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**3. Objective(s):**

**Strategic Objectives**

A full suppression strategy is to be implemented on the CZU Lightning Incident. Values at risk associated to the incident include human safety, private property and associated improvements, electrical power infrastructure, and cultural values. Minimize acres burned on all lands by utilizing effective and efficient strategies and tactics while maintaining safety first.

**Leaders Intent**

Work effectively with cooperative partners in a unified command structure towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely / effective communications
- Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely and defensively
- Implementation of tactics that offer a high probability of success
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest cycles
- All line supervision personnel including crew and striketeam leaders must attend the morning Operational Briefing

**Management Objectives**

- Fight fire aggressively while maintaining safe work practices to minimize threats to the public and emergency responders, all actions and efforts will focus on safe guarding the citizens and resources of Santa Cruz and San Mateo counties
- Ensure evacuation and repopulation occurs in safe, efficient, and effective manner
- Ensure COVID-19 precautions and best practices are met always
- Minimize damage to structures, private property and other improvements in the fire area
- Protect natural, cultural, and heritage resources
- Continue to foster and maintain positive relationships with all local cooperators and stakeholders
- Provide timely and accurate incident information
- Maintain fiscal accountability keeping costs commensurate with values at risk

**Control Objectives**

- Keep the fire North of Highway 17
- Keep the fire South of Highway 92
- Keep the fire East of Highway 1
- Keep the fire West of Interstate 280

**General Situational Awareness:**

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

**Stop, Think, Organize, Proceed**

In the COVID-19 environment, high density populations or large groups are particularly at risk. To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice social distancing.

Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE & monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of first responders.



# CZU Lightning Fire Weather Forecast

## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

The deep marine layer continues to affect the coast and San Lorenzo Valley this morning, burning off around mid-day. We will continue our warming and drying trend over the next several days and into next week as high pressure strengthens over the region. As high pressure strengthens, this will also compress the marine layer to lower elevations each night. Overnight humidity will become drier in the thermal belt above 1500ft, with continued good recovery for elevations below 1500ft. Temperatures will become well above average by next week with very dry conditions and gusty northwest winds.

## WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY:                   ...WARMING AND DRYING CONTINUES...

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with light smoke. Coastal fog in the morning.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs 75-85.... 65 along the coast.   **5 DEG WARMER**

**HUMIDITY:** 25-35%... except below 1500ft 35-55%.   **10% DRIER**

### **20 FT WINDS:**

**ABOVE 1500ft** – West and northwest 5-10 mph with **gusts to 15 mph. (SW wind for South Zone)**

**BELOW 1500ft** – West and Southwest 5-10 mph.

**STABILITY:** Marine layer up to 1500ft along the coast.   **HAINES:** 4 above 2000ft level...2 below.

### INPUTS

#### WEATHER SUMMARY

Marine influence remains over much of the fire and is having affect on the lighter fuels but only moderate affect on heavy fuels. A warming and drying trend continues today through the rest of the week and into next week. Winds will be slightly less, still out of the West and NorthWest

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** The fuels in the fire area are made up of a heavy timber mix of Hardwoods and Coastal Redwoods along with thick litter and some intermixed grass and brush. The region is experiencing moderate to severe drought due to rainfall for the area at about 50% of average with the last recorded wetting rain occurring more than 90 days ago. The fire continues to burn actively in the heavy fuels due to prolonged drying and depth of fuel beds. Fuel moistures in the brush are at critical levels, and the 100-hour fuels are around 10% with the 1000-hour fuels moistures around 7%. Heavy dead down fuels will be consumed near 100% leaving deep seated heat in ash pits and large burned out stump holes

ERC currently at 80% for Dense Conifer fuels

#### SPECIFIC:

Below 1500 foot elevation: The marine layer and smoke will be over the fire for these areas for the first part of the shift, burning off midday. This marine layer has affected the lighter fuels and moderated fire activity. The heavier 100- and 1000-hour fuels and thick duff layer continue to burn due to the persistent dry pattern the region is experiencing. Fire spread is mainly active backing, flanking and rollout, causing slopovers. Probability of ignition is 35%

Above 1500 foot elevation: The upper elevations will have less moisture recovery overnight and the fire will remain active further into the overnight hours. Once the air clears, expect an increase in activity with a chance for single tree involvement if there is a buildup of fuels. The fire will continue to burn with active flanking, backing and roll due to heavy fuel loading and steep topography. Spotting potential is 400 to 600 feet. Probability of ignition is 45%

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke and marine layer may remain over the fire for a good portion of the morning, should burn off midday.

Sunset: 19:42    Sunrise: 06:36

#### SAFETY

- Weather is getting hotter and drier. Watch for poor overnight humidity recovery at the upper elevations
- Fire weakened trees and branches continue to release, falling with little warning and can easily block roadways.

- Look Up, Down, and Around: overhead, surface, and underground hazards.
- Leaders attend operational briefing and brief every firefighter every shift.
- Chronic dehydration is real. Don't let it catch up with you. Drink Water!

## Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

### Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Fever
  - Sore throat
  - Chills
  - Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

### Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
  - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

### Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

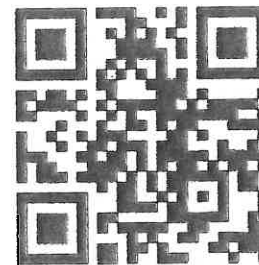
- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.

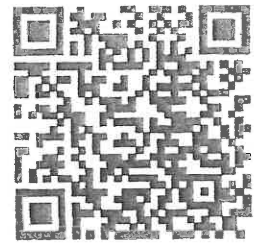

**CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY** – When assigned to a CAL FIRE incident, you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, Section 0691. You can find further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy [here](#).

**PHOTOGRAPHS AND VIDEOS OF INCIDENT** – We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means news/broadcast industry, but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video, photographs and post them onto social media sites in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately, we have seen some instances of photographs or videos that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens, it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could expose oneself to unwanted ramifications. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera loses their situational awareness.

The Public Information Office would like copies of the video and pictures that you safely took while not in an emergency situation, fire suppression activity or in an overhead assignment. Bring your video and pictures to the Public Information trailer; they will be reviewed and possibly uploaded to our many CAL FIRE social media sites. Remember, we don't want photographs or videos that depict unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances, which are a serious breach of ethics.

**LOST AND FOUND** – The Information Section will manage lost and found items for the incident. If you have lost an item please leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well. All items left in Lost and Found will be turned over to the local CAL FIRE Santa Cruz Unit.

**MAIL SERVICE** – Due to the complexity of the incident, mail service will not be available.

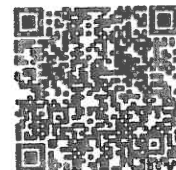

If you are assigned to a CAL FIRE managed incident, you have noticed that there is no “federal” time unit on site. We have developed a virtual finance section to provide you with your invoices/time sheets. (If you do not have a “scanning” app on your phone and/or computer you may visit the clerical trailer. If no clerical trailer is available check in with the Finance Section for assistance.) In the subject line enter:

**Contract Crew/Equipment:**

We need for you to send us the following information (even if you have submitted it to the CAL FIRE finance unit):

- Contact name, phone number, and email for on-site “leader”
- Resource Order
- Contract (Pages 1-2 and any additional pages referencing equipment/resource information)
- Crew Manifest
- Inspection (if one was done)
- Shift Tickets (signed by you and your incident supervisor) / CTRs (signed by your incident supervisor)

**Administratively Determined (AD) Resources:**

We need for you to send us the following information:

- Contact phone number and email
- Resource Order
- Casual Hire Form
- CTRs (signed by your incident supervisor)

**Federal Employees:**

As of right now, we are not planning to create OF-288s for Federal “regular” employees. Each of you can utilize your CTRs as your backup documentation for submitting your time sheets.

IF, however you require an OF-288, we will do our best to accommodate your needs. If you are claiming Hazard Pay, just like always, you must provide a justification for the claim (“H=Hazard”) is NOT enough. Use “action verbs” to explain what/why you are claiming the hazard.

**WHEN YOU ARE CLOSE TO DEMOB:**

- Give Finance a “Courtesy Email” 1-2 days prior to make sure all your documents have been received.
- Submit all time documentation (including travel home) ahead of demob.
- Send an email the morning of your demob to the Support email so the demob process can be started from the virtual finance group.

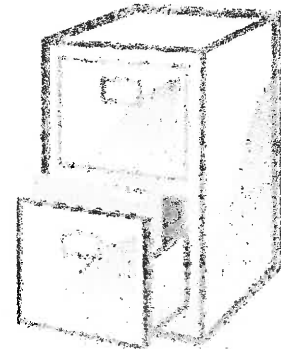
Strike Team Leaders only submit one 214 for your resource and not multiple Unit Logs for each engine.

# FIRING PLAN AND GO / NO GO CHECKLIST

## Test Firing Plan

The size and location of the test burn will be large enough and representative of the fuels of the proposed burn area.

## Communications:

A radio net announcement at the incident will be made prior to firing operations. This will be communicated on tactical and command nets and will identify general location of geographic area to be burned. Special frequencies may or may not be used.

### Frequencies:

2. Air to Ground

## Slop-overs and Escapes:

If an escape/slop-over occurs notify the Division/Group Supervisor, who will take appropriate suppression actions. The Firing Group Supervisor will evaluate whether or not to continue firing and communicate such to the Division Group Supervisor. At all times, appropriate information will be transmitted through the chain of command to the Operations Section Chief.

## Perimeter Firing Sequence:

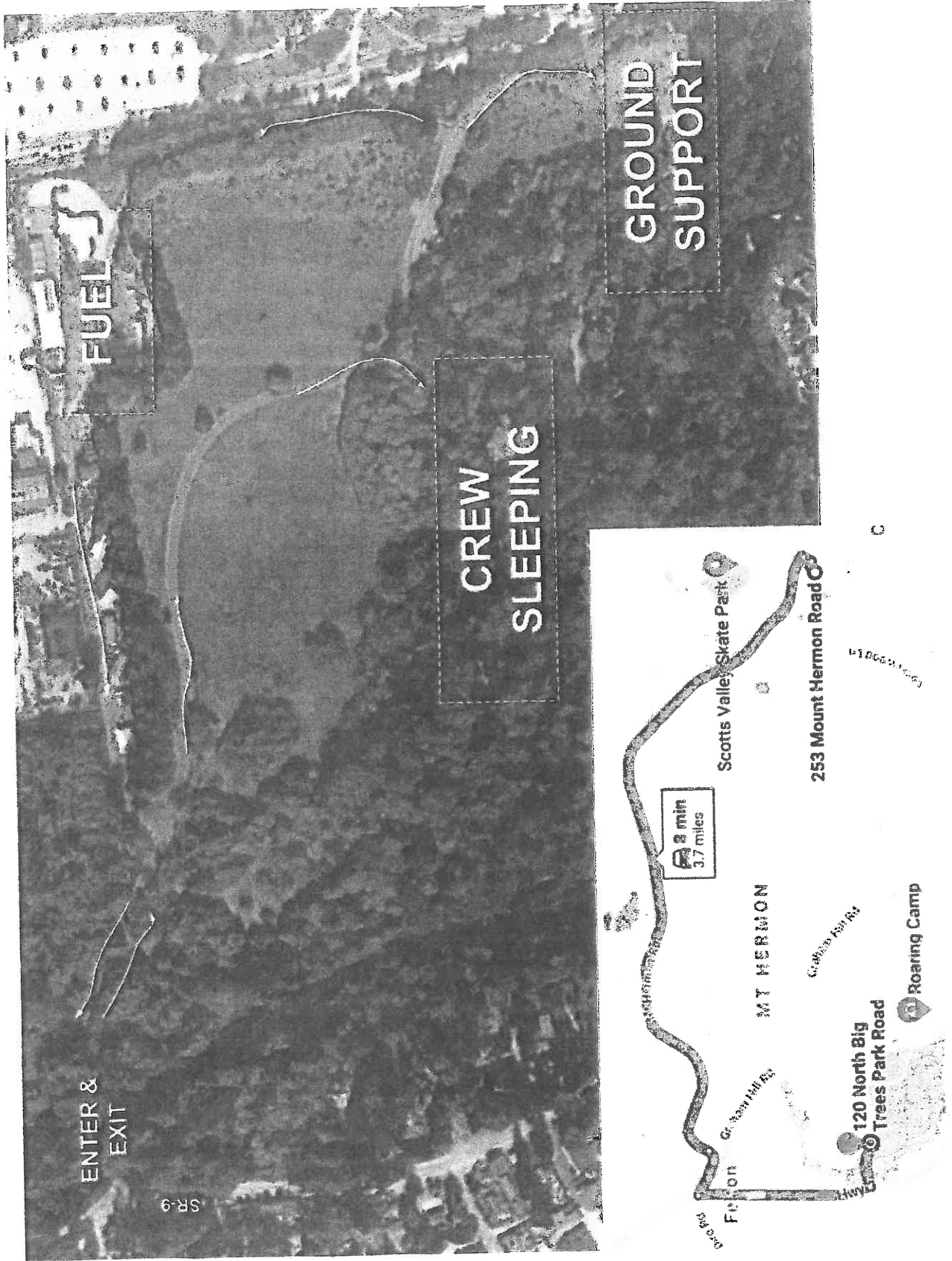


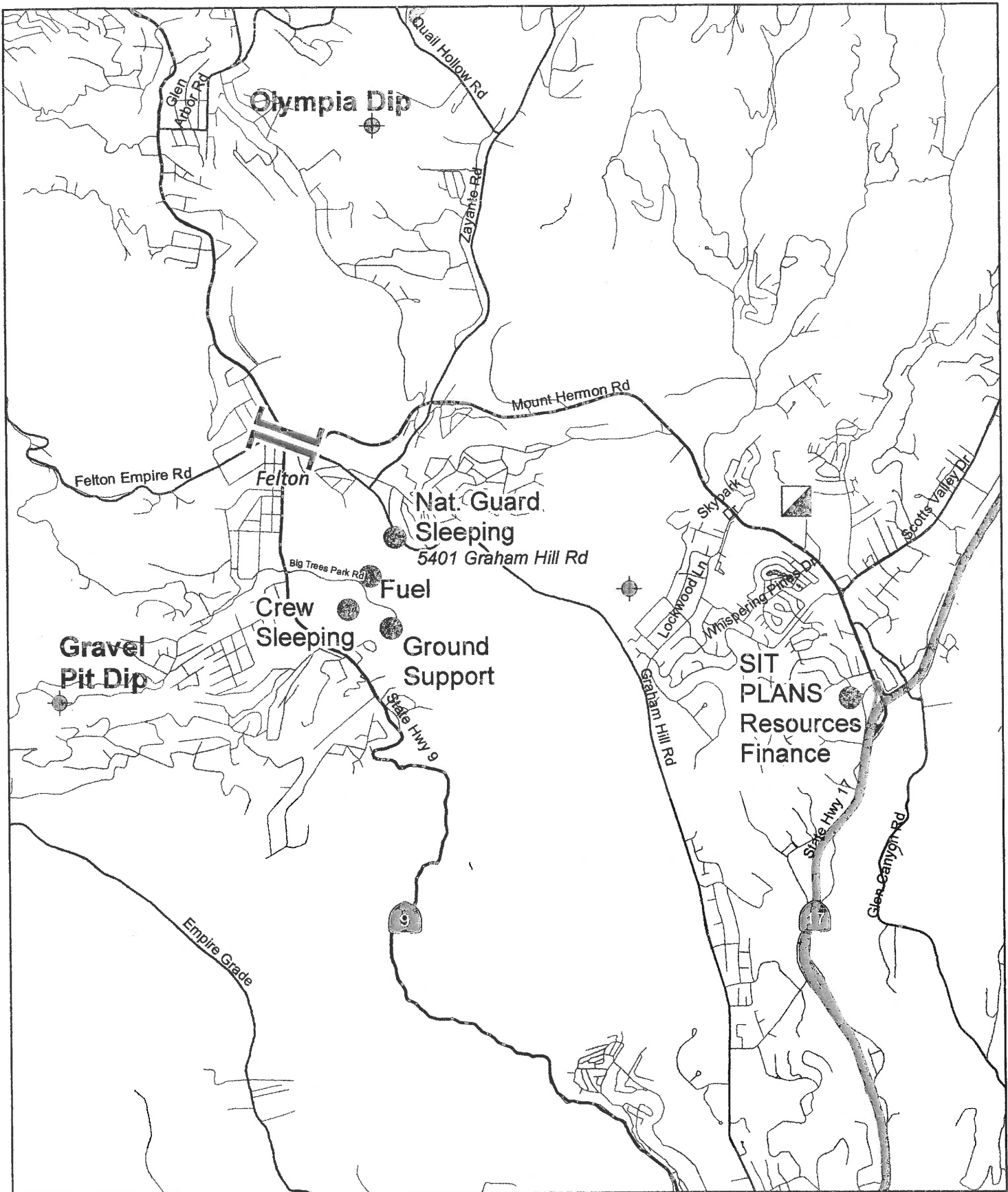
**CZU LIGHTNING COMPLEX
