WEATHER DISCUSSION:

...ON SHORE MOISTURE STARTING TO INCREASE...

We are starting to see a bit higher moisture as the marine layer rebuilds along the coast and gradually pushes inland. The marine layer will become a little deeper, reaching to around 1000ft elevation. The higher elevations above 1500ft will still be warm and dry today with steady north-northwest winds. As for tonight, the thermal belt will still remain above that 1000ft elevation, with humidity in the 25-35% range under steady north-northwest winds. The marine inversion will continue to deepen Saturday into Sunday with increasing moisture at all elevations. Hurricane Genevieve off the Baja Coast will bring up some moisture Sunday night into Monday, along with a slight chance of thunderstorms.

WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny with heavy smoke. Some coastal fog possible in the morning.

TEMPERATURES: Highs in the 80s... except 70s along the coast. DOWN 5 DEGREES

HUMIDITY: 30-40%... except near the coast around 60%. 10% WETTER

20 FT WINDS:

ABOVE 1500 ft - North-northwest 10-15 mph with gusts to 22 mph.

WEATHER SUMMARY

The marine layer will reach further inland and will bring temps down a few degrees, and the humidity will be 10% wetter. Winds will continue to be the concern with steady North West winds 10-15 MPH with gusts possible to 20 to 25 MPH on the ridges. Nighttime conditions will have less wind and much more recovery at the lower elevations. Upper elevations will continue to be fairly dry but will have some recovery as well.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fire is burning in heavy timber mix of Hardwoods and Coastal Redwoods along with thick litter and some intermixed grass and brush. The region is experiencing moderate to severe drought with rainfall for the area at about 50% of average for the previous rain season. Fuel moistures in the brush are near critical levels, and the 100 hour and 1000 hour fuels moistures are around 7%. The probability of ignition is 60% within the marine layer and 80% for upper elevations

SPECIFIC:

Below 1500 foot elevation: The marine layer will be over the fire for these areas. The fire activity should be somewhat moderated by this rise in humidity in the lighter fuels, but the heavier fuels will continue to carry fire due to the time lag it takes for the fuel moistures to be affected. The thick timber litter in the Coastal Redwoods will hold heat and contribute to fire spread as well. Single tree torching is still possible and may increase rates of spread when aligned with slope and winds.

Above 1500 foot elevation: The fire has stayed active in the upper elevations for the past 4 days continuously due to above average temperatures and drying. Expect this to continue for most of the operational period. The fire is primarily carried by the lighter fuels, brush and timber litter. Single and group tree torching will continue, causing spotting of ½ to 1 mile. The fuels are very receptive to fire brands and will spread easily especially when fanned by the predicted winds. When aligned with slope and winds, fire activity can transition to short crown runs.

AIR OPERATIONS: The entire fire will under an inversion early, but the North zone should clear out mid-morning. The southern zone will be limited for air operations due to inversions and smoke especially in lower valleys

SAFETY

- Safety zones are essential as demonstrated by yesterday's fire activity.
- In the heavy timber safety zones are limited, if the hard black is used for safety zones watch out for snags.
- Snags and stump holes are likely in timber areas.


