WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...DIFFERENT WIND DIRECTION TODAY...

Winds will begin to shift today out of the west (north zone) and southwest (south zone). Dry conditions exist over the higher elevations of the fire area again for today, even drier than yesterday. The moisture will actually become drier in these upper elevations tonight with humidity around 15-20% after midnight. Lower elevations and along the coast will see good recovery, along with some coastal fog developing. Hurricane Genevieve off the Baja Coast will bring up moisture Sunday night into Monday, bringing a chance of dry thunderstorms and gusty outflow winds. Fire Weather Watch is in effect starting Sunday afternoon and going through Tuesday morning for the region.

WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY: ...WINDS SHIFTING OUT OF THE SOUTHWEST...

WEATHER: Mostly sunny with heavy smoke. Some coastal fog possible in the morning.

TEMPERATURES: Highs in the 80s... except 70s along the coast. **LITTLE CHANGE**

HUMIDITY: 25-30%... except near the coast 35-60%. **5% DRIER**

20 FT WINDS:

ABOVE 1500 ft – West and Southwest 5-10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph.

BELOW 1500 ft – West and Southwest 3-6 mph.

STABILITY: Marine layer near 1000ft along the coast. **HAINES 4** above 1500ft level.

SATURDAY NIGHT: ...VERY DRY OVERNIGHT THERMAL BELT...

WEATHER: Smoky skies. Coastal fog developing overnight.

TEMPERATURES: Overnight lows 70s above 1500ft... upper 50s below 1500ft. **LITTLE CHANGE**

HUMIDITY: above 1500ft near 15-25%... except near 100% below 1500ft. **10% DRIER**

20 FT WINDS:

ABOVE 1500ft – West and southwest 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

BELOW 1500ft – West and southwest 3-6 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST: ...FIRE WEATHER WATCH FOR THUNDERSTORMS AND OUTFLOW WINDS...

WEATHER SUMMARY

Wind direction changes today!!

The winds will change to a southwest flow for the first time on this incident. Upper elevations will experience very dry conditions overnight.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fire is burning in heavy timber mix of Hardwoods and Coastal Redwoods along with thick litter and some intermixed grass and brush. The region is experiencing moderate to severe drought with rainfall for the area at about 50% of average. The fire continues to resist control efforts due to the prolonged drying and depth of fuel beds. Fuel moistures in the brush are near critical levels, and the 100 hour and 1000 hour fuels moistures are around 7%.

SPECIFIC:

Below 1500 foot elevation: The marine layer will be deeper over the fire for these areas for most of the shift. This marine layer has limited penetration into the heavier fuels and thick duff layer. These fuels continue to hold heat and contribute to the fire spread. Probability of ignition is 40%

Above 1500 foot elevation: The fire has stayed active in the upper elevations for the past 5 days due to above average temperatures and drying. Expect this to continue for the entire shift. The fire is primarily carried by the lighter fuels, brush and timber litter. Expect active backing with slope driven runs, along with single and group tree torching, causing spotting of ½ to ¾ mile. Very dry overnight conditions will allow for fire activity to continue, and potentially increase. Probability of ignition is 80%

AIR OPERATIONS: The lower elevations of the fire will remain under marine layer all day. The Southern zone of the fire may have clear enough air starting around midday for air operations once the smoke is pushed north by the wind change.

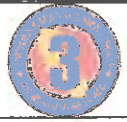

SAFETY

- Lookouts are a must especially in thick brushy areas. Visibility is also hampered by smoke and clouds in some areas. Make sure you know what the fire is doing at all times
- Fire weakened timber and branches continue to release due to extended burn out time
- Large stump holes and ash pits are likely in timber areas.

1. steady persistence in a course of action, a purpose, a state, especially in spite of difficulties, obstacles, or discouragement.

- COVID-19 precautions: (6 Feet, Cover Nose and Mouth, Wash Hands)
- Look Up, Down, and Around: Rolling material, limbs and trees.
- Understand the plan for the day and your individual role within the plan.
- Make sure everyone gets a briefing! "Patience, flexible, and be fluid".
- Maintain hydration & nutrition intake.
- Drive defensively and expect the unexpected (Civilians, Trees, Debris Fall).
- Power and utility lines down around the fire areas. Take appropriate action when encountering these hazards. (3 stripes to warn others).

CHECK AND GO: Rapid evaluation to check for occupants requiring removal or rescue.

PREP AND GO: Some preparation prior to resources leaving the area.

PREP AND DEFEND: Safety Zone or TRA are present and adequate time exists for defense.

FIRE FRONT FOLLOWING: Used in conjunction with the tactics above. Come in behind fire front.

BUMP AND RUN: Ahead of the fire front in the spotting zone to extinguish spot fires.

ANCHOR AND HOLD: Extinguish structure fires, protect exposures.



Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - Cough, more than expected
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever
 - Sore throat
 - Chills
 - Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
 - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Communications

Media no longer means news/broadcast industry, but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video, photographs and post them onto social media sites in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately, we have seen some instances of photographs or videos that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens, it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could expose oneself to unwanted ramifications. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera loses their situational awareness.

The Public Information Office would like copies of the video and pictures that you safely took while not in an emergency situation, fire suppression activity or in an overhead assignment. Bring your video and pictures to the Public Information trailer; they will be reviewed and possibly uploaded to our many CAL FIRE social media sites. Remember, we don't want photographs or videos that depict unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances, which are a serious breach of ethics.

LOST AND FOUND – The Information Section will manage lost and found items for the incident. If you have lost an item please leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well. All items left in Lost and Found will be turned over to the local CAL FIRE Santa Cruz Unit.

MAIL SERVICE – Due to the complexity of the incident, mail service will not be available.

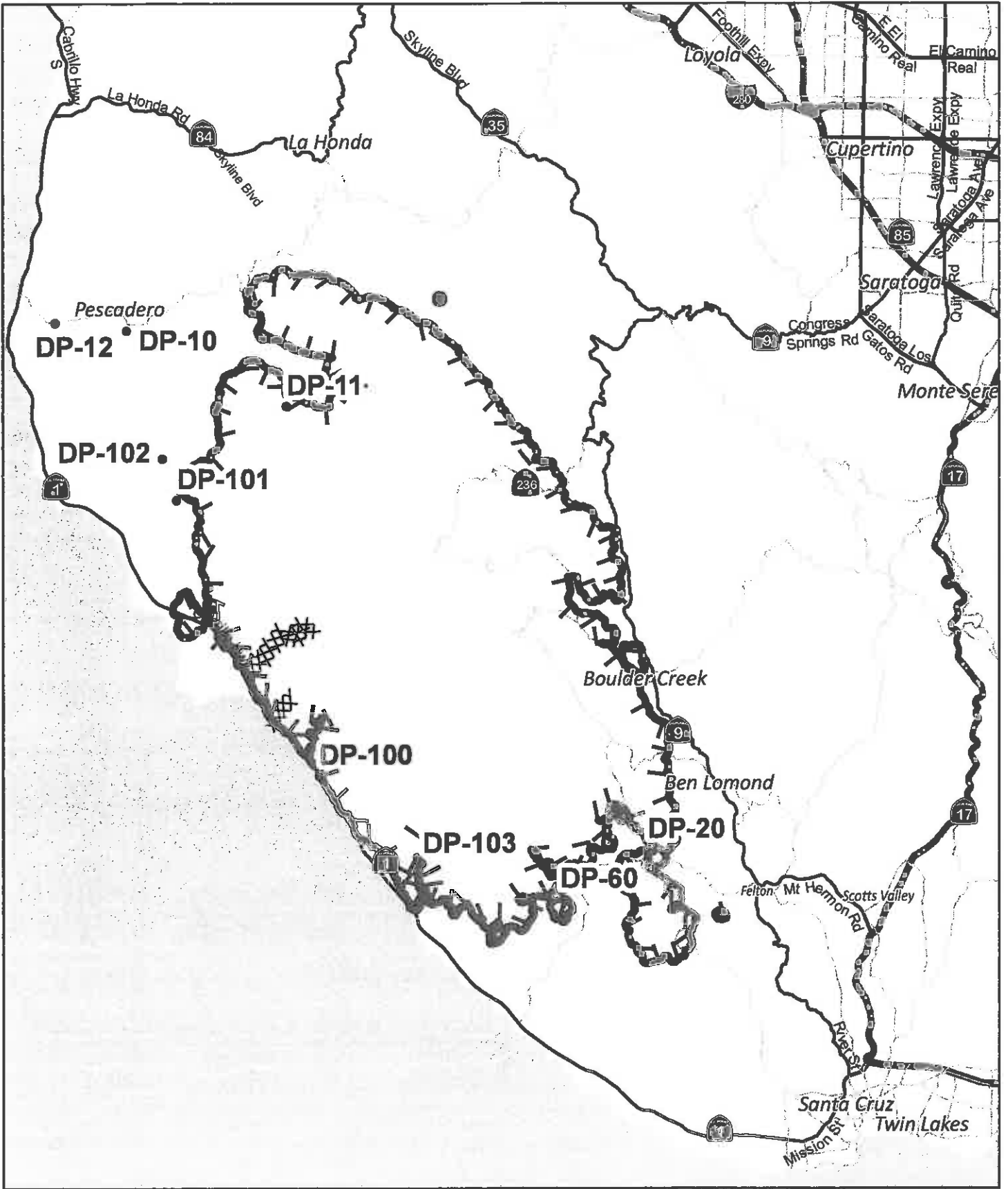
