WEATHER DISCUSSION: Favorable fire weather conditions will continue on Monday with a trough of low pressure along the West Coast. This will keep temperatures near or slightly below normal with generally light winds. The day will start out cool and moist with nearly full humidity recovery this morning. As temperatures warm into the mid 80s the surface based inversion will mix out by midday or early afternoon. Afternoon humidity values will bottom out around 25% by 1500 hours. Light south winds in the morning will turn Northwest in the afternoon but wind speeds will remain light. An incoming trough may generate some afternoon clouds across the coastal range hills west of the Red Bank Fire. For the evening hours expect winds to ease by sunset with good night time humidity recovery and overnight lows around 55.

Weather Forecast for Monday:

WEATHER: Morning smoke mainly from the South Fire lifting then hazy sunshine.

HIGH TEMPERATURES: 81-86. Little change.

HUMIDITY: Afternoon minimum 23-33%. Little change.

20 FT WINDS: Light winds in the morning becoming Northwest 4-8 mph with a few gusts

12 mph after 1500 hours. Strongest winds Branch V. Winds in Branch III on the west side

will be more diurnally driven with afternoon upslope into the drainages.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Surface based inversion in the morning lifting by 1200. Good smoke dispersion.

Monday Night: Northwest winds 4-8 mph through 2200 hours then easing. Good humidity recovery 70-90%. Low temperatures 55-60 by Tuesday morning.

Tuesday Forecast: An incoming system will bring some increased northwest winds 6-12 mph gusts 15 mph by afternoon. There will be some increasing clouds over the hills west of the Red Bank Fire. The system will have enough moisture to generate a chance of showers over the hills but NOT over the Red Bank Fire on Tuesday afternoon. Tuesday will be the coolest day of the week with highs around 80.

Extended Forecast: Behind the Tuesday front high pressure will begin to build. This will lead to a period of mainly light north to northeast winds Wednesday morning. These North Winds can often be an ominous signal but right now the wind speeds look light and will coincide with a cool and moist airmass. Building high pressure Wednesday afternoon through Friday leads to a warming and drying trend as afternoon highs warm back into the lower to mid 90s with humidity values back to around 25%. Generally light diurnal winds forecast for late in the week. The weekend looks seasonable with stable high pressure and normal temps.

SAFETY INFORMATION: Take advantage of the moderated fire weather conditions and plan your actions accordingly. Thanks to those sending and taking Weather Observations. Observe the weather to avoid complacency. Is the trend warmer or drier?

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Fire activity will be moderated today under light winds and higher humidity's. I do not expect uncontrolled growth on the fire today.

GENERAL:

Fuels in the area range from grass in the lower elevations (cured), and heavy brush in mid elevations (below avg fuel moistures). The fire is in a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory for above avg fuel loading.

The topography ranges from rolling hills to steep drainages. The drainages can be narrow and will funnel predominant winds. Ridgetops are also narrow, expect slop overs and spots on fire challenged ridgetops.

DRIVING-RECEPTIVE FUELS-TERRAIN-FATIGUE-NARROW ROADS

Situational Awareness: access your current situation constantly, maintain radio communication with your division, adjacent divisions, and monitor air-to-ground frequencies to understand what is happening around you at all times. Pay attention to any changes in fire behavior, wind, or any other circumstances.

Mop Up: Conduct a thorough briefing for all personnel. Use all PPE, including eye protection. Maintain proper spacing. Be alert for stump holes. Evaluate unburned islands and stay alert.

Complacency: The strongest weapon against complacency is good leadership. Clearly communicate leader's intent, stay engaged and empower your subordinates. Motivation is the cure for complacency!

Driving: Keep your speeds down on all roads. Be alert for civilian traffic in the fire areas. There are many narrow roads. Park apparatus off the roadway and utilize warning lights. Wear your seatbelts!

Fatigue: Take frequent nutrition and hydration breaks throughout the day. Hydrate with a 2 water to 1 electrolyte drink ratio. Monitor Personnel for fatigue.

Steep slopes/rolling material: Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness.

Potential Fire Behavior: Be prepared for new fires to start. Fuels are receptive to fire. Consider P.A.C.E and know your L.C.E.S. Don't be lulled into a false sense of security.

Lookouts, Communication, Escape routes, Safety zones

TAILGATE SAFETY

- Accountability: Supervisors know where their crews are at all times
- **Hydration and Nutrition:** Monitor each other for proper hydration and nutrition
- **Communication:** Everyone knows the comm plan and follows it.
- **Briefing:** Leaders intent is fully communicated, and safety briefing is provided

- LCES: They are clear and made known to everyone





RED BANK TRAVEL MAP




Directions from ICP to Branch V
