunrise 0739, Sunset 1811.

## SAFETY.

Snags and stump holes are likely in timber areas.

Snags/trees can burn in the upper portions. Look up! Just because there is no fire in the lower trunk doesn't mean it's safe.

Don't fall into the "same old – same old" trap. Fire behavior can change in an instant. **STAY ALERT!**

**Monitor yourself and crew for fatigue.**  
**Set a reasonable pace for your assignment.**  
**Maintain good hydration and nutrition.**

- There are abandoned mercury mines located near the incident. These are identified on the Operations Map. Restrict access around these areas for all personnel, vehicles and equipment.
- Stay informed of current and expected weather conditions. Plan accordingly.
- ESTABLISH: LOOKOUTS, COMMUNICATIONS, ESCAPE ROUTES AND SAFETY ZONES.
- Watch for congested roadways and heavy traffic in and around the incident. Follow all traffic laws and the rules of the road.
- Beware of environmental hazards such as beehives, poison oak, trip hazards, steep slopes, and stump holes.
- Repopulation of certain evacuation areas are occurring. Expect residents, workers and the media to be present.
- Hazardous Trees weakened by fire and wind are abundant in and around the incident.
- The Geysers geothermal power plant located in Branch V. This site contains mine shafts, steam vents, fumaroles, and electrical infrastructure.

**Motivate your crews to remain engaged and focused during the Mop-up Operations of the incident.**

### Media Law

The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence. When working around the media, remember:

- **Media is not permitted** on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. Remember to wear all the appropriate PPE.
- If needed call for an incident PIO through the chain of command.
- Never speculate, give opinions or speak for others.
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

### CAL FIRE Social Media Policy (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. # Peer Support Team Message:



## KINCADE INCIDENT PEER SUPPORT:

The gravity of this event is large. Many of us have been impacted by the events that have occurred here, as well as past incidents.

The KINCADE Incident Peer Support Team is a multi-agency team that has been assembled to provide Peer Support. The team consist of members from various Local, State, and Federal Departments who represent fire, law enforcement, ems and public safety. Peers are available at the ICP. Assigned Peers and culturally competent Clinicians are available to help on an individual and/or group basis.

Some of the signs and symptoms you may be experiencing include, but are not limited to:

Irritability, lack of sleep, quick to anger, isolation, above average tobacco use, an increase in negative coping mechanisms such as excessive alcohol and/or substance abuse. You might experience lack of appetite, isolate yourself, or various other unexplained reactions to normal every day events.

You may not be experiencing these symptoms now. However, you may find yourself experiencing them when you return to your home or Unit. You may be triggered by a past event, that has impacted you, while assigned to future incidents. A sight, sound, smell, or touch could trigger a memory, that is affecting you now, but you're not sure why?

If you find yourself in this situation and need to talk to someone, please come by the Peer trailer, or contact your Employee Assistance Program (EAP). EAP programs are here to help. It is important to talk to someone and get stuff off your chest vs carrying this around for your career.

## KINDCADE FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR GUIDELINES

### WORK PRIORITY AREAS

#### Priority Treatment areas are:

1. Watercourse crossing sites utilized during suppression activities.
2. Firelines, roads, and other areas with exposed soil within 100 feet of a watercourse.
3. Arterial roads; road surfaces and drainage facilities.
4. All dozer lines on slopes.
5. Firelines constructed by hand.
6. Infrastructure damage to property.

### REPAIR GUIDELINES

#### Control lines

- Install waterbars while crews and dozers are actively onsite on roads, trails, and handlines damaged by fire suppression. Waterbars shall have proper angle and open outlets to insure effective drainage. Waterbars spacing should vary depending on slope. Waterbars are designed to intercept, slow and spread the precipitation run-off in order to reduce sediment transport and soil erosion.
- Waterbars shall only be constructed where the landowner requests them. Waterbars shall be cut diagonally into firm soil at least 6" deep and have a berm at least 6" in height (for a total height of at least 12 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm). Waterbars should have a 30-45 degree angle to the fall line with an opening left at one end to release water flow. Where feasible, the discharge from waterbars shall be directed into vegetated areas.
- Where slopes exceed the range where dozers can effectively work, waterbars shall be constructed with hand tools. .

#### Waterbar/Cross Drain spacing

Line or Road Gradient (%)	0-10%	11-25%	26-50%	>50%
Spacing	200'	150'	100'	75'

#### Roads

Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in the same condition they were found or better.

- Abate dust on native surface roads.
- Clean culverts and drainage facilities plugged with soil and debris deposited during suppression activities.
- Remove outside berms created during suppression activities and incorporate into road surface or re-establish existing berms where applicable.
- Install or maintain waterbars where waterbars previously existed.
- Install new waterbars where needed.
- Install rolling dips where rolling dips previously existed.
- Slash from felled trees adjacent to roads shall be lopped and scattered, chipped or piled for burning.
- Berms and push-piles, adjacent to roads and recently cleared areas shall be spread out to the extent feasible. This may be accomplished by back-blading and/or using ripper shanks or grapples. Debris piled against trees or perched above watercourses is especially important to remove or disperse.

#### Watercourses

- All slash, loose soil and debris deposited into watercourses during suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized.
- Ford watercourse crossings with continued use shall be stabilized with clean rock to minimize further channel and bank damage.

#### Concentrations of Slash

- Slash piles created by fire suppression operations within 150' of permanent structures, public roads or private roads shall be lopped and scattered or chipped to create a layer no greater than 18" above the soil surface.
- On properties owned by Bureau of Land Management or California State Parks, slash shall be spread over hand and dozer lines to cover soil to minimize erosion. Slash can be crushed by dozers where feasible.

#### Miscellaneous Infrastructure

- Fences and gates damaged by suppression efforts shall be repaired to a functional condition. Please inform Situation Unit of any broken fences you find, along with the number of strands and/or type of fence material.

#### Clean-up

- Scattered trash shall be collected and back-hauled to staging areas, drop points and/or base camp.

**Archaeological and Historic Properties:  
General Fire-line Guidance.**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties.  
When possible and prudent:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
2. Note, that not much of the area has ever been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

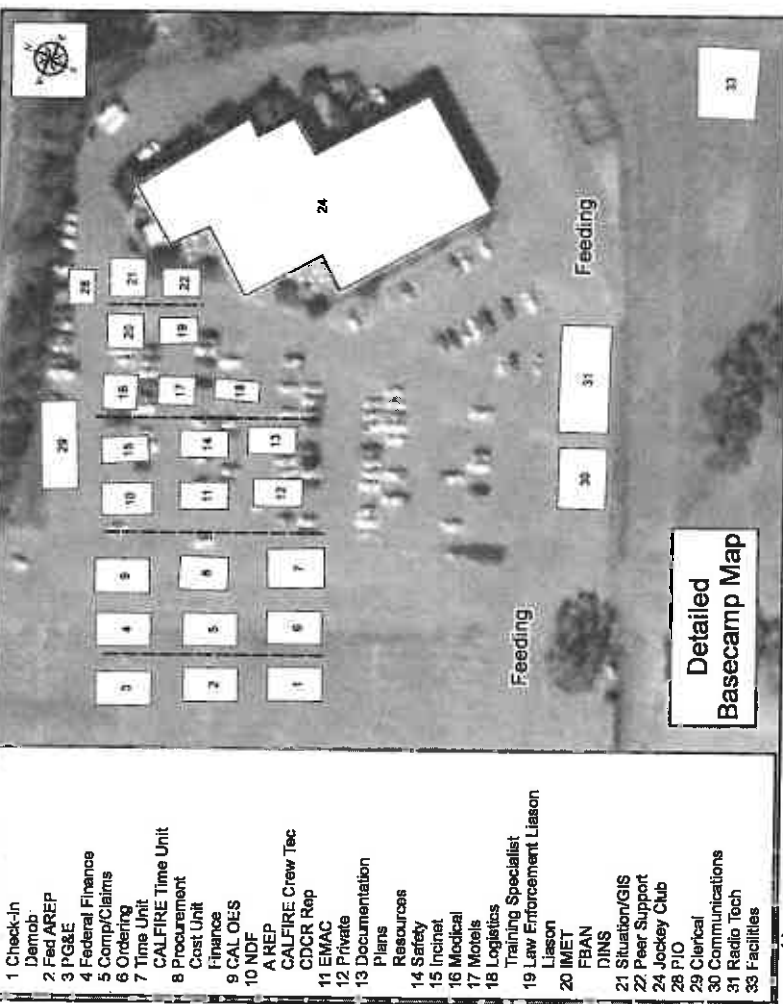

**Overview Map and Fuel**

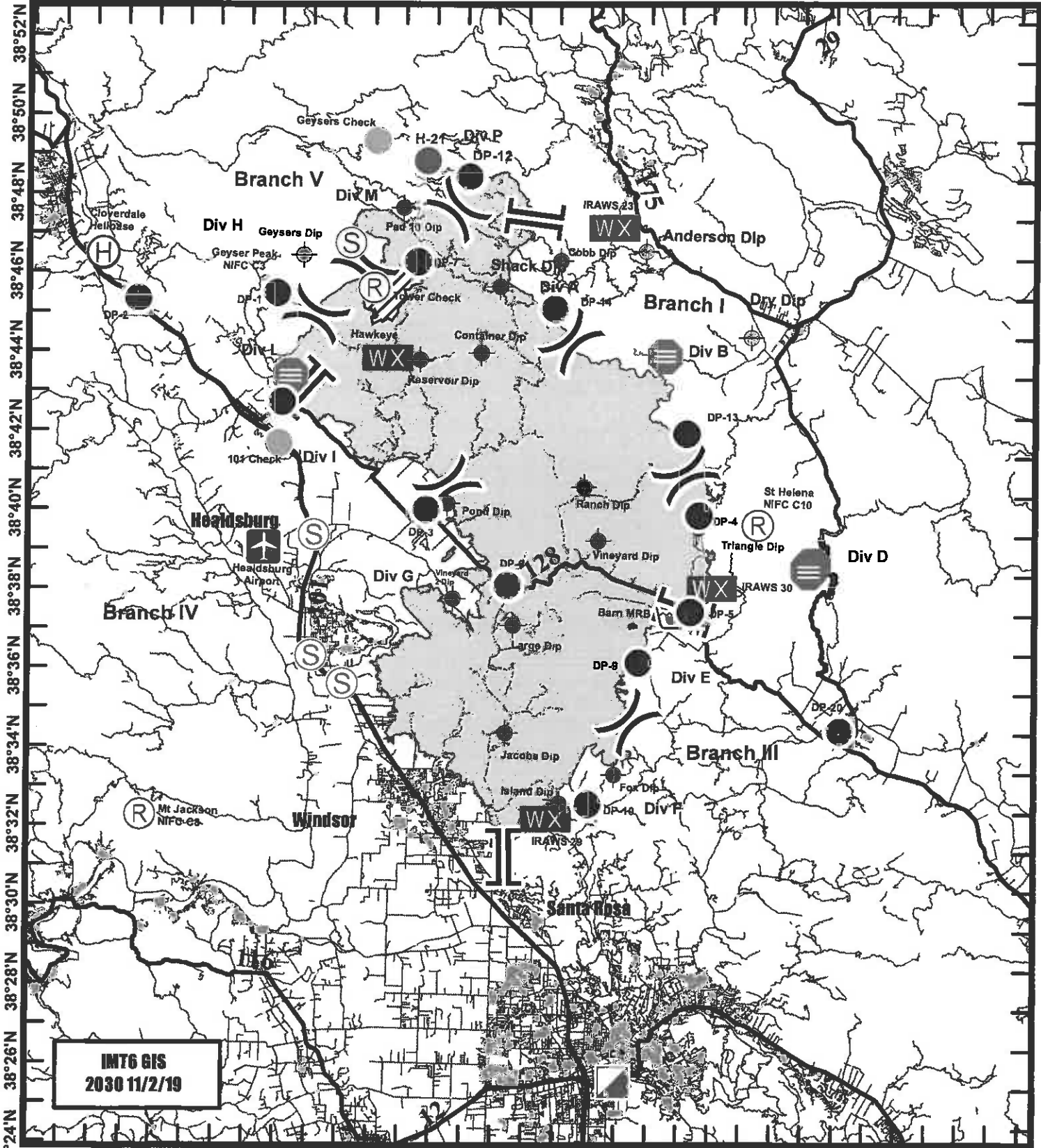


Fuel location and route from ICP (Sonoma County Fairgrounds). Follow route on map.
