

## **Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist**

### **Self-Awareness / Screening**

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Fever
  - Chills
  - Sore throat
  - Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

### **Hygiene on the Fireline**

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
  - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

### **Social Distancing and Protective Equipment**

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

### **Communications**

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications.  
Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

Late Thursday night look to see a period of stronger downslope winds, but it is not a major event. What it will do is lower RH and allow significant warming for Friday.

- Avoid trees that have been burning for long periods of time

# HIRED EQUIPMENT FIRELINE SAFETY MESSAGE



To prevent accidents and injuries to personnel when working with hired equipment on a fire assignment.

CAL FIRE requires annual firefighter safety training for all operators of equipment hired for fireline and/or suppression repair assignments. Specific requirements are outlined in the Fire Service Training and Education Program (FSTEP) Fireline Safety Awareness for Hired Vendors curriculum, approved by the Office of the California State Fire Marshal, State Fire Training Program. Each operator who successfully completes the required annual training is issued a course completion card valid for one year from the class completion date (due to COVID 2019 & 2020 cards are accepted). Operators shall retain this course completion card, and present it to incident personnel upon request. Incident personnel shall verify that all operators operating equipment under an EERA have a copy of the safety training completion card in their possession.

- **Driver's License**

- All operators of vehicles covered by the EERA must possess a current driver's license appropriate for the type of vehicle being operated. Operators of any motor vehicle or combinations having a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) of more than 26,000 lbs. must have a Commercial Driver's License (with any/all endorsements required by law), valid for the State of California.
- Drivers of hired equipment are not exempt from the limitations on driving hours or the logbook requirements of the Federal Motor Carrier Regulations

- **PPE Standards and Requirements for Equipment Operators**

- Operator personal protective equipment (PPE) shall comply with applicable Cal/OSHA requirements and the following regulatory standards.
- Required PPE
  - One hard hat, one set of goggles, one pair of gloves, boots lace-up minimum 8" leather lug-type soles in good condition, one flashlight (for night operations), one quart drinking water per hour per person, nomex shirt, trousers, and face shroud: Cal/OSHA approved, one fire shelter: USFS approved, one radio, refer to form FC-100R for minimum radio specifications. **Supervisors shall confirm with hired equipment operators that radios are operating properly to maintain communication during assigned shifts.**

- **Safety Inspections**

- All privately-owned vehicles requiring commercial drivers' licenses and with 26,001 lbs or greater GVWR, or at the discretion of the CAL FIRE Hired Equipment Coordinator, under agreement with CAL FIRE shall be **safety-inspected annually**. CAL FIRE personnel shall verify this inspection has occurred prior to hire each year. This includes California Special Equipment licensed vehicles, commercially licensed vehicles, and vehicles registered in other states. Proof of Inspection under the Biennial inspection of Terminals (BIT program) is not acceptable. CAL FIRE shall accept an inspection as valid for one year only. An inspection date greater than twelve months' prior shall be rejected. **NOTE: Due to Covid-19 CAL FIRE will accept 2019 and 2020 safety cards from suppliers. Any safety card older than 2019 is not valid and will not be accepted.**


**Suppliers are not allowed to work operators for 24-hour shifts and must have the appropriate number of relief operators for each piece of equipment to meet the agreement needs. Line supervisors ensure 12-hour shift exchange takes place.**



## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM

### WATER USAGE PLAN

#### *California Drought Emergency*

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

#### **Fireline personnel-** (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

#### **Road Maintenance and Repair-**

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

#### **Avlation Operations-**

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

#### **Private Water Supplies-**

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

#### **Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-**

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

#### **Management and Supervision-**

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

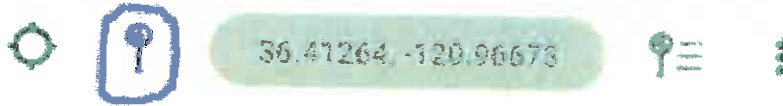

# AVENZA MAP HOW TO QUICK GUIDE

## Add a Placemark:

1. Pan to a position on the map centered by the crosshair (select exact location, not the road nearby)
2. Tap Add Placemark. A placemark is added with the default icon color, name (can be changed)



3. Name Placemark under Title.
4. Change symbol, if desired.
5. Click Submit.

## Changing Placemark Details:

1. Tap the placemark on the map to display the label
2. Tap icon on the placemark label to see details about the placemark
3. On the placemark detail screen, you can change the placemark title, icon, enter a description, add photos, edit the location coordinate, and edit attribute schema.

## Moving a Placemark on a Map:

1. Tap and hold a placemark
2. Drag the placemark to another position and release

## Recording a Track:

1. Tap Tools and select Record GPS Tracks



2. Select tracking (middle column).
3. Once a signal has been established ("Start" will be displayed for iOS, "Ready" will be displayed for Android), tap "Start" (iOS) or the Play icon (Android) to begin recording. Your tracks will continue recording, even if you minimize the app (set phone settings Avenza to always run GPS)

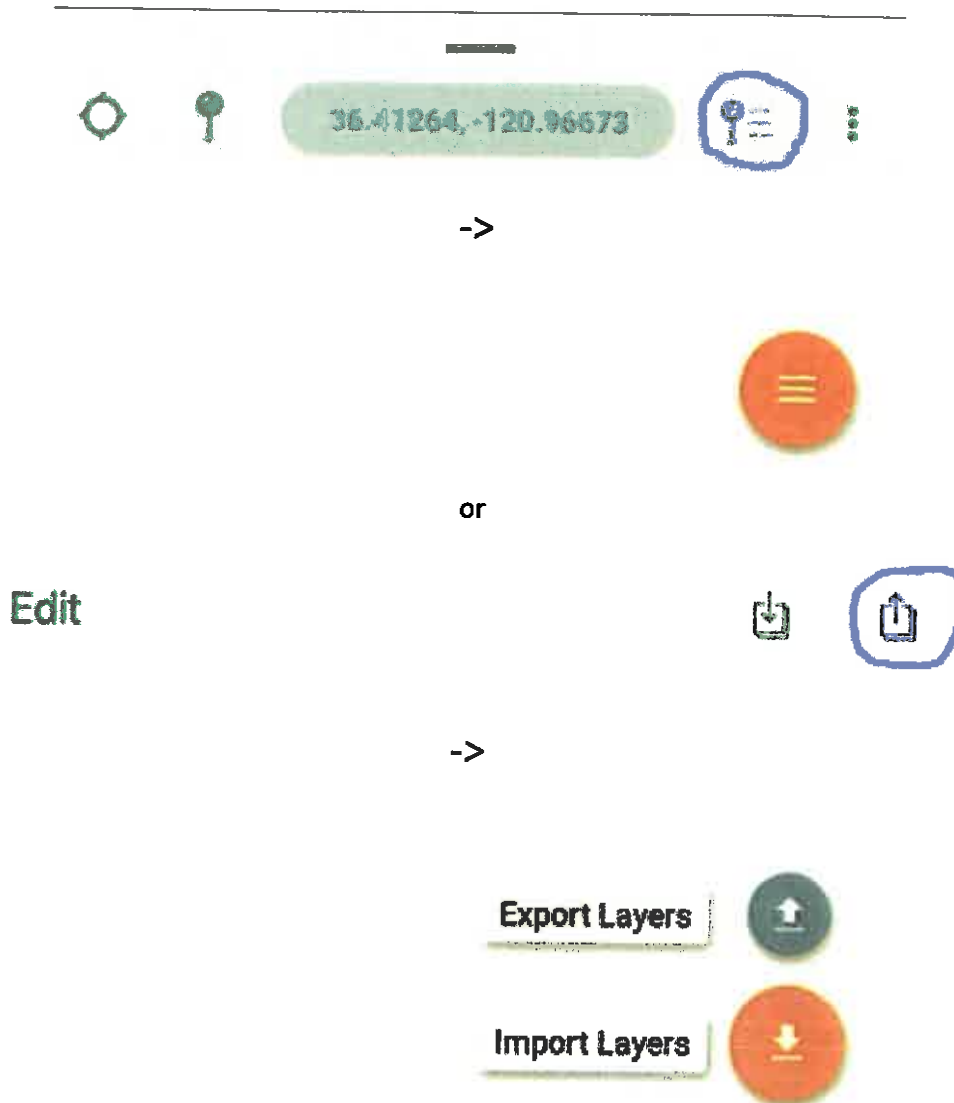




4. When you are done recording, tap 'Stop' (iOS) or "Done" (Android) and the track will be saved as a Map Feature.

### Exporting Features:

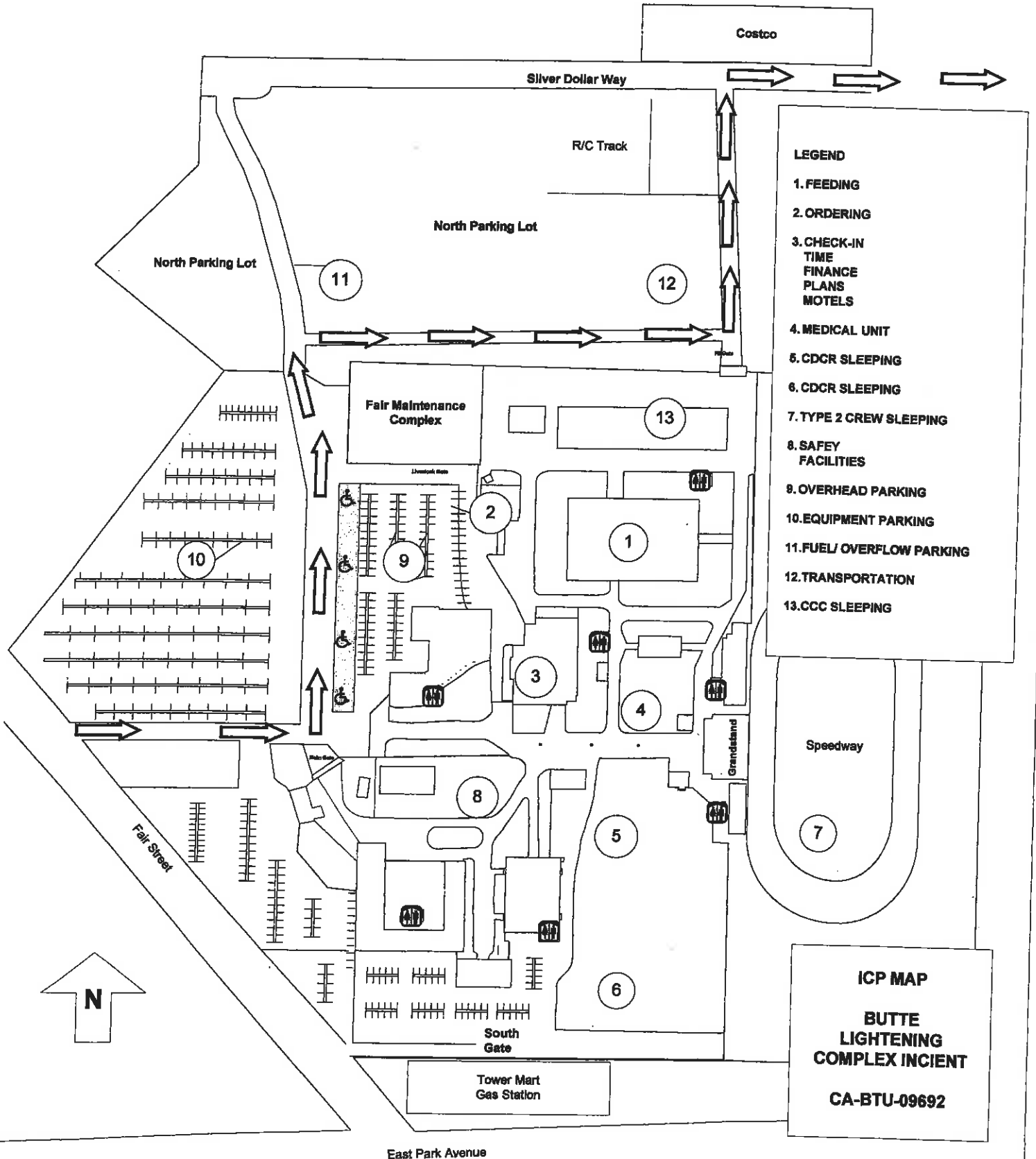
1. Tap Map Features
