Thunderstorm chances will increase this afternoon with a chance for isolated dry thunderstorms continuing overnight into early Monday morning. Today will be the hottest day of the week, with instability starting overnight into Monday. See IMET forecast for specific details

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- The fire is burning in heavy timber and slash intermixed with bitterbrush and Manzanita, along with clear cut plots littered with moderate to heavy slash.
- Fuel moistures in the bitterbrush are nearing record levels, and timber fuel moistures are very low due to drought conditions in the area. Fuel moistures in Manzanita are much higher, slowing fire spread
- Unburned islands and spots can burn actively when aligned with the wind and slope.

Timber and slash: Rate of spread 4-8 ft/min // Flame length 2-4 feet // Spotting 500 feet // PIG 80%

Bitterbrush: Rate of spread 9-12 ft/min // Flame lengths 6-12 feet // Spotting 1/4 mile feet // PIG 85%

Manzanita: Rate of spread 4-8 ft/min // Flame lengths 2-4 ft // Spotting 200-300 feet // PIG 65%

Rates of spread can be much higher under thunderstorm outflows winds

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Fire behavior is minimal, with hot ash pits and stump holes. Topographic features in the Susan river drainage and along Hwy 36 channel winds in various directions. Unburned islands have become active as the temperatures and winds increase; spotting potential is high in the Bitterbrush and grass in Division A

Branch V: Fire behavior is minimal but there is activity within the interior islands with the increase in wind speed and rise in temperatures. Wind will continue to blow smoke into the burn and away from control lines.

Branch IX: This Branch has the most activity as spots and unburned islands continue to become active. Southwest winds will be gusty over the upper portions of the Branch, blowing smoke over the lines. The timber understory and clear-cut plots contain heavy dead and down and have a higher probability to contain smoldering spots fires.

AIR OPERATIONS: A weak inversion and smoke from nearby fires may inhibit air operations until midmorning, but skies will clear for the rest of the day. Upper level winds will be south to southwest.

Sunrise: 05:55 Sunset: 20:23

SAFETY

- Snags and stump holes are likely in timber areas.
- Mop up should be more extensive in areas that could generate windblown embers across the line.
- Watch for afternoon / evening wind shift with thunderstorms forecasted










Travel Map
