WEATHER SUMMARY

There will be no marine layer over the fire for the shift. Temperatures will cool slightly today but will still be quite warm. Humidity will be very low with minimal recovery over all areas except on the immediate coastline. Generally light winds over the fire will be from the northwest throughout the day.

North winds is the elevated fire danger wind direction See spot weather forecast for specific details **EXCESSIVE HEAT WARNING THOUGH 9PM**

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fuels in the fire area are made up of a heavy timber mix of Hardwoods and Coastal Redwoods along with thick litter and some intermixed grass and brush. Fuel moistures have recovered slightly with the recent marine influence. The brush is at normal seasonal levels, and the 100-hour fuels around 7% with the 1000-hour fuels moistures around 9%. Burning conditions may increase where there is existing heat due the warming and drying trend.

ERC currently at 83% for Dense Conifer fuels

SPECIFIC:

Below 1500 feet: There will be no marine layer over the fire for the shift, allowing fuels to dry quicker. Fire activity is mainly limited to smoldering in most areas with ash pits and heavy down fuels. Tree roots continue to burn out causing them to come down on a regular basis. Deep seated heat in the duff layers continues to pose issues as well. Roll out is still a possibility on the steep slopes. Probability of ignition is 77%

Above 1500 feet: Smoldering ground fuels continue to be active in dirty burn areas loaded with thick duff. Expect increased activity on the edges of unburned islands and pockets if there is existing heat. Isolated heat signatures are still showing in most areas in the heavier ground fuels. Tree roots are burning out causing them to come down on a regular basis. Poor overnight moisture recovery again will allow for heavy fuels to continue burning throughout the night.

Probability of ignition is 81%

AIR OPERATIONS: Air operations will not be limited by weather, there may be lingering smoke in the valleys in the morning.

SAFETY

- Snags/ trees can burn in the upper portions. Look up! Just because there is no fire in the lower trunk doesn't mean it safe.
- Be aware of ash pits and stump holes across the incident, watch where you step!
- Don't let down your guard down. Tragedies have occurred during mop up.





In the subject line enter:

Contract Crew/Equipment:

We need for you to send us the following information (even if you have submitted it to the CAL FIRE finance unit):

- Contact name, phone number, and email for on-site "leader"
- Resource Order
- Contract (Pages 1-2 and any additional pages referencing equipment/resource information)
- Crew Manifest
- Inspection (if one was done)
- Shift Tickets (signed by you and your incident supervisor) / CTRs (signed by your incident supervisor)

Administratively Determined (AD) Resources:

We need for you to send us the following information:

- Contact phone number and email
- Resource Order
- Casual Hire Form
- CTRs (signed by your incident supervisor)

Federal Employees:

As of right now, we are not planning to create OF-288s for Federal "regular" employees. Each of you can utilize your CTRs as your backup documentation for submitting your time sheets.

IF, however you require an OF-288, we will do our best to accommodate your needs. If you are claiming Hazard Pay, just like always, you must provide a justification for the claim ("H=Hazard") is NOT enough. Use "action verbs" to explain what/why you are claiming the hazard.

WHEN YOU ARE CLOSE TO DEMOB:

- Give Finance a "Courtesy Email" 1-2 days prior to make sure all your documents have been received.
- Submit all time documentation (including travel home) ahead of demob.
- Send an email the morning of your demob to the Support email so the demob process can be started from the virtual finance group.


Strike Team Leaders only submit one 214 for your resource and not multiple Unit Logs for each engine.

CZU LIGHTNING Fireline Suppression Repair Guide

Supression Repair Guidelines:

- 1. Follow the CZU Lightning Incident Suppression Repair Plan.
- 2. Identify issues of damage made by fire suppression activities.
- 3. Repair damaged areas as instructed by the North and South Group Leaders.
- 4. Attempt to make contact with the landowners prior to repairs.
- 5. Identify issues to be brought to Comp Claims when it is outside the scope of suppression repair.

General Cleanup and Repair:

1. Collect all trash such as plastic water bottles, cardboard, plastic flagging, foodstuffs, wrappers, blown hose and plastic bags and pack it out.

Access Roads:

- 1. Install waterbreaks where a waterbreak previously existed.
- 2. Install or maintain rolling dips where they previously existed.
- 3. Breach berms to facilitate drainage.
- 4. Clean out inlet and outlet of culverts plugged with soil and vegetation pushed by the dozer.
- 5. Water roads as necessary that were used for fire control operations to reduce dust and stabilize soil. Grading will be determined by the Group leader.
- 6. Where suppression activities have damaged/destroyed road drainage facilities (culverts, over-side drains) repair or replace as determined by the Group Leader.

Constructed Fireline Adjacent to Homes:

- 1. Spread piles of soil where Dozers ran adjacent to homes.
- 2. Lop, chip, and/or make safe piled or knocked over trees and vegetation that was pushed over for dozer line construction.
- 3. Repair any broken or damaged fences and/or gates <u>as the result of fire suppression activities</u>. Document the extent and condition of damage prior to repairs.

Helispots, Drop Points, Staging Areas, Safety Zones:

- 1. Avoid leaving heavy piles of slash and/or debris; scatter so it appears natural.
- 2. Pull any berms back onto the site. Install cross-drainage.
- 3. Spread slash or brush over the area if available.

Dozer Lines:

1. Install waterbars on constructed dozer lines. Waterbar spacing will not exceed 150 feet.



0-10%	150 feet
11-25%	100 feet
26-50%	75 feet
>50%	50 feet


- 2. Waterbars should be constructed at an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the fire line, and deep enough to significantly reduce the chance of being destroyed by off-road vehicle use.
- 3. For dozer lines that are located along ridgelines, alternate the direction of the waterbars (in a herring bone configuration) to eliminate water accumulation on one side of the ridge.
- 4. Waterbars should be located to discharge into natural vegetation where possible.
- 5. Scatter organic debris over dozer line surface near areas where dozer lines intersect roads to prevent trespass.






